G.5 <u>CITY MANAGER'S REPORT (Informational Oral Presentation - not for</u> <u>Council action)</u>

The Interim City Manager reported the following:

- 1. Burlington Coat Factory will have a soft opening on March 5. They hired the majority of their staff from Moreno Valley.
- 2. State Assemblymen Cook, Nestande and Emmerson will host a Financial Literacy Workshop on April 3 at the Moreno Valley Senior Center. MVTV3 will be promoting information and encouraging attendance.
- 3. Staff met with Congresswoman Bono Mack's staff to discuss fiscal requests for the coming year. The requests include Edgemont Water Service, law enforcement technology, gang prevention, Heacock Channel improvements, and job training and the Employee Resource Center.
- 4. A sweep of illegal vendors was conducted on Valentine's Day. Forty four vendors were contacted and issued a notice of violation for failure to obtain a business license. All of their materials were confiscated and destroyed.
- 5. Ross for Less Distribution Center is completing the final phase of their expansion to 1.6M square feet. They employ approximately 1,000 employees, and they will employ approximately 200 more after their expansion.
