RTA Board Members ratified the Federal Grant application for 84 new compressed natural gas buses, replacement of medium size buses, Dial-A-

Ride vehicles, as well as maintain its Riverside and Hemet facilities. The Board also approved a Federal Grant requesting to build the Twin Cities Transit Center in Southwest County as well as provide up-graded bike racks. Matching funds for these grants will come from Proposition 1B and State transit assistance sources. RTA will offer free rides on New Years Eve. College students ride free. The Moreno Valley Perris Chapter Transportation NOW is seeking new members. The group is open to the public and meets the third Thursday of the month.

c. Council Member Robin N. Hastings report on Western Riverside Council of Governments (WRCOG)

WRCOG Executive Committee meetings are held the first Monday of every month at 2:00 p.m. in the Board Chamber on Lemon Street in Riverside. \$12.2M in TUMF fees were collected for fiscal year 10-11. The Public Works Technical Advisory Committee will be reviewing and revising the TUMF Approved Project list. The Executive Committee voted to add Ken Young, Superintendent of Riverside County Office of Education, as an exofficio member of WRCOG. At the end of one year the Executive Board will make a determination whether to make this position a permanent member WRCOG. The Executive Committee decided of the 50% fee reduction should be handled and approved in jurisdictions individually. Each city will make their own decision as to whether to continue a reduction in fees. Each jurisdiction is responsible for making up any differences between project actual costs and uncollected revenue shortfalls.

The clarification made was that the revised retirement formula will in fact be implemented with the hiring of new employees on or after December 23, 2011 who have not previously been employed with the City of Moreno <u>Valley under the 2.7% at Age 55 retirement formula.</u> PERS requires that employees hired by the City that were previously City of Moreno Valley employees be provided the same retirement formula in effect when that employee left the service of the City of Moreno Valley.

- 2. The State of the County was today. Riverside County is looking at an \$80M deficit. There has been a drop in sales tax and property taxes.
- 3. The Moreno Valley Police Department is participating in the Stuff the Bus program which goes to Operation Safe House. This is a place for teens who have no place to go. Chief Anderson has a list of items they are seeking to put in the bus.

1. Moreno Valley has a contract with the County for police services. The last time there were tight times, the County created a booking fee whereby the City pays money if a person is arrested and booked in the City. The next time the contract for police services is negotiated, it should include a provision all fees be included in the contract.
