- 1) Apologized to the Sierra Club for saying at the last Council meeting that Highland lawsuit filed in 1992 was handled by the Sierra Club; it was the San Bernardino Audubon Society and the Friends of the Northern San Jacinto
- 2) Retired Colonel Leonard Hardtke, a veteran of over 30 years in the United States military, passed away last Tuesday night. Our thoughts and prayers go out to his family
- 3) Commented on the difficult job market
- 4) Asked staff about the status on the RDA money repayment from the County hospital
- 5) Clarified his comments at the last Council meeting stated that the employees' association is working very hard to protect employees and their jobs and is advocating to fill positions in-house before hiring from outside; the Council supports this approach. The Council is working with the union when the budget reduction and employees lay-offs are involved. It is done in an open and fair way
- 6) Twenty three out of 42 applicants were selected for the Planning Commission interviews held last Tuesday and Thursday. Seven applicants were selected for a ballot. The Council will vote by ballot at the April 24, 2009 Council meeting to fill four positions. To be appointed, a candidate needs three Council's votes. Was impressed with quality of all candidates. Few candidates expressed interest to serve on other boards or commissions. Right now we have one opening on the Library Commission
- 7) Stated that the golf course is loosing about \$400,000 a year and we can't lay off employees and subsidize golf course operations. Will look into possibility of involving volunteers. Will look into working with the other golf courses in town to assist the members of this golf course when faced with phasing out this golf course
- 8) Attended the opening day of the Canyon Springs Little League at Sunnymead Park and threw out the first baseball. It is fantastic to see all the families involved in youth sports in the City
