#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

#### That the City Council:

Authorize the Mayor to execute the Amended Joint Powers Agreement for the Western Riverside Council of Governments.

#### SUMMARY/DISCUSSION

At its meeting of November 1, 2021, the Western Riverside Council of Governments (WRCOG) Executive Committee took action to amend its Joint Powers Agreement. An amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement requires the approval and signatures from 2/3 of WRCOG's member jurisdictions to take effect. Once the 2/3 of the WRCOG Member Agencies have approved the above listed changes, the changes will become effective. Therefore, the WRCOG is asking that the City of Moreno Valley City Council approve these changes and authorize the Mayor to execute the amended agreement.

WRCOG JPA amendments are as follows:

#### **Joint Powers Agreement Changes**

- 1. Remove references to the membership of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians.
- 2. Modernize language and processes, including removal of references to use of member agency employees to perform day-to-day WRCOG Agency business.
- Completely revise indemnity language to better articulate WRCOG responsibility to indemnify member agencies.

4. Remove outdated arbitration provision.

A partial list of key changes to the Bylaws is listed below. For the full scope of changes, please see the attached red line document (Attachment 3) (list of substantive changes). The changes are intended to:

- 1. Clarify the role of the Chairperson to include, without limitation, the power to execute documents or take other actions as directed by the Executive Committee, make appointments to the Administration & Finance Committee, create, and appoint to ad hoc committees, and call special meetings.
- Clarify which official will preside over the meeting when the Chair is absent. Designates the Past Chair to preside over the meeting if the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair are absent.
- Clarify the duties of the Executive Director and General Counsel and the Executive Committee's ultimate oversight authority over the Executive Director and General Counsel. Duties of the Executive Director include:
  - a. Administration of personnel system
  - b. Administration of contracts
  - c. Preparation of audit by outside auditor
  - d. Enforcement of policies, rules and regulations, motions, or resolutions
  - e. Preparation and implementation of budget
- 4. Establish the selection, oversight, and termination process of the Executive Director and General Counsel.
- Update gender references.
- 6. Make various non-substantive language changes for clarity.

# JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT OF THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

This Agreement is made and entered into on the 1st day of April, 1991, pursuant to Government Code Section 6500 et. seq., and other pertinent provisions of law, by and between six or more of the cities located within Western Riverside County and the County of Riverside.

#### RECITALS

- A. Each member and party to this Agreement is a governmental entity established by law with full powers of government in legislative, administrative, financial, and other related fields.
- B. The purpose of the formation is to provide an agency to conduct studies and projects designed to improve and coordinate the common governmental responsibilities and services on an area-wide and regional basis through the establishment of an association of governments. The Council will explore areas of intergovernmental cooperation and coordination of government programs and provide recommendations and solutions to problems of common and general concern.
- C. When authorized pursuant to an Implementation Agreement, the Council shall manage and administer thereunder.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

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#### PURPOSE AND POWERS

#### 1.1 Agency Created.

There is hereby created a public entity to be known as the "Western Riverside Council of Governments" ("WRCOG" or "the Council). WRCOG is formed by this Agreement pursuant to the provision of Government Code Section 6500 et. seq. and other pertinent provision of law. WRCOG shall be a public entity separate from the parties hereto.

#### 1.2 Powers.

- 1.2.1. WRCOG established hereunder shall perform all necessary functions to fulfill the purposes of this Agreement. Among other functions, WRCOG shall:
- a. Serve as a forum for consideration, study, and recommendation on area-wide and regional problems;
- b. Assemble information helpful in the consideration of problems peculiar to Western Riverside County;
- c. Explore practical avenues for intergovernmental cooperation, coordination, and action in the interest of local public welfare and means of improvements in the administration of governmental services; and.
- d. Serve as the clearinghouse review body for Federally-funded projects in accordance with Circular A-95 in conjunction with the Southern California Association of Governments.
- 1.2.2. The Council shall have the power in its own name to do any of the following:

- a. When necessary for the day to dayday-to-day operation of the Council, to make and enter into contracts;
- b. To contract for the services of engineers, attorneys, planners, financial consultants, and separate and apart therefrom to employ such other persons, as it deems necessary;
- c. To apply for an appropriate grant or grants under any federal, state, or local programs.
- d. To receive gifts, contributions, and donations of property, funds, services, and other forms of financial assistance from persons, firms, corporations, and any governmental entity;
- e. To lease, acquire, construct, manage, maintain, and operate any buildings, works, or improvements;
- f. To delegate some or all of its powers to the Executive Committee and the Executive Director of the Council as hereinafter provided.
- 1.2.3 The <u>association Council</u> shall have the power in its own name, only with the approval of all affected member agencies to:
- a. Acquire, hold, and dispose of property by eminent domain, lease, lease purchase or sale,
  - b. To incur debts, liabilities, obligations, and issue bonds;

II.

#### ORGANIZATION OF COUNCIL

#### 2.1 Parties.

The parties to WRCOG shall be the County of Riverside and each city located within Western Riverside County which has executed or hereafter executes this Agreement, or any addenda, amendment, or supplement hereto and agrees to become a member upon such terms and conditions as established by the General Assembly or Executive Committee, and which has not, pursuant to provisions hereof, withdrawn herefrom— (the "Member Agencies"). Only the parties identified in this section and Associate Members approved under section 8.2 of this Agreement, if any, shall be considered contracting parties to this Agreement under Government Code section 6502, provided that the rights of any Associate Member under this Agreement shall be limited solely those rights expressly set forth in a PACE Agreement authorized in section 8.2 of this Agreement.

#### 2.2 Names.

The names, particular capacities and addresses of the parties shall be shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, as amended or supplemented from time to time by the Executive Director. If the Executive Director amends or supplements Exhibit "A $_{2}$ ", a copy of the revised Exhibit "A" shall be provided to the members.

#### 2.3 Duties.

WRCOG shall do whatever is necessary and required to carry out the purposes of this Agreement and when authorized by an Implementation Agreement pursuant to section 1.2.3 as appropriate, to make and enter into such contracts, incur such debts and obligations, assess contributions from the members, and perform such other acts as are necessary to the accomplishment of the purposes of such agreement,

within the provisions of Government Code Section 6500 et seq. and as prescribed by the laws of the State of California.

#### 2.4 Governing Body.

2.4.1. WRCOG shall be governed by a General Assembly with membership consisting of representatives from the County of Riverside, each city which is a signatory to this Agreement, the Western Municipal Water District, and the Eastern Municipal Water District, and the Morongo Band of Mission Indians ("Morongo") (collectively, the "General Assembly Member Agencies"). Each General Assembly Member Agency shall have one vote for each mayor Mayor, council Council member, county County supervisor Supervisor, and water Water district District board Board member Member, and tribal council members present at the General Assembly. The General Assembly shall act only upon a majority of a quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the total authorized representatives, provided that voting representatives of a majority of the General Assembly Member Agencies are present. The General Assembly shall adopt and amend by laws Bylaws for the administration and management of this Agreement, which when adopted and approved shall be an integral part of this Agreement. Such by-laws Bylaws may provide for the management and administration of this Agreement. The General Assembly shall meet at least once annually, preferably scheduled in the evening.

2.4.2. There shall be an Executive Committee which exercises the powers of this Agreement between sessions of the General Assembly. Members of the Executive Committee shall be the Mayor from each of the member cities, four members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, and the President of each Water District, and the Tribal Chairman of Morongo (the "Executive Committee Members"). Each City Council,

at its discretion, can appoint its Mayor Pro Tem or other City Council member in place of the Mayor. \_Each water\_Water\_district\_District\_board\_Board, at its discretion, can appoint another Board member in place of the President. The Tribal Council of Morongo, at its discretion, can appoint another Tribal Council member in place of the Tribal Chairman. The Executive Committee shall act only upon a majority of a quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the Executive Committee Members. Voting shall be cast and tallied in accordance with the by-lawsBylaws.Membership of Morongo on the General Assembly and Executive Committee of WRCOG shall be conditioned on Morongo entering into a separate Memorandum of Understanding with WRCOG.

- 2.4.3. Each member of the General Assembly and the Executive Committee shall be a current member of the legislative body such member represents.
- 2.4.4. Each Executive Committee Member shall also have an alternate, who must also be a current member of the legislative body of the party such alternate represents. The remaining member of the Board of Supervisors shall serve as an alternate for the Board of Supervisors. The name of the alternate members shall be on file with the Executive Committee. Director. In the absence of the regular member from an agency, the alternate member from such agency shall assume all rights and duties of the absent regular member.

#### 2.5 Executive Director.

The Executive Director shall be the chief Chief administrative oe Executive

Officer of the Council. He or she shall receive such compensation as may be fixed by

the Executive Committee. The powers and duties of the Executive Director shall be subject to the authority of the Executive Committee and include the following:

- a. To appoint, direct and remove employees of the Council.
- b. Annually to prepare and present a proposed budget to the Executive Committee and General Assembly.
- c. Serve as Secretary of the General Assembly and of the Executive Committee.
  - d. To attend meetings of the General Assembly and Executive Committee.
- e. To perform such other and additional duties as the Executive Committee may require.

#### 2.6 Principal Office.

The principal office of WRCOG shall be established by the Executive Committee and shall be located within Western Riverside County. The Executive Committee is hereby granted full power and authority to change said principal office from one location to another within Western Riverside County. Any change shall be noted by the Secretary under this section but shall not be considered an amendment to this Agreement.

#### 2.7 Meetings.

The Executive Committee shall meet at the principal office of the agency or at such other place as may be designated by the Executive Committee or Chair. The time and place of regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be determined by resolution adopted by the Executive Committee; a copy of such resolution schedule shall be furnished to each party hereto. Regular, adjourned, and special meetings shall be

called and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code Section 54950 et. seq., as it may be amended.

#### 2.8 Powers and Limitations of the Executive Committee.

Unless otherwise provided herein, each Member or participating alternate of the Executive Committee shall be entitled to one vote, and a vote of the majority of those present and qualified to vote constituting a quorum may adopt any motion, resolution, or order and take any other action they deem appropriate to carry forward the objectives of the Council.

#### 2.9 Minutes.

The Secretary of the Council shall cause to be kept minutes of regular, adjourned regular, and special meetings of the General Assembly and Executive Committee, and shall cause a copy of the minutes Minutes to be forwarded to each member.

#### 2.10 Rules.

The Executive Committee may adopt from time to time such rules and regulations for the conduct of its affairs consistent with this Agreement or any Implementation Agreement.

#### 2.11 <u>Vote or Assent of Members</u>.

The vote, assent or approval of the members in any manner as may be required hereunder shall be evidenced by a certified copy of the action of the governing body of such party filed with the Council. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Director to obtain certified copies of said actions.

#### 2.1<del>32</del>1 Officers.

There shall be selected from the membership of the Executive Committee, a chairpersonChair, a vice vVice-chairperson-Chair, and a second-Second vice vVice-chairperson-Chair in accordance with the by-lawsBylaws. The Executive Director shall be the sSecretary of the Council. The Treasurer and the Auditor shall be appointed by the Executive Director and must be officers or employees of WRCOG. The Executive Director may appoint a single officer or employee of WRCOG to serve in both the Treasurer and Auditor positions. Such person(s) shall possess the powers of, and shall perform the treasurer and auditor-Auditor functions respectively, for WRCOG and perform those functions required of them by Government Code Sections 6505, 6505.5 and 6505.6, and by all other applicable laws and regulations, including any subsequent amendments thereto.

The chairperson Chair, vice vVice-chairperson Chair, and second vice Vice-chairperson Chair shall hold office for a period of one year commencing at the close of the General Assembly meeting annually on July 1 of their election, and ending one year thereafter, or until his or her successor is elected. The Officers shall have the duties set forth in the by-laws Bylaws. Except for the Executive Director, any officer, employee, or agent of the Executive Committee may also be an officer, employee, or agent of the members. The appointment by the Executive Committee of such a person shall be evidence that the two positions are compatible.

#### 2.1432 Committees.

The Executive Committee may, as it deems appropriate, establish committees to accomplish the purposes set forth herein. All standing committee meetings

of WRCOG, including those of the Executive Committee, shall be open to all Executive Committee Members in accordance with the Brown Act.

#### 2.1<u>543</u> <u>Additional Officers and Employees</u>.

The Executive Committee shall have the power to authorize such additional officers officers and employees as may be appropriate.

#### 2.1654 Bonding Requirement.

The officers Officers or persons who have charge of, handle, or have access to any property of WRCOG shall be the Treasurer, the Executive Director, and any other officers Officers or persons designated or empowered by the Executive Committee. Each such officer Officer or person shall be required to file an official bond with the Executive Committee in an amount which shall be established by the Executive Committee. Should the existing bond or bonds of any such officer Officer be extended to cover the obligations provided herein, said bond shall be the official bond required herein. The premiums on any such bonds attributable to the coverage required herein shall be appropriate expenses of WRCOG.

#### 2.1<u>765</u> Status of Officers and Employees.

All of the privileges and immunities from liability, exemption from laws, ordinances and rules, all pension, relief, disability, worker's compensation, and other benefits which apply to the activity of officers. Agents, or employees of any of the members when performing their respective functions shall apply to them to the same degree and extent while engaged in the performance of any of the functions and other duties under this Agreement. None of the officers, agents, or employees appointed by the Executive Committee shall be deemed, by reason of their employment by the

Executive Committee, to be employed by any of the members or, by reason of their employment by the Executive Committee, to be subject to any of the requirements of such members.

#### 2.1876 Restrictions.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 6509, for the purposes of determining the restrictions to be imposed by the Council in its exercise of the above-described joint powers, reference shall be made to, and the Council shall observe, the restrictions imposed by state law upon the County of Riverside.

#### 2.1987 TUMF Matters – Water Districts and Morongo.

Pursuant to this Joint Powers Agreement, WRCOG administers the Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee ("TUMF") for cities in Western Riverside County. The fee was established prior to the Water District's and Morongo's involvement with WRCOG and will fund transportation improvements for the benefit of the County of Riverside and the cities in Western Riverside County. As such, the Western Municipal Water District and, the Eastern Municipal Water District, and Morongo General Assembly and Executive Committee Members shall not vote on any matter related to the administration of the TUMF program Program or the expenditure of TUMF revenues.

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#### FUNDS AND PROPERTY

#### 3.1 Treasurer.

The Treasurer of the Council shall have custody of all funds and shall provide for strict accountability thereof in accordance with Government Code Section 6505.5 and other applicable laws of the State of California. He or she shall perform all of

the duties required in Government Code Section 6505 et. seq., and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee.

#### 3.2. Expenditure of Funds.

The funds under this Agreement shall be expended only in furtherance of the purposes hereof and in accordance with the laws of the State of California and standard accounting practices shall be used to account for all funds received and disbursed.

#### 3.3. Fiscal Year.

WRCOG shall be operated on a fiscal year basis, beginning on July 1 of each year and continuing until June 30 of the succeeding year. Prior to July 1 of each year, the General Assembly shall adopt a final budget for the expenditures of WRCOG during the following fiscal Year.

#### 3.4. Contributions / Public Funds.

In preparing the budget, the General Assembly by majority vote of a quorum shall determine the amount of funds which will be required from its members for the purposes of this Agreement. The funds required from its members after approval of the final budget shall be raised by contributions 50% of which will be assessed on a per capita basis and 50% on an assessed valuation basis, each city paying on the basis of its population and assessed valuation and the County paying on the basis of the population and assessed valuation within the unincorporated area of Western Riverside County as defined in the by-lawsBylaws. The parties, when informed of their respective contributions, shall pay the same before August 1st of the fiscal year for which they are assessed or within sixty days of being informed of the assessment, whichever occurs

later. In addition to the contributions provided, advances of public funds from the parties may be made for the purposes of this Agreement. When such advances are made, they shall be repaid from the first available funds of WRCOG.

The General Assembly shall have the power to determine that personnel, equipment, or property of one or more of the parties to the Agreement may be used in lieu of fund contributions or advances.

All contributions and funds shall be paid to WRCOG and shall be disbursed by a majority vote of a quorum of the Executive Committee, as authorized by the approved budget.

3.5 <u>Contributions from Water Districts and oOther nNonvoting aAgency(ies)</u> and the Morongo Band of Mission Indians.

#### BUDGETS AND DISBURSEMENTS

#### 4.1 Annual Budget.

The Executive Committee may at any time amend the budget to incorporate additional income and disbursements that might become available to WRCOG for its purposes during a fiscal year.

#### 4.2 Disbursements.

The Executive Director shall request warrants from the Auditor in accordance with budgets approved by the General Assembly or Executive Committee subject to quarterly review by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall pay such claims or disbursements and such requisitions for payment in accordance with rules, regulations, policies, procedures, and <a href="mailto:by-laws-Bylaws">by-laws-Bylaws</a> adopted by the Executive Committee.

#### 4.3 Accounts.

All funds will be placed in appropriate accounts and the receipt, transfer, or disbursement of such funds during the term of this Agreement shall be accounted for in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applicable to governmental entities and pursuant to Government Code Sections 6505 et seq., and any other applicable laws of the State of California. There shall be strict accountability of all funds. All revenues and expenditures shall be reported to the Executive Committee.

#### 4.4 Expenditures Within Approved Annual Budget.

All expenditures shall be made within the approved annual budget. No expenditures in excess of those budgeted shall be made without the approval of a majority of a quorum of the Executive Committee.

#### 4.5 Audit.

The Auditor shall make or contract with an independent certified public accountant or public accountant to make an annual audit of WRCOG's accounts and records, and copies of such audit report shall be filed with the County Auditor, State Controller, and each party to WRCOG no later than fifteen (15) days after receipt of said audit by the Executive Committee. The Auditor shall perform those functions required of

him or her by Government Code Sections 6505, 6505.5 and 6505.6, and by all other applicable laws and regulations, including any subsequent amendments thereto.

#### 4.6 Reimbursement of Funds.

Grant funds received by WRCOG from any federal, state, or local agency to pay for budgeted expenditures for which WRCOG has received all or a portion of said funds from the parties hereto shall be used as determined by WRCOG's Executive Committee.

#### LIABILITIES

#### 5.1 Liabilities.

The debts, liabilities, and obligations of WRCOG shall be the debts, liabilities, or obligations of WRCOG alone and not of the parties to this Agreement.

#### 5.2 Liability of Directors, Officers, and Employees.

The Directors, eOfficers, and employees of the AuthorityAgencyCouncil shall use ordinary care and reasonable diligence in the exercise of their powers and in the performance of their duties pursuant to this Agreement. No current or former Director, eOfficer, or employee will be responsible for any act or omission by another Director, eOfficer, or employee. The AuthorityAgencyCouncil shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the individual current and former Directors, eOfficers, and employees for any acts or omissions in the scope of their employment or duties in the manner provided by California Government Code § 995 et seq. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the defenses available under the law to the Member Agencies, the AuthorityAgencyCouncil, or its Directors, eOfficers, or employees.

#### 5.3 Indemnification.

The AuthorityAgencyCouncil shall acquire such insurance coverage as the BoardExecutive Committee deems necessary to protect the interests of the AgencyAuthorityCouncil, and the Member Agencies. The AuthorityAgencyCouncil shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Member Agencies and each of their respective Board members board or eCouncil members, eOfficers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims, losses, damages, costs, injuries, and liabilities of every kind arising directly or indirectly from the conduct, activities, operations, acts, and omissions of the AuthorityAgencyCouncil under this Agreement.

#### 5.2 Hold Harmless and Indemnity.

Each party hereto agree to indemnify and hold the other parties harmless from all liability for damage, actual or alleged, to persons or property arising out of or resulting from negligent acts or omissions of the indemnifying party or its employees. Where the General Assembly or Executive Committee itself or its agents or employees are held liable for injuries to persons or property, each party's liability for contribution or indemnity for such injuries shall be based proportionately upon the contributions (less voluntary contributions) of each member. In the event of liability imposed upon any of the parties—to—this Agreement, or—upon—the—General—Assembly—or—Executive Committee WRCOG created by this Agreement, for injury which is caused by the negligent or wrongful act or omission of any of the parties in the performance of this Agreement, the contribution of the party or parties not directly responsible for the negligent or wrongful act or omission shall be limited to One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). The party or parties

directly responsible for the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions shall indemnify, defend, and hold all other parties harmless from any liability for personal injury or property damage arising out of the performance of this Agreement. The voting for or against a matter being considered by the General Assembly or executive or other committee or WRCOG, or abstention from voting on such matter, shall not be construed to constitute a wrongful act or omission within the meaning of this Subsection. As used in this Section 5.2, party shall mean the Member Agencies and WRCOG

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#### ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL OF PARTIES

#### 6.1 Admission of New Parties.

It is recognized that additional cities, other than the original parties, may wish to participate in WRCOG. Any Western Riverside County city may become a party to WRCOG upon such terms and conditions as established by the General Assembly or Executive Committee. Any Western Riverside County city shall become a party to WRCOG by the adoption by the city council of this Agreement and the execution of a written addendum hereto agreeing to the terms of this Agreement and agreeing to any additional terms and conditions that may be established by the General Assembly or Executive Committee. Special districts which are significantly involved in regional problems and the boundaries of which include territory within the collective area of the membership shall be eligible for advisory membership in the Council by the execution of a separate MOU setting forth the terms of such participation. The representative of any such advisory member may participate in the work of committees of the Council.

#### 6.2 Withdrawal from WRCOG.

It is fully anticipated that each party hereto shall participate in WRCOG until the purposes set forth in this Agreement are accomplished. The withdrawal of any party, either voluntary or involuntary, unless otherwise provided by the General Assembly or Executive Committee, shall be conditioned as follows:

- a. In the case of a voluntary withdrawal following a properly noticed public hearing, written notice shall be given to WRCOG, six months prior to the effective date of withdrawal:
- b. Withdrawal shall not relieve the party of its proportionate share of any debts or other liabilities incurred by WRCOG prior to the effective date of the party's notice of withdrawal in a manner consist with Article V, above;
- c. Unless otherwise provided by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee, withdrawal shall result in the forfeiture of that party's rights and claims relating to distribution of property and funds upon termination of WRCOG as set forth in Section VII below;
- d. Withdrawal from any Implementation Agreement shall not be deemed withdrawal from membership in WRCOG.

VII

# TERMINATION AND DISPOSITION OF ASSETS

#### 7.1 <u>Termination of this Agreement.</u>

WRCOG shall continue to exercise the joint powers herein until the termination of this Agreement and any extension thereof or until the parties shall have mutually rescinded this Agreement;—, providing, however, that WRCOG and this

Agreement shall continue to exist for the purposes of disposing of all claims, distribution of assets, and all other functions necessary to conclude the affairs of WRCOG.

Termination shall be accomplished by written consent of all of the parties, or shall occur upon the withdrawal from WRCOG of a sufficient number of the agencies enumerated herein so as to leave less than five of the enumerated agencies remaining in WRCOG.

#### 7.2 <u>Distribution of Property and Funds</u>.

In the event of the termination of this Agreement, any property interest remaining in WRCOG following the discharge of all obligations shall be disposed of as the Executive Committee shall determine with the objective of distributing to each remaining party a proportionate return on the contributions made to such properties by such parties, less previous returns, if any.

VIII

# IMPLEMENTATION AND PARTICIPATION AGREEMENTS; ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

### 8.1 <u>Execution of Agreement</u>.

When authorized by the Executive Committee, any affected member agency, or agencies enumerated herein, may execute an Implementation Agreement for the purpose of authorizing WRCOG to implement, manage and administer area-wide and regional programs in the interest of the local public welfare. The costs incurred by WRCOG in implementing a program, including indirect costs, shall be assessed only to those public agencies who are parties to that Implementation Agreement.

#### 8.2 PACE Agreements; Associate Membership.

WRCOG shall be empowered to establish and operate one or more Property Assessed Clean Energy ("PACE") programs Programs pursuant to Chapter 29 of the Improvement Bond Act of 1911, being Division 7 of the California Streets and Highways Code, and to enter into one or more agreements, including without limitation, participation agreements, implementation agreements, and joint powers agreements and amendments thereto to fulfill such programs both within and outside the jurisdictional boundaries of WRCOG.

WRCOG, acting through its Executive Committee, shall be empowered to establish an "Associate Member" status that provides membership in WRCOG to local jurisdictions that are outside WRCOG's jurisdictional boundaries but within whose boundaries a PACE program Program will be established and implemented by WRCOG. Said local jurisdictions shall become Associate Members of WRCOG by adopting one or more agreements (the "PACE Agreement") on the terms and conditions established by the Executive Committee and consistent with the requirements of the Joint Exercise of Powers Act, being Chapter 5 of Division 7, Title 1 of the California Government Code (Sections 6500 et seq.). The rights of Associate Members shall be limited solely to those terms and conditions expressly set forth in the PACE Agreement for the purposes of implementing the PACE program Program within their jurisdictional boundaries. Except as expressly provided for by the PACE Agreement, Associate Members shall not have any rights otherwise granted to WRCOG's members by this Agreement, including but not limited to the right to vote, right to amend this Agreement, and right to sit on committees or boards established under this Agreement or by action of the Executive Committee or

the General Assembly, including, without limitation, the General Assembly and the Executive Committee.

IX

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

#### 9.1 Amendments.

This Agreement may be amended with the approval of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of all member agencies.

#### 9.2 Notice.

Any notice or instrument required to be given or delivered by depositing the same in any United States Post Office, registered or certified, postage prepaid, addressed to the addresses of the parties as shown on Exhibit "A", shall be deemed to have been received by the party to whom the same is addressed at the expiration of seventy-two (72) hours after deposit of the same in the United States Post Office for transmission by registered or certified mail as aforesaid.

#### 9.3 Effective Date.

This Agreement shall be effective and WRCOG shall exist from and after such date as this Agreement has been executed by any seven or more of the public agencies, including the County of Riverside, as listed on page 1 hereof.

#### 9.4 Arbitration.

Any controversy or claim between any two or more parties to this Agreement, or between any such party or parties and/or WRCOG, with respect to disputes, demands, differences, controversies, or misunderstandings arising in relation to interpretation of this Agreement, or any breach thereof, shall be submitted to and

determined by arbitration. The party desiring to initiate arbitration shall give notice of its intention to arbitrate to every other party to this Agreement and to the Executive Director of the CouncilWRCOG. Such notice shall designate as "respondents" such other parties as the initiating party intends to have bound by any award made therein. Any party (including WRCOG) not so designated but which desires to join in the arbitration may, within ten (10) days of service upon it of such notice, file with all other parties and with the Executive Director of the CouncilWRCOG a response indicating its intention to join in and to be bound by the results of the arbitration, and further designating any other parties it wishes to name as a respondent. Within twenty (20) days of the service of the initial demand for arbitration, the initiating party and the respondent or respondents shall each designate a person to act as an arbitrator. The designated arbitrators shall mutually designate the minimal number of additional persons as arbitrators as may be necessary to create an odd total number of arbitrators but not less than three (3) to serve as arbitrator(s).

The arbitrators shall proceed to arbitrate the matter in accordance with the provisions of Title 9 of Part 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure, Section 1280 et. seq. The parties to this Agreement and WRCOG agree that the decision of the arbitrators will be binding and will not be subject to judicial review except on the ground that the arbitrators have exceeded the scope of their authority.

#### 9.54 Partial Invalidity.

If any one or more of the terms, provisions, sections, promises, covenants, or conditions of this Agreement shall, to any extent, be adjudged invalid, unenforceable, void, or voidable for any reason whatsoever by a court of competent jurisdiction, each

and all of the remaining terms, provisions, sections, promises, covenants, and conditions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

#### 9.65 Successors.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors of the parties hereto.

#### 9.<del>76</del> Assignment.

The parties hereto shall not assign any rights or obligations under this Agreement without written consent of all other parties.

#### 9.87 Execution.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside and the city\_City councils\_Councils\_of the cities enumerated herein have each authorized execution of this Agreement as evidenced by the authorized signatures below, respectively.

# JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT OF THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

This Agreement is made and entered into on the 1st day of April 1991, pursuant to Government Code Section 6500 et. seq., and other pertinent provisions of law, by and between six or more of the cities located within Western Riverside County and the County of Riverside.

#### RECITALS

- A. Each member and party to this Agreement is a governmental entity established by law with full powers of government in legislative, administrative, financial, and other related fields.
- B. The purpose of the formation is to provide an agency to conduct studies and projects designed to improve and coordinate the common governmental responsibilities and services on an area-wide and regional basis through the establishment of an association of governments. The Council will explore areas of intergovernmental cooperation and coordination of government programs and provide recommendations and solutions to problems of common and general concern.
- C. When authorized pursuant to an Implementation Agreement, the Council shall manage and administer thereunder.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

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#### PURPOSE AND POWERS

#### 1.1 Agency Created.

There is hereby created a public entity to be known as the "Western Riverside Council of Governments" ("WRCOG" or "the Council). WRCOG is formed by this Agreement pursuant to the provision of Government Code Section 6500 et. seq. and other pertinent provision of law. WRCOG shall be a public entity separate from the parties hereto.

#### 1.2 Powers.

- 1.2.1. WRCOG established hereunder shall perform all necessary functions to fulfill the purposes of this Agreement. Among other functions, WRCOG shall:
- a. Serve as a forum for consideration, study, and recommendation on area-wide and regional problems.
- b. Assemble information helpful in the consideration of problems peculiar to Western Riverside County.
- c. Explore practical avenues for intergovernmental cooperation, coordination, and action in the interest of local public welfare and means of improvements in the administration of governmental services.
- d. Serve as the clearinghouse review body for Federally-funded projects in accordance with Circular A-95 in conjunction with the Southern California Association of Governments.
- 1.2.2. The Council shall have the power in its own name to do any of the following:

- a. When necessary for the day-to-day operation of the Council, to make and enter into contracts.
- b. To contract for the services of engineers, attorneys, planners, financial consultants, and separate and apart therefrom to employ such other persons, as it deems necessary.
- c. To apply for an appropriate grant or grants under any federal, state, or local programs.
- d. To receive gifts, contributions, and donations of property, funds, services, and other forms of financial assistance from persons, firms, corporations, and any governmental entity.
- e. To lease, acquire, construct, manage, maintain, and operate any buildings, works, or improvements.
- f. To delegate some or all of its powers to the Executive Committee and the Executive Director of the Council as hereinafter provided.
- 1.2.3 The Council shall have the power in its own name, only with the approval of all affected member agencies to:
- a. Acquire, hold, and dispose of property by eminent domain, lease, lease purchase or sale.
  - b. To incur debts, liabilities, obligations, and issue bonds.

II.

## **ORGANIZATION OF COUNCIL**

#### 2.1 Parties.

The parties to WRCOG shall be the County of Riverside and each city located within Western Riverside County which has executed or hereafter executes this Agreement, or any addenda, amendment, or supplement hereto and agrees to become a member upon such terms and conditions as established by the General Assembly or Executive Committee, and which has not, pursuant to provisions hereof, withdrawn herefrom (the "Member Agencies"). Only the parties identified in this section and Associate Members approved under section 8.2 of this Agreement, if any, shall be considered contracting parties to this Agreement under Government Code section 6502, provided that the rights of any Associate Member under this Agreement shall be limited solely those rights expressly set forth in a PACE Agreement authorized in section 8.2 of this Agreement.

#### 2.2 Names.

The names, particular capacities and addresses of the parties shall be shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, as amended or supplemented from time to time by the Executive Director. If the Executive Director amends or supplements Exhibit "A," a copy of the revised Exhibit "A" shall be provided to the members.

#### 2.3 <u>Duties</u>.

WRCOG shall do whatever is necessary and required to carry out the purposes of this Agreement and when authorized by an Implementation Agreement pursuant to section 1.2.3 as appropriate, to make and enter into such contracts, incur such debts and obligations, assess contributions from the members, and perform such other acts as are necessary to the accomplishment of the purposes of such agreement,

within the provisions of Government Code Section 6500 et seq. and as prescribed by the laws of the State of California.

#### 2.4 Governing Body.

2.4.1. WRCOG shall be governed by a General Assembly with membership consisting of representatives from the County of Riverside, each city which is a signatory to this Agreement, the Western Municipal Water District, and the Eastern Municipal Water District (collectively, the "General Assembly Member Agencies"). Each General Assembly Member Agency shall have one vote for each Mayor, Council member, County Supervisor, and Water District Board Members present at the General Assembly. The General Assembly shall act only upon a majority of a quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the total authorized representatives, provided that voting representatives of a majority of the General Assembly Member Agencies are present. The General Assembly shall adopt and amend Bylaws for the administration and management of this Agreement, which when adopted and approved shall be an integral part of this Agreement. Such Bylaws may provide for the management and administration of this Agreement. The General Assembly shall meet at least once annually, preferably scheduled in the evening.

2.4.2. There shall be an Executive Committee which exercises the powers of this Agreement between sessions of the General Assembly. Members of the Executive Committee shall be the Mayor from each of the member cities, four members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, and the President of each Water District. Each City Council, at its discretion, can appoint its Mayor Pro Tem or other City Council member in place of the Mayor. Each Water District Board, at its discretion, can appoint another Board member in place of the President. The Executive Committee shall act only upon

a majority of a quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the Executive Committee Members. Voting shall be cast and tallied in accordance with the Bylaws.2.4.3. Each member of the General Assembly and the Executive Committee shall be a current member of the legislative body such member represents.

2.4.4. Each Executive Committee Member shall also have an alternate, who must also be a current member of the legislative body of the party such alternate represents. The remaining member of the Board of Supervisors shall serve as an alternate for the Board of Supervisors. The name of the alternate members shall be on file with the Executive Director. In the absence of the regular member from an agency, the alternate member from such agency shall assume all rights and duties of the absent regular member.

#### 2.5 <u>Executive Director</u>.

The Executive Director shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Council.

He or she shall receive such compensation as may be fixed by the Executive Committee.

The powers and duties of the Executive Director shall be subject to the authority of the Executive Committee and include the following:

- a. To appoint, direct and remove employees of the Council.
- b. Annually to prepare and present a proposed budget to the Executive Committee and General Assembly.
- c. Serve as Secretary of the General Assembly and of the Executive Committee.
  - d. To attend meetings of the General Assembly and Executive Committee.

e. To perform such other and additional duties as the Executive Committee may require.

#### 2.6 Principal Office.

The principal office of WRCOG shall be established by the Executive Committee and shall be located within Western Riverside County. The Executive Committee is hereby granted full power and authority to change said principal office from one location to another within Western Riverside County. Any change shall be noted by the Secretary under this section but shall not be considered an amendment to this Agreement.

#### 2.7 Meetings.

The Executive Committee shall meet at the principal office of the agency or at such other place as may be designated by the Executive Committee or Chair. The time and place of regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be determined by the Executive Committee; a copy of such schedule shall be furnished to each party hereto. Regular, adjourned, and special meetings shall be called and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code Section 54950 et. seq., as it may be amended.

#### 2.8 Powers and Limitations of the Executive Committee.

Unless otherwise provided herein, each Member or participating alternate of the Executive Committee shall be entitled to one vote, and a vote of the majority of those present and qualified to vote constituting a quorum may adopt any motion, resolution, or order and take any other action they deem appropriate to carry forward the objectives of the Council.

#### 2.9 Minutes.

The Secretary of the Council shall cause to be kept minutes of regular, adjourned regular, and special meetings of the General Assembly and Executive Committee, and shall cause a copy of the Minutes to be forwarded to each member.

#### 2.10 Rules.

The Executive Committee may adopt from time to time such rules and regulations for the conduct of its affairs consistent with this Agreement or any Implementation Agreement.

#### 2.11 Officers.

There shall be selected from the membership of the Executive Committee, a Chair, a Vice-Chair, and a Second Vice-Chair in accordance with the Bylaws. The Executive Director shall be the Secretary of the Council. The Treasurer and the Auditor shall be appointed by the Executive Director and must be officers or employees of WRCOG. The Executive Director may appoint a single officer or employee of WRCOG to serve in both the Treasurer and Auditor positions. Such person(s) shall possess the powers of, and shall perform the Treasurer and Auditor functions respectively, for WRCOG and perform those functions required of them by Government Code Sections 6505, 6505.5 and 6505.6, and by all other applicable laws and regulations, including any subsequent amendments thereto.

The Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair shall hold office for a period of one year commencing annually on July 1 and ending one year thereafter, or until his or her successor is elected. The Officers shall have the duties set forth in the Bylaws.

#### 2.12 Committees.

The Executive Committee may, as it deems appropriate, establish committees to accomplish the purposes set forth herein. All standing committee meetings of WRCOG, including those of the Executive Committee, shall be open to all Executive Committee Members in accordance with the Brown Act.

#### 2.13 Additional Officers.

The Executive Committee shall have the power to authorize such additional Officers as may be appropriate.

#### 2.14 Bonding Requirement.

The Officers or persons who have charge of, handle, or have access to any property of WRCOG shall be the Treasurer, the Executive Director, and any other Officers or persons designated or empowered by the Executive Committee. Each such Officer or person shall be required to file an official bond with the Executive Committee in an amount which shall be established by the Executive Committee. Should the existing bond or bonds of any such Officer be extended to cover the obligations provided herein, said bond shall be the official bond required herein. The premiums on any such bonds attributable to the coverage required herein shall be appropriate expenses of WRCOG.

#### 2.15 Status of Officers.

All of the privileges and immunities from liability, exemption from laws, ordinances and rules, all pension, relief, disability, worker's compensation, and other benefits which apply to the activity of Officers, agents, or employees of any of the members when performing their respective functions shall apply to them to the same degree and extent while engaged in the performance of any of the functions and other duties under this Agreement.

#### 2.16 Restrictions.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 6509, for the purposes of determining the restrictions to be imposed by the Council in its exercise of the above-described joint powers, reference shall be made to, and the Council shall observe, the restrictions imposed by state law upon the County of Riverside.

#### 2.17 <u>TUMF Matters – Water Districts</u>.

Pursuant to this Joint Powers Agreement, WRCOG administers the Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee ("TUMF") for cities in Western Riverside County. The fee was established prior to the Water District's involvement with WRCOG and will fund transportation improvements for the benefit of the County of Riverside and the cities in Western Riverside County. As such, the Western Municipal Water District and the Eastern Municipal Water District Executive Committee Members shall not vote on any matter related to the administration of the TUMF Program or the expenditure of TUMF revenues.

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## FUNDS AND PROPERTY

#### 3.1 Treasurer.

The Treasurer of the Council shall have custody of all funds and shall provide for strict accountability thereof in accordance with Government Code Section 6505.5 and other applicable laws of the State of California. He or she shall perform all of the duties required in Government Code Section 6505 et. seq., and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee.

## 3.2. Expenditure of Funds.

The funds under this Agreement shall be expended only in furtherance of the purposes hereof and in accordance with the laws of the State of California and standard accounting practices shall be used to account for all funds received and disbursed.

#### 3.3. Fiscal Year.

WRCOG shall be operated on a fiscal year basis, beginning on July 1 of each year and continuing until June 30 of the succeeding year. Prior to July 1 of each year, the General Assembly shall adopt a final budget for the expenditures of WRCOG during the following fiscal Year.

#### 3.4. Contributions / Public Funds.

In preparing the budget, the General Assembly, by majority vote of a quorum, shall determine the amount of funds which will be required from its members for the purposes of this Agreement. The funds required from its members after approval of the final budget shall be raised by contributions 50% of which will be assessed on a per capita basis and 50% on an assessed valuation basis, each city paying on the basis of its population and assessed valuation, and the County paying on the basis of the population and assessed valuation within the unincorporated area of Western Riverside County as defined in the Bylaws. The parties, when informed of their respective contributions, shall pay the same before August 1st of the fiscal year for which they are assessed or within sixty days of being informed of the assessment, whichever occurs later. In addition to the contributions provided, advances of public funds from the parties may be made for the purposes of this Agreement. When such advances are made, they shall be repaid from the first available funds of WRCOG.

The General Assembly shall have the power to determine that personnel, equipment, or property of one or more of the parties to the Agreement may be used in lieu of fund contributions or advances.

All contributions and funds shall be paid to WRCOG and shall be disbursed by a majority vote of a quorum of the Executive Committee, as authorized by the approved budget.

#### 3.5 Contributions from Water Districts and Other Nonvoting Agency(ies).

The provision of Section 3.4 above shall be inapplicable to the Western Municipal Water District, the Eastern Municipal Water District, or other nonvoting agency. The amount of contributions from these water districts or other nonvoting agency shall be through the WRCOG budget process. This provision shall not apply to Associate Members under Article VIII.

IV

#### **BUDGETS AND DISBURSEMENTS**

#### 4.1 Annual Budget.

The Executive Committee may at any time amend the budget to incorporate additional income and disbursements that might become available to WRCOG for its purposes during a fiscal year.

#### 4.2 Disbursements.

The Executive Director shall request warrants from the Auditor in accordance with budgets approved by the General Assembly or Executive Committee subject to quarterly review by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall pay such

claims or disbursements and such requisitions for payment in accordance with rules, regulations, policies, procedures, and Bylaws adopted by the Executive Committee.

#### 4.3 Accounts.

All funds will be placed in appropriate accounts and the receipt, transfer, or disbursement of such funds during the term of this Agreement shall be accounted for in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applicable to governmental entities and pursuant to Government Code Sections 6505 et seq., and any other applicable laws of the State of California. There shall be strict accountability of all funds. All revenues and expenditures shall be reported to the Executive Committee.

#### 4.4 <u>Expenditures Within Approved Annual Budget</u>.

All expenditures shall be made within the approved annual budget. No expenditures in excess of those budgeted shall be made without the approval of a majority of a quorum of the Executive Committee.

#### 4.5 <u>Audit</u>.

The Auditor shall contract with an independent certified public accountant or public accountant to make an annual audit of WRCOG's accounts and records, and copies of such audit report shall be filed with the County Auditor, State Controller, and each party to WRCOG no later than fifteen (15) days after receipt of said audit by the Executive Committee. The Auditor shall perform those functions required of him or her by Government Code Sections 6505, 6505.5 and 6505.6, and by all other applicable laws and regulations, including any subsequent amendments thereto.

#### 4.6 Reimbursement of Funds.

Grant funds received by WRCOG from any federal, state, or local agency to pay for budgeted expenditures for which WRCOG has received all or a portion of said funds from the parties hereto shall be used as determined by WRCOG's Executive Committee.

V

#### **LIABILITIES**

#### 5.1 Liabilities.

The debts, liabilities, and obligations of WRCOG shall be the debts, liabilities, or obligations of WRCOG alone and not of the parties to this Agreement.

#### 5.2 <u>Liability of Directors, Officers, and Employees.</u>

The Directors, Officers, and employees of Council shall use ordinary care and reasonable diligence in the exercise of their powers and in the performance of their duties pursuant to this Agreement. No current or former Director, Officer, or employee will be responsible for any act or omission by another Director, Officer, or employee. The Council shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the individual current and former Directors, Officers, and employees for any acts or omissions in the scope of their employment or duties in the manner provided by California Government Code § 995 et seq. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the defenses available under the law to the Member Agencies, the Council, or its Directors, Officers, or employees.

#### 5.3 Indemnification.

The Council shall acquire such insurance coverage as the Executive Committee deems necessary to protect the interests of the Council, and the Member Agencies. The Council shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Member Agencies

and each of their respective Board or Council members, Officers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims, losses, damages, costs, injuries, and liabilities of every kind arising directly or indirectly from the conduct, activities, operations, acts, and omissions of the Council under this Agreement.

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#### ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL OF PARTIES

#### 6.1 Admission of New Parties.

It is recognized that additional cities, other than the original parties, may wish to participate in WRCOG. Any Western Riverside County city may become a party to WRCOG upon such terms and conditions as established by the General Assembly or Executive Committee. Any Western Riverside County city shall become a party to WRCOG by the adoption by the city council of this Agreement and the execution of a written addendum hereto agreeing to the terms of this Agreement and agreeing to any additional terms and conditions that may be established by the General Assembly or Executive Committee. Special districts which are significantly involved in regional problems and the boundaries of which include territory within the collective area of the membership shall be eligible for advisory membership in the Council by the execution of a separate MOU setting forth the terms of such participation. The representative of any such advisory member may participate in the work of committees of the Council.

#### 6.2 Withdrawal from WRCOG.

It is fully anticipated that each party hereto shall participate in WRCOG until the purposes set forth in this Agreement are accomplished. The withdrawal of any party, either voluntary or involuntary, unless otherwise provided by the General Assembly or Executive Committee, shall be conditioned as follows:

- a. In the case of a voluntary withdrawal following a properly noticed public hearing, written notice shall be given to WRCOG, six months prior to the effective date of withdrawal.
- b. Withdrawal shall not relieve the party of its proportionate share of any debts or other liabilities incurred by WRCOG prior to the effective date of the party's notice of withdrawal in a manner consist with Article V, above.
- c. Unless otherwise provided by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee, withdrawal shall result in the forfeiture of that party's rights and claims relating to distribution of property and funds upon termination of WRCOG as set forth in Section VII below.
- d. Withdrawal from any Implementation Agreement shall not be deemed withdrawal from membership in WRCOG.

VII

#### TERMINATION AND DISPOSITION OF ASSETS

#### 7.1 <u>Termination of this Agreement</u>.

WRCOG shall continue to exercise the joint powers herein until the termination of this Agreement and any extension thereof or until the parties shall have mutually rescinded this Agreement, providing, however, that WRCOG and this Agreement shall continue to exist for the purposes of disposing of all claims, distribution of assets, and all other functions necessary to conclude the affairs of WRCOG.

Termination shall be accomplished by written consent of all of the parties, or shall occur upon the withdrawal from WRCOG of a sufficient number of the agencies enumerated herein so as to leave less than five of the enumerated agencies remaining in WRCOG.

#### 7.2 Distribution of Property and Funds.

In the event of the termination of this Agreement, any property interest remaining in WRCOG following the discharge of all obligations shall be disposed of as the Executive Committee shall determine with the objective of distributing to each remaining party a proportionate return on the contributions made to such properties by such parties, less previous returns, if any.

VIII

# IMPLEMENTATION AND PARTICIPATION AGREEMENTS; ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

#### 8.1 Execution of Agreement.

When authorized by the Executive Committee, any affected member agency, or agencies enumerated herein may execute an Implementation Agreement for the purpose of authorizing WRCOG to implement, manage and administer area-wide and regional programs in the interest of the local public welfare. The costs incurred by WRCOG in implementing a program, including indirect costs, shall be assessed only to those public agencies who are parties to that Implementation Agreement.

#### 8.2 PACE Agreements; Associate Membership.

WRCOG shall be empowered to establish and operate one or more Property Assessed Clean Energy ("PACE") Programs pursuant to Chapter 29 of the Improvement Bond Act of 1911, being Division 7 of the California Streets and Highways Code, and to enter into one or more agreements, including without limitation, participation agreements, implementation agreements, and joint powers agreements and amendments thereto to fulfill such programs both within and outside the jurisdictional boundaries of WRCOG.

WRCOG, acting through its Executive Committee, shall be empowered to establish an "Associate Member" status that provides membership in WRCOG to local jurisdictions that are outside WRCOG's jurisdictional boundaries but within whose boundaries a PACE Program will be established and implemented by WRCOG. Said local jurisdictions shall become Associate Members of WRCOG by adopting one or more agreements (the "PACE Agreement") on the terms and conditions established by the Executive Committee and consistent with the requirements of the Joint Exercise of Powers Act, being Chapter 5 of Division 7, Title 1 of the California Government Code (Sections 6500 et seq.). The rights of Associate Members shall be limited solely to those terms and conditions expressly set forth in the PACE Agreement for the purposes of implementing the PACE Program within their jurisdictional boundaries. expressly provided for by the PACE Agreement, Associate Members shall not have any rights otherwise granted to WRCOG's members by this Agreement, including but not limited to the right to vote, right to amend this Agreement, and right to sit on committees or boards established under this Agreement or by action of the Executive Committee or the General Assembly, including, without limitation, the General Assembly and the **Executive Committee.** 

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#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

#### 9.1 Amendments.

This Agreement may be amended with the approval of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of all member agencies.

#### 9.2 Notice.

Any notice or instrument required to be given or delivered by depositing the same in any United States Post Office, registered or certified, postage prepaid, addressed to the addresses of the parties as shown on Exhibit "A", shall be deemed to have been received by the party to whom the same is addressed at the expiration of seventy-two (72) hours after deposit of the same in the United States Post Office for transmission by registered or certified mail as aforesaid.

#### 9.3 <u>Effective Date</u>.

This Agreement shall be effective and WRCOG shall exist from and after such date as this Agreement has been executed by any seven or more of the public agencies, including the County of Riverside, as listed on page 1 hereof.

#### 9.4 Partial Invalidity.

If any one or more of the terms, provisions, sections, promises, covenants, or conditions of this Agreement shall, to any extent, be adjudged invalid, unenforceable, void, or voidable for any reason whatsoever by a court of competent jurisdiction, each and all of the remaining terms, provisions, sections, promises, covenants, and conditions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

#### 9.5 Successors.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors of the parties hereto.

#### 9.6 Assignment.

The parties hereto shall not assign any rights or obligations under this Agreement without written consent of all other parties.

#### 9.7 Execution.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside and the City Councils of the cities enumerated herein have each authorized execution of this Agreement as evidenced by the authorized signatures below, respectively.

# BY-LAWS FOR THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

### **ARTICLE I**

#### **SECTION 1.**

These Bylaws are provided for the organization and administration of the Western Riverside Council of Governments which has been established under a Joint Powers Agreement ("JPA"). These Bylaws supplement the Agreement. Capitalized terms shall have the same meaning as set forth in the JPA. In the event that the Bylaws conflict with the JPA, the JPA shall control.

# ARTICLE II GENERAL ASSEMBLY

## **SECTION 1. MEETINGS**

- A. <u>Annual Meeting</u>. The annual General Assembly shall meet in June. The locations and times of these meetings shall be determined by the Executive Committee.
- B. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the General Assembly may be called by the Chairperson, or in his or her absence by the Vice-Chairperson, or in the absence of the Chairperson and the Vice-Chairperson, by the Second Vice-Chairperson, or a majority of the members of the member agencies.

### **SECTION 2.** OFFICERS

- A. <u>Nomination and Election</u>. The General Assembly shall elect, by a majority vote, the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson from members of the Executive Committee, provided he or she is first nominated by either the General Assembly or Executive Committee. The election of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson shall be conducted once each year and no later than Julyannually by July 1, or as soon thereafter as possible.
- B. <u>Prohibition</u>. The <u>General Assembly shall not elect the</u> Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson <u>from shall each be</u> representatives <u>of the same from different General Assembly</u> member <u>agency agencies</u>.
- C. <u>Term.</u> The elected Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson shall assume office at the close of the meeting of their election annually on July 1 and each officer shall hold office for one year, or until his or her successor shall be is elected.

- D. <u>Vacancy</u>. Notwithstanding Article II, Section 2.C<sub>-</sub>, if the office of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Second Vice-Chairperson becomes vacant, the <u>resulting vacancy(s)</u> shall be filled by the <u>Vice-Chairperson and/or Second Vice-Chairperson</u>, respectively and a new <u>Second Vice-Chairperson shall be selected as set forth in Article II, Section 2.A. Notwithstanding the forgoing, the Executive Committee shall appoint, by a majority vote, one of its members to fill the unexpired term of the vacated office may choose to keep the position vacant until the annual selection of the Officers.</u>
- E. <u>Removal</u>. Notwithstanding Article II, Section 2.D., the Executive Committee may remove the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Second Vice-Chairperson by majority vote. The <u>removal of either the Chairperson</u>, <u>Vice-Chairperson or Second Vice-Chairperson creates aresulting</u> vacancy <u>which</u> shall be filled in accordance with Article II, Section 2.D.

### F. Duties of Chairperson.

- <u>F. Duties of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Second Vice-Chairperson.</u> The Chairperson shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the General Assembly—and, Executive Committee and or Administration & Finance Committee and shall exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may be from time to time be assigned to the Chairperson, including the creation and appointment of ad hoc committees. In the absence him or her by the Executive Committee or as prescribed herein.
- 2. In any case in which the execution of a document or the performance of an act is directed by action of the Executive Committee, the Chairperson, unless the act of the Executive Committee otherwise provides, is empowered to execute such document or perform such act.
- 3. At the beginning of the fiscal year, the Chairperson shall make appointments to the Administration and Finance Committee.
- <u>4.</u> The Chairperson shall have the power to create and appoint ad hoc committees.
- 5. The Chairperson may call special meetings
- <u>Quties</u> of the <u>Vice</u> Chairperson, the. <u>The</u> Vice-Chairperson shall perform all the duties of the Chairperson in his or her absence. When so acting, the Vice-Chairperson shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chairperson. <u>In the absence</u>
- <u>H.</u> of both the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson, the <u>Duties of Second Vice-Chairperson</u>. The <u>Second Vice-Chairperson</u> shall perform all the duties of the Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson and the <u>Vice-Chairperson</u>. When

so acting, the Second Vice-Chairperson shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chairperson.

- <u>Past-Chairperson.</u> In the absence of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson, the <u>General Assembly</u> Chairperson of the Previous Year (the "Past Chairperson") shall perform the duties of the Chairperson for that meeting only. When so acting, Past Chairperson shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chairperson.
- <u>Chair Pro Tempore.</u> In the absence of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Second Vice-Chairperson and the Past Chairperson, the <u>Executive Director or designee shall open the meeting and the</u> General Assembly-or, Executive Committee <u>or Administration and Finance Committee</u>, as applicable, shall choose one of its voting members to chair the meeting for that day only.

## **SECTION 3. VOTING**

- A. <u>In General</u>. Each voting representative of a General Assembly Member Agency shall have one vote as set forth in Section 2.4.1 of the Joint Powers Agreement.
- B. <u>Eligibility</u>. The Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Second Vice-Chairperson are eligible to vote.
- <u>B.</u> <u>C. Quorum.</u> The General Assembly shall act only upon a majority of a quorumthose members present at the meeting. A quorum shall be the majority of the total authorized representatives of each General Assembly Member Agency, provided that a voting representative of a majority of the General Assembly Member Agencies are present.

# ARTICLE III EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

### **SECTION 1. MEMBERSHIP**

- A. The Executive Committee will be composed of the Mayor from each of the member cities, four members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, and the President of each water district, and the Tribal Chairman of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians. Any City Council, at its discretion, can appoint a Mayor Pro Tem or other city council member in place of the Mayor. Each water district board, at its discretion, can appoint another board member in place of the President. The Tribal Council of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians, at its discretion, can appoint another tribal council member in place of the Tribal Chairman. Those members under this Section 1.A shall be referred to herein as "Regular Members."
- B<sub>a</sub> Each regular member on the Executive Committee shall also have an alternate, who must also be a current member of the legislative body of the partymember agency such alternate represents. For the Board of Supervisors, the Board of

Supervisor's member not serving under section A, above, shall serve as an alternate to the members of the Board of Supervisors. The name of the alternate members shall be on file with the <u>Secretary of the Executive Committee</u>. <u>InDuring</u> the absence of the regular member from <u>an agencya committee meeting</u>, the alternate member from such agency shall assume all rights and duties of the absent regular member. <u>Those members under this Section 1.B shall be referred to herein as "Alternate Members."</u>

#### **SECTION 2. OFFICERS**

- A. <u>Officers and Duties</u>. The officers of the Executive Committee shall be the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson of the General Assembly. The Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Second Vice-Chairperson shall perform the same duties set forth in Article II.
- B. <u>Absence</u>. If a jurisdiction misses three consecutive <u>regular</u> meetings, said jurisdiction shall be notified <u>of these occurrences</u> by the <u>Executive Director</u>.

### **SECTION 3. MEETINGS**

The Executive Committee shall meet in accordance with the meeting schedule adopted by the Executive Committee, as may be revised from time to time.

### **SECTION 4. QUORUM**

The Executive Committee shall act only upon a majority of a quorum those members present at the meeting. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the voting members of the Executive Committee.

#### **SECTION 5.** VOTING

Each member city present shall have one vote in the Executive Committee, each County Supervisor present shall have one vote, <u>and</u> each member water district present shall have one vote, <u>and the representative of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians present shall have one vote. Only authorized members present, or designated alternates. <u>Only Regular Members present</u>, or <u>Alternates Members</u> acting when the <u>regular member Regular Member</u> is absent, may vote. As set forth in the JPA, the water districts and the Morongo Band of Mission Indian members do not vote on TUMF matters.</u>

# **SECTION 6. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS**

A. To prepare and recommend to the General Assembly a yearly budget for funds and distribution, and to determine the estimated share of contributions from each member agency.

- B. To administer, manage, contract for, and handle the financing of the studies, projects and programs.
- C. To exercise the powers of the Joint Powers Agreement between sessions of the General Assembly.
- D. To select and employ an Executive Director who shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of WRCOG and who shall have administrative supervision over all WRCOG employees. The Executive Committee shall establish personnel rules and regulations.
- E. To appoint regular and special standing and ad hoc committees within the from Executive Committee members.
- F. To establish and operate a permanent business office for WRCOG.

#### G. To appoint advisory committees on such projects as it determines advisable.

<u>G.</u> H. To provide for additional ex-officio, non-voting members, as deemed appropriate for the effective conduct of the business of the organization.

# <u>SECTION 7. POLICY REGARDING CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION DISCLOSED DURING CLOSED SESSIONS</u>

The Executive Committee recognizes that, from time to time, it is vital that members of the Executive Committee divulge certain privileged information obtained in <a href="WRCOG"><u>WRCOG</u></a> closed sessions at WRCOG to their own governing bodies meeting in closed sessions. Thus, WRCOG adopts the policy set forth in Government Code section 54956.96 which authorizes the disclosure of closed session information that has <a href="directed\_direct">directed\_direct</a> financial or liability. <a href="Such information can only be disclosed during closed session meetings of the member agency">MRCOG</a> adopts the policy set forth in Government Code section 54956.96 which authorizes the disclosure of closed session information that has directed\_direct financial or liability. <a href="Such information can only be disclosed during closed session meetings">Such information can only be disclosed during closed session meetings of the member agency</a>

- A. All information received by the legislative body of the member agency in a closed session related to the information presented to WRCOG in closed session shall be confidential. However, a member of the legislative body of a member agency, or his/her duly appointed alternate under the JPA, may disclose information obtained in a closed session that has direct financial or liability implications for that member agency to the following individuals:
  - Legal counsel of that member agency for purposes of obtaining advice on whether the matter has direct financial or liability implications for that member agency.
  - Other members of the legislative body of the member agency present in a closed session of that member agency, as well as other persons that may be invited to attend the closed session by the member agency's legislative body.

B. The legislative body of the local agency member, upon the advice of its legal counsel, may conduct a closed session in order to receive, discuss, and <u>or</u> take action concerning information obtained in a closed session of WRCOG pursuant to this Policy.

# ARTICLE IV OTHER COMMITTEES

### **SECTION 1. TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

- A. <u>Duties</u>. The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) shall interface with WRCOG staff, review staff reports, consider staff recommendations, provide recommendations to the Executive Committee, and perform such other duties as may be delegated to it.
- B. <u>Meetings</u>. The TAC may meet once a month or as it is deemed necessary.
- C. Membership. The TAC is comprised of an executive from the County of Riverside, the City Manager from each of WRCOG's member cities, the General Manager from each of WRCOG's member water districts, the Chief Administrative Officer from the Morongo Band of Mission Indians, and the Executive Director from the March Joint Powers Authority. A City Manager, Water District General Manager, Chief Administrative Officer of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians, and Executive Director from the March JPA may appoint an alternate who is a department head of the agency.
- D. <u>Quorum</u>. The TAC shall act only upon a majority of <u>a quorumthose members</u> <u>present at the meeting</u>. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the TAC. Each representative shall have one vote, except that members of the water districts <u>and Morongo Band of Mission Indians</u> shall not vote on TUMF matters.

# **SECTION 2.** ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE COMMITTEE

- A. <u>Duties</u>. The Administration & Finance Committee shall provide budget and finance overview for WRCOG, review staff recommendations on WRCOG programs prior to consideration by the Executive Committee, and provide advice on other matters to the Executive Committee as needed. The Administration & Finance Committee shall have the authority (i) to increase the WRCOG budget in any category up to fifteen percent (15%); and (ii) to authorize contracts up to \$200,000 when the contract requires execution prior to the next regularly scheduled Executive Committee meeting.
- B. <u>Meetings</u>. The Administration & Finance Committee may meet once a month or as it is deemed necessary.

- C. <u>Membership</u>. The Administration & Finance Committee shall be composed of the Executive Committee Chairperson; the Executive Committee Vice-Chairperson, the Executive Committee Second Vice-Chairperson, the Past Executive Committee Chairperson; and seven other members of the Executive Committee selected by the Executive Committee Chairperson. When selecting members of the Administration & Finance Committee, the Executive Committee Chairperson is encouraged to consider geographic balance. At least two members of the Board of Supervisors shall be members of the <u>Administration & Finance</u> Committee. At least one member shall be a water district representative.
- D. <u>Quorum and Voting</u>. The Administration & Finance Committee shall act only upon a majority of a quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the <u>committee Committee</u>. Each member present shall have one vote, except that members representing the water districts <u>and Morongo Band of Mission Indians</u> shall not vote on TUMF matters.
- E. <u>Term and Removal</u>. Appointments to the Administration & Finance Committee shall be for a one-year term ending on June 30 of the fiscal year (July to June) in which the appointments are made <u>or until new members are appointed</u>. The process set forth below applies should the Chair wish to remove a Board member appointed ("Appointee") during the one-year term of the appointment. The process does not apply to the Chair's decision not to reappoint an Appointee at the end of the Appointee's one-year term.
  - 1. The Chair shall provide Appointee with written notice of the Chair's decision to remove the Appointee from the appointment.
  - 2. The notice shall be provided in writing to Appointee through WRCOG's Executive Director and shall include a brief statement of why removal is sought, which reason may include, without limitation, three or more consecutive absences of regular committee meetings. The notice shall be delivered to the email address, if any, provided by Appointee as well as by first class mail to the Clerk of the City / County appointing Appointee to the WRCOG Executive Committee and Appointee's mailing address.
  - 3. The removal shall be effective on the 15th day after WRCOG's Executive Director sends notice to Appointee unless Appointee provides notice to the WRCOG Executive Director, prior to the expiration of such 15<sub>±</sub>day period, of his or her desire to contest the removal.
  - 4. In the event that the removal is contested, the removal shall be stayed and the Executive Director shall schedule an Administration & Finance Committee meeting at which both the Chair and Appointee may present their arguments for and against removal. Based thereon, the Administration & Finance Committee shall either uphold or reject the removal. The decision of the Administration & Finance Committee shall be final.

5. If the removal is not contested or is approved by the Administration & Finance Committee, the Chair may appoint another WRCOG-Executive Committee member Regular Member to fill the remainder of the Appointee's term. The appointment of the new member shall comply with the membership requirements set forth in Section C, above. The term of the newly appointed member shall expire on June 30 of the fiscal year in which the appointment is made.

This section 2<sub>\_E</sub> shall only apply to appointments made by the Chair to the seven open seats on the Administration & Finance Committee and not to the four exofficio members of the <a href="mailto:committee">committee</a>.

# ARTICLE V EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND GENERAL COUNSEL

#### SECTION 1. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

- A. <u>Duties</u>. In addition to those duties enumerated in the Joint Powers Agreement, the duties of the Executive Director are:
- A. Duties. The Executive Director shall be responsible for the overall management of WRCOG, and has the necessary and full authority to effect this responsibility subject to the Executive Committee's oversight, any policies and directives issued by the Committee, and as called upon pursuant to the WRCOG JPA Agreement. The Executive Director shall be a full-time officer. The appointment and employment of the Executive Director shall be overseen by the Administration & Finance Committee and confirmed by the Executive Committee as set forth in Section B, below. In addition to those set forth in the Joint Powers Agreement, the powers and duties of the Executive Director, subject to oversight by the Executive Committee, are:
  - To administer all contracts the personnel system, including contract employees of WRCOG.
  - <u>2.</u> <u>To administer all WRCOG contracts, except as set forth in Article V.2.B (General Counsel).</u>
  - 3. To cause to be prepared by a Certified Public Accountant and to submit to the Executive Committee as soon as practical after the end of each fiscal year a post-audit of the financial transactions and records of WRCOG for the preceding year.
  - To keep the Executive Committee advised as to the needs of WRCOG.
  - <u>5.</u> To have full charge of the administration of the business affairs of WRCOG-, including the review and rejection of claims..

- 3. To exercise general supervision over all property belonging to WRCOG.
- <u>6.</u> <u>To see that all ordinances, rules and regulations, motions, or resolutions are enforced.</u>
- 4. To accept, on behalf of WRCOG, easements and other property rights and interests.
- <u>8.</u> To be responsible for the purchase of all supplies and equipment of WRCOG.
- 9. To provide for the clerical services required by WRCOG including keeping a book of minutes of all meetings of WRCOG, giving notice of all meetings as may be required by law or action of WRCOG, and (h) perform such other duties as may be prescribed by motion, ordinance or resolution of WRCOG.
- 10. To take any or all of the following actions in relation to employees of WRCOG:
  - <u>a)</u> To hire employees at the appropriate salary range as determined by the Executive Committee .
  - <u>b)</u> To promote, transfer, suspend with or without pay, or discharge any employee in accordance with applicable rules and policies
- 11. To make disbursements of WRCOG funds consistent with the annual budget, as may be amended by the Executive Committee from time to-time.

  The Executive Director shall have such other duties, powers and responsibilities as may from time to time be assigned by the Executive Committee or General Assembly.
- 12. 6. Accept To accept grants on behalf of WRCOG.
- 13. Annually to prepare and present a proposed budget to the Executive Committee and General Assembly.
- 14. To serve as Secretary of the General Assembly and of the Executive Committee.
- 15. To attend meetings of the General Assembly, Executive Committee Administration & Finance Committee and other standing and ad hoc committees.
- 16. To perform such other and additional duties as the Executive Committee may require.

### B. Selection, Oversight and Termination.

#### a. Selection.

1. Upon a vacancy or expected vacancy of the position of the Executive Director, the Administration & Finance Committee shall be responsible for directing the recruitment of Executive Director candidates, subject to the direction and oversight of the Executive Committee.

<u>2.</u>

- a) Following recruitment, the Administration & Finance Committee may appoint an ad hoc to interview potential candidates with a goal of presenting two or three candidates to the Administration & Finance Committee for consideration.
- b) The Administrative & Finance Committee shall then interview potential candidates recommended by the ad hoc committee with a goal of recommending one or two candidates to the Executive Committee for consideration as set forth in Step 4, below.
- c) If the Administration & Finance Committee decides not to appoint an ad hoc committee, Step 2 shall be skipped and the process shall proceed directly to step 3, below.
- 3. If the Administration & Finance Committee decides not to appoint an ad hoc committee provided for in Step 2, below, the Administrative and Finance Committee shall interview potential candidates with a goal of recommending one or two candidates to the Executive Committee for consideration.
- <u>4.</u> <u>The Executive Committee shall then make the final selection and oversee the negotiation of a employment contract.</u>
- <u>5.</u> <u>The Executive Committee may approve deviations from the process set forth above.</u>
- b. Oversight. Under the direction of the Executive Committee, the Administration & Finance Committee shall be primarily responsible for the oversight of the Executive Director. A performance review shall be performed annually or more frequently by the Administration & Finance Committee and then by the Executive Committee. Any changes in employment terms, included changes in compensation or benefits, shall be approved by the Executive Committee.

c. Termination. The Executive Director may be terminated pursuant to the terms of the Executive Director's employment contract by the Executive Committee on its own motion or upon recommendation of the Administration & Finance Committee

B. <u>ContractC.</u> Contracting. The Executive Director is authorized to contract and execute on behalf of WRCOG, contracts, including contracts for supplies, equipment and materials, and consultants, not to exceed \$100,000.000100.000, provided the contract relates to purposes previously approved and budgeted by the General Assembly or Executive Committee.

#### **SECTION 2. GENERAL COUNSEL**

- A. Duties of General Counsel. The General Counsel shall be a person admitted to practice law by the Supreme Court of California or a firm comprised of same, and shall have been actively engaged in the practice of law for not less than 10 years preceding appointment. The General Counsel shall represent and advise the General Assembly, Executive Committee, Administration & Finance Committee and the Executive Director on legal matters actions, or proceedings in which WRCOG is concerned, or interested, or is a party.
- B. The General Counsel shall be selected and overseen by the Executive Committee.

  The power to terminate the General Counsel shall rest exclusively with the Executive Committee.

## ARTICLE VI DEFINITION OF WESTERN RIVERSIDE AREA

The boundaries of WRCOG shall be defined according to the legal description attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

# ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws and any amendments thereto may be amended by the General Assembly, by majority vote. Proposed amendments shall be submitted, in writing, to members of the General Assembly along with the agenda for such meeting.

# ARTICLE VII REVIEW OF BYLAWS

It is the intent of the Executive Committee and General Assembly that these Bylaws shall

be reviewed by the Administration & Finance Committee at least every 4 years, or sooner if determined necessary. Following review, the Bylaws, along with any recommended updates, shall be presented to the Executive Committee. If changes are approved by the Executive Committee, the changes shall be effective immediately, provided that any changes shall be presented to the General Assembly as soon thereafter as practical for confirmation.

# BY-LAWS FOR THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

#### **ARTICLE I**

#### **SECTION 1.**

These Bylaws are provided for the organization and administration of the Western Riverside Council of Governments which has been established under a Joint Powers Agreement ("JPA"). These Bylaws supplement the Agreement. Capitalized terms shall have the same meaning as set forth in the JPA. In the event that the Bylaws conflict with the JPA, the JPA shall control.

# ARTICLE II GENERAL ASSEMBLY

#### **SECTION 1. MEETINGS**

- A. <u>Annual Meeting</u>. The annual General Assembly shall meet in June. The locations and times of these meetings shall be determined by the Executive Committee.
- B. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the General Assembly may be called by the Chair, or in his or her absence by the Vice-Chair, or in the absence of the Chair and the Vice-Chair, by the Second Vice-Chair, or a majority of the members of the member agencies.

#### **SECTION 2.** OFFICERS

- A. <u>Nomination and Election</u>. The General Assembly shall elect, by a majority vote, the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair from members of the Executive Committee, provided he or she is first nominated by either the General Assembly or Executive Committee. The election of the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair shall be conducted annually by July 1, or as soon thereafter as possible.
- B. <u>Prohibition</u>. The Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair shall each be representatives from different General Assembly member agencies.
- C. <u>Term.</u> The elected Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair shall assume office at the annually on July 1 and each officer shall hold office for one year, or until his or her successor is elected.
- D. <u>Vacancy</u>. Notwithstanding Article II, Section 2.C., if the office of the Chair, Vice-Chair or Second Vice-Chair becomes vacant, the resulting vacancy(s) shall be filled by the Vice-Chair and/or Second Vice-Chair, respectively and a new Second Vice-Chair shall be selected as set forth in Article II, Section 2.A. Notwithstanding the forgoing, the Executive Committee may choose to keep the position vacant until the annual selection of the Officers.
- E. <u>Removal.</u> Notwithstanding Article II, Section 2.D., the Executive Committee may remove the Chair, Vice-Chair or Second Vice-Chair by majority vote. The resulting vacancy shall be filled in accordance with Article II, Section 2.D.

#### F. Duties of Chair.

- 1. The Chair shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the General Assembly, Executive Committee, or Administration & Finance Committee and shall exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may be from time to time assigned him or her by the Executive Committee or as prescribed herein.
- 2. In any case in which the execution of a document or the performance of an act is directed by action of the Executive Committee, the Chair, unless the act of the Executive Committee otherwise provides, is empowered to execute such document or perform such act.
- 3. At the beginning of the fiscal year, the Chair shall make appointments to the Administration & Finance Committee.
- 4. The Chair shall have the power to create and appoint ad hoc committees.
- 5. The Chair may call special meetings
- G. <u>Duties of the Vice-Chair</u>. The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in his or her absence. When so acting, the Vice-Chair shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chair.
- H. <u>Duties of Second Vice-Chair</u>. The Second Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in the absence of the Chair and the Vice-Chair. When so acting, the Second Vice-Chair shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chair.
- I. <u>Past-Chair</u>. In the absence of the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair, the Chair of the Previous Year (the "Past Chair") shall perform the duties of the Chair for that meeting only. When so acting, Past Chair shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chair.
- J. <u>Chair Pro Tempore</u>. In the absence of the Chair, Vice-Chair, Second Vice-Chair and the Past Chair, the Executive Director or designee shall open the meeting and the General Assembly, Executive Committee or Administration & Finance Committee, as applicable, shall choose one of its voting members to chair the meeting for that day only.

#### **SECTION 3. VOTING**

- A. <u>In General</u>. Each voting representative of a General Assembly Member Agency shall have one vote as set forth in Section 2.4.1 of the Joint Powers Agreement.
- B. Quorum. The General Assembly shall act only upon a majority of those members present at the meeting. A quorum shall be the majority of the total representatives of each General Assembly Member Agency, provided that a voting representative of a majority of the General Assembly Member Agencies are present.

# ARTICLE III EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

#### **SECTION 1. MEMBERSHIP**

- A. The Executive Committee will be composed of the Mayor from each of the member cities, four members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, and the President of each water district. Any City Council, at its discretion, can appoint a Mayor Pro Tem or other city council member in place of the Mayor. Each water district board, at its discretion, can appoint another board member in place of the President. Those members under this Section 1.A shall be referred to herein as "Regular Members."
- B. Each regular member on the Executive Committee shall also have an alternate, who must also be a current member of the legislative body of the member agency such alternate represents. For the Board of Supervisors, the Board of Supervisor's member not serving under Section A above, shall serve as an alternate to the members of the Board of Supervisors. The name of the alternate members shall be on file with the Secretary of the Executive Committee. During the absence of the regular member from a committee meeting, the alternate member from such agency shall assume all rights and duties of the absent regular member. Those members under this Section 1.B shall be referred to herein as "Alternate Members."

#### **SECTION 2. OFFICERS**

- A. <u>Officers and Duties</u>. The officers of the Executive Committee shall be the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair of the General Assembly. The Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair shall perform the same duties set forth in Article II.
- B. <u>Absence</u>. If a jurisdiction misses three consecutive regular meetings, said jurisdiction shall be notified of these by the Executive Director.

#### **SECTION 3.** MEETINGS

The Executive Committee shall meet in accordance with the meeting schedule adopted by the Executive Committee, as may be revised from time to time.

#### **SECTION 4. QUORUM**

The Executive Committee shall act only upon a majority of those members present at the meeting. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the voting members of the Executive Committee.

#### **SECTION 5.** VOTING

Each member city present shall have one vote in the Executive Committee, each County Supervisor present shall have one vote, and each member water district present shall have one vote. Only Regular Members present, or Alternates Members acting when the Regular Member is absent, may vote. As set forth in the JPA, the water districts members do not vote on TUMF matters.

#### **SECTION 6. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS**

- A. To prepare and recommend to the General Assembly a yearly budget for funds and distribution, and to determine the estimated share of contributions from each member agency.
- B. To administer, manage, contract for, and handle the financing of the studies, projects and programs.

- C. To exercise the powers of the Joint Powers Agreement between sessions of the General Assembly.
- D. To select and employ an Executive Director who shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of WRCOG and who shall have administrative supervision over all WRCOG employees. The Executive Committee shall establish personnel rules and regulations.
- E. To appoint standing and ad hoc committees.
- F. To establish and operate a business office for WRCOG.
- G. To provide for additional ex-officio, non-voting members, as deemed appropriate for the effective conduct of the business of the organization.

# <u>SECTION 7.</u> POLICY REGARDING CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION DISCLOSED DURING CLOSED SESSIONS

The Executive Committee recognizes that, from time to time, it is vital that members of the Executive Committee divulge certain privileged information obtained in WRCOG closed sessions to their own governing bodies. Thus, WRCOG adopts the policy set forth in Government Code Section 54956.96 which authorizes the disclosure of closed session information that has direct financial liability. Such information can only be disclosed during closed session meetings of the member agency

- A. All information received by the legislative body of the member agency in a closed session related to the information presented to WRCOG in closed session shall be confidential. However, a member of the legislative body of a member agency, or his/her duly appointed alternate under the JPA, may disclose information obtained in a closed session that has direct financial or liability implications for that member agency to the following individuals:

- B. <u>Meetings</u>. The Administration & Finance Committee may meet once a month or as it is deemed necessary.
- C. Membership. The Administration & Finance Committee shall be composed of the Executive Committee Chair, the Executive Committee Vice-Chair, the Executive Committee Second Vice-Chair, the Past Executive Committee Chair, and seven other members of the Executive Committee selected by the Executive Committee Chair. When selecting members of the Administration & Finance Committee, the Executive Committee Chair is encouraged to consider geographic balance. At least two members of the Board of Supervisors shall be members of the Administration & Finance Committee. At least one member shall be a water district representative.
- D. <u>Quorum and Voting</u>. The Administration & Finance Committee shall act only upon a majority of a quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the Committee. Each member present shall have one vote, except that members representing the water districts shall not vote on TUMF matters.
- E. <u>Term and Removal</u>. Appointments to the Administration & Finance Committee shall be for a one-year term ending on June 30 of the fiscal year (July to June) in which the appointments are made or until new members are appointed. The process set forth below applies should the Chair wish to remove a Board member appointed ("Appointee") during the one-year term of the appointment. The process does not apply to the Chair's decision not to reappoint an Appointee at the end of the Appointee's one-year term.
  - 1. The Chair shall provide Appointee with written notice of the Chair's decision to remove the Appointee from the appointment.
  - 2. The notice shall be provided to Appointee through WRCOG's Executive Director and shall include a brief statement of why removal is sought, which reason may

include, without limitation, three or more consecutive absences of regular committee meetings. The notice shall be delivered to the email address, if any, provided by Appointee as well as by first class mail to the Clerk of the City / County appointing Appointee to the WRCOG Executive Committee and Appointee's mailing address.

- 3. The removal shall be effective on the 15th day after WRCOG's Executive Director sends notice to Appointee unless Appointee provides notice to the WRCOG Executive Director, prior to the expiration of such 15-day period, of his or her desire to contest the removal.
- 4. In the event that the removal is contested, the removal shall be stayed and the Executive Director shall schedule an Administration & Finance Committee meeting at which both the Chair and Appointee may present their arguments for and against removal. Based thereon, the Administration & Finance Committee shall either uphold or reject the removal. The decision of the Administration & Finance Committee shall be final.
- 5. If the removal is not contested or is approved by the Administration & Finance Committee, the Chair may appoint another Executive Committee Regular Member to fill the remainder of the Appointee's term. The appointment of the new member shall comply with the membership requirements set forth in Section C, above. The term of the newly appointed member shall expire on June 30 of the fiscal year in which the appointment is made.

This section 2.E shall only apply to appointments made by the Chair to the seven open seats on the Administration & Finance Committee and not to the four ex- officio members of the Committee.

# ARTICLE V EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND GENERAL COUNSEL

#### **SECTION 1. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

- A. <u>Duties</u>. The Executive Director shall be responsible for the overall management of WRCOG and has the necessary and full authority to effect this responsibility subject to the Executive Committee's oversight, any policies and directives issued by the Committee, and as called upon pursuant to the WRCOG JPA Agreement. The Executive Director shall be a full-time officer. The appointment and employment of the Executive Director shall be overseen by the Administration & Finance Committee and confirmed by the Executive Committee as set forth in Section B below. In addition to those set forth in the Joint Powers Agreement, the powers and duties of the Executive Director, subject to oversight by the Executive Committee, are:
  - 1. To administer the personnel system, including contract employees of WRCOG.
  - 2. To administer all WRCOG contracts, except as set forth in Article V.2.B (General Counsel).
  - To cause to be prepared by a Certified Public Accountant and to submit to the Executive Committee as soon as practical after the end of each fiscal year a postaudit of the financial transactions and records of WRCOG for the preceding year.

- 4. To keep the Executive Committee advised as to the needs of WRCOG.
- 5. To have full charge of the administration of the business affairs of WRCOG., including the review and rejection of claims.
- 6. To see that all ordinances, rules and regulations, motions, or resolutions are enforced.
- 7. To accept, on behalf of WRCOG, easements and other property rights and interests.
- 8. To be responsible for the purchase of all supplies and equipment of WRCOG.
- 9. To provide for the clerical services required by WRCOG including keeping a book of minutes of all meetings of WRCOG, giving notice of all meetings as may be required by law or action of WRCOG, and (h) perform such other duties as may be prescribed by motion, ordinance, or resolution of WRCOG.
- 10. To take any or all of the following actions in relation to employees of WRCOG:
  - a) To hire employees at the appropriate salary range as determined by the Executive Committee.
  - b) To promote, transfer, suspend with or without pay, or discharge any employee in accordance with applicable rules and policies
- 11. To make disbursements of WRCOG funds consistent with the annual budget, as may be amended by the Executive Committee from time to-time. The Executive Director shall have such other duties, powers and responsibilities as may from time to time be assigned by the Executive Committee or General Assembly.
- To accept grants on behalf of WRCOG.
- 13. Annually to prepare and present a proposed budget to the Executive Committee and General Assembly.
- 14. To serve as Secretary of the General Assembly and of the Executive Committee.
- 15. To attend meetings of the General Assembly, Executive Committee, Administration & Finance Committee, and other standing and ad hoc committees.
- 16. To perform such other and additional duties as the Executive Committee may require.

#### B. Selection, Oversight and Termination.

- a) <u>Selection</u>.
  - Upon a vacancy or expected vacancy of the position of the Executive Director, the Administration & Finance Committee shall be responsible for

- directing the recruitment of Executive Director candidates, subject to the direction and oversight of the Executive Committee.
- 2. Following recruitment, the Administration & Finance Committee may appoint an ad hoc to interview potential candidates with a goal of presenting two or three candidates to the Administration & Finance Committee for consideration.
- 3. The Administrative & Finance Committee shall then interview potential candidates recommended by the ad hoc committee with a goal of recommending one or two candidates to the Executive Committee for consideration as set forth in Step 4, below.
- 4. If the Administration & Finance Committee decides not to appoint an ad hoc committee, Step 2 shall be skipped and the process shall proceed directly to Step 5, below.
- 5. If the Administration & Finance Committee decides not to appoint an ad hoc committee provided for in Step 2, below, the Administration & Finance Committee shall interview potential candidates with a goal of recommending one or two candidates to the Executive Committee for consideration.
- 6. The Executive Committee shall then make the final selection and oversee the negotiation of a employment contract.
- 7. The Executive Committee may approve deviations from the process set forth above.
- b. Oversight. Under the direction of the Executive Committee, the Administration & Finance Committee shall be primarily responsible for the oversight of the Executive Director. A performance review shall be performed annually or more frequently by the Administration & Finance Committee and then by the Executive Committee. Any changes in employment terms, included changes in compensation or benefits, shall be approved by the Executive Committee.
- c. <u>Termination</u>. The Executive Director may be terminated pursuant to the terms of the Executive Director's employment contract by the Executive Committee on its own motion or upon recommendation of the Administration & Finance Committee.
- C. <u>Contracting</u>. The Executive Director is authorized to contract and execute on behalf of WRCOG, contracts, including contracts for supplies, equipment and materials, and consultants, not to exceed \$100,000, provided the contract relates to purposes previously approved and budgeted by the General Assembly or Executive Committee.

#### **SECTION 2.** GENERAL COUNSEL

A. <u>Duties of General Counsel</u>. The General Counsel shall be a person admitted to practice law by the Supreme Court of California or a firm comprised of same, and shall have been actively engaged in the practice of law for not less than 10 years preceding appointment. The General Counsel shall represent and advise the General Assembly, Executive

- Committee, Administration & Finance Committee and the Executive Director on legal matters actions, or proceedings in which WRCOG is concerned, or interested, or is a party.
- B. <u>The General Counsel shall be selected and overseen by the Executive Committee</u>. The power to terminate the General Counsel shall rest exclusively with the Executive Committee.

# ARTICLE VI DEFINITION OF WESTERN RIVERSIDE AREA

The boundaries of WRCOG shall be defined according to the legal description attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

# ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws and any amendments thereto may be amended by the General Assembly, by majority vote. Proposed amendments shall be submitted, in writing, to members of the General Assembly along with the agenda for such meeting.

### ARTICLE VII REVIEW OF BYLAWS

It is the intent of the Executive Committee and General Assembly that these Bylaws shall be reviewed by the Administration & Finance Committee at least every 4 years, or sooner if determined necessary Following review, the Bylaws, along with any recommended updates, shall be presented to the Executive Committee. If changes are approved by the Executive Committee, the changes shall be effective immediately, provided that any changes shall be presented to the General Assembly as soon thereafter as practical for confirmation.

- 6. The Executive Committee shall then make the final selection and oversee the negotiation of an employment contract.
- 7. The Executive Committee may approve deviations from the process set forth above.
- b) Oversight. Under the direction of the Executive Committee, the Administration & Finance Committee shall be primarily responsible for the oversight of the Executive Director. A performance review shall be performed annually or more frequently by the Administration & Finance Committee and then by the Executive Committee. Any changes in employment terms, including changes in compensation or benefits, shall be approved by the Executive Committee.
- c) <u>Termination</u>. The Executive Director may be terminated pursuant to the terms of the Executive Director's employment contract by the Executive Committee on its own motion or upon recommendation of the Administration & Finance Committee.
- C. <u>Contracting</u>. The Executive Director is authorized to contract and execute on behalf of WRCOG, contracts, including contracts for supplies, equipment and materials, and consultants, not to exceed \$100,000, provided the contract relates to purposes previously approved and budgeted by the General Assembly or Executive Committee.

#### Requested Action(s):

- 1. Direct staff to forward the JPA Amendment to WRCOG member agencies for their approval.
- 2. Adopt Resolution Number 25-21; A Resolution of the Executive Committee of the Western Riverside Council of Governments amending its Bylaws.

#### Purpose:

The purpose of this item is to present an updated version of the WRCOG Joint Powers Agreement and Bylaws. These updates were made based on direction from a subcommittee tasked with reviewing both documents.

### WRCOG 2022-2027 Strategic Plan Goal:

#### Background:

The practices, role, and needs of WRCOG have evolved over the past three decades. The processes outlined in the formation document (Joint Powers Agreement) and the operational document (Bylaws) should be updated from time to time in order to capture changes in the needs, intent, and focus of the Executive Committee. This agenda item proposes updates to both documents.

Earlier this summer, a subcommittee comprised of Vice-Chair Crystal Ruiz, Committee member Brian Tisdale, Committee member Ben Benoit, and immediate Past Chair Kevin Bash met to evaluate and propose changes to WRCOG's Bylaws. The group met over a series of months and identified several substantive changes along with several formatting and/or stylistic changes.

Upon completion of their work on the Bylaws, Chair Spiegel tasked the group with performing a similar task with the Joint Powers Agreement – the parent document to the Bylaws. The group convened and has completed its work.

Both documents are attached as proposed (clean) version and redline version.

A partial list of key changes to the JPA is listed below. For the full scope of changes, please see the attached red line document (Attachment 1) (list of substantive changes). The changes are intended to:

1. Remove references to the membership of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians.

- 2. Modernize language and processes, including removal of references to use of member agency employees to perform day-to-day WRCOG Agency business.
- 3. Completely revise indemnity language to better articulate WRCOG responsibility to indemnify member agencies.
- 4. Remove outdated arbitration provision.

A partial list of key changes to the Bylaws is listed below. For the full scope of changes, please see the attached red line document (Attachment 3) (list of substantive changes). The changes are intended to:

- Clarify the role of the Chairperson to include, without limitation, the power to execute documents or take other actions as directed by the Executive Committee, make appointments to the Administration & Finance Committee, create and appoint to ad hoc committees, and call special meetings.
- 2. Clarify which official will preside over the meeting when the Chair is absent. Designates the Past Chair to preside over the meeting if the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair are absent.
- 3. Clarify the duties of the Executive Director and General Counsel and the Executive Committee's ultimate oversight authority over the Executive Director and General Counsel. Duties of the Executive Director include:
  - a. Administration of personnel system
  - b. Administration of contracts
  - c. Preparation of audit by outside auditor
  - d. Enforcement of policies, rules and regulations, motions, or resolutions
  - e. Preparation and implementation of budget
- 4. Establish the selection, oversight, and termination process of the Executive Director and General Counsel.
- 5. Update gender references.
- 6. Make various non-substantive language changes for clarity.

### Prior Action(s):

<u>October 13, 2021</u>: The Administration & Finance Committee recommended that the Executive Committee 1) direct staff to forward the JPA Amendment to WRCOG member agencies for their approval; and 2) adopt Resolution Number 25-21; A Resolution of the Executive Committee of the Western Riverside Council of Governments amending its Bylaws.

#### **SUMMARY**

- 4. Livability To enhance quality of life by supporting effective education programs, strengthening the City's neighborhoods, enhancing community services and facilities, and promoting arts and culture.
- 5. Local Control To preserve local governance and protect local government revenue.
- 6. Public Safety To promote the general safety of all City residents.
- 7. Public Utilities To preserve the local rate-making authority of municipallyowned utilities and promote voluntary compliance with California Energy Commission reporting.
- 8. Transportation Infrastructure and Mobility To cultivate a city with safe, appealing, efficient, motor and non-motor transportation infrastructure to attract and retain small and large businesses, new entertainment and recreation, and residents, and to support growth in the goods movement industry.

As proposed, the draft City of Moreno Valley Legislative Advocacy Platform reflects the following City Council objectives: Economic Development, Public Safety, Library, Infrastructure, Beautification, Community Engagement and Quality of Life, and Youth Programs.

#### **ALTERNATIVE**

#### **SUMMARY**

The attached Quarterly Investment Report presents the City's cash and investments for the quarter that ended June 30, 2022. This report is in compliance with California Government Code Section 53646 regarding the reporting of detailed information on all securities, investments, and monies of the City, as well as the reporting of the market value of the investments held. All of the investments contained within the portfolio are in full compliance with the City's Investment Policy and Government Code Section 53601 as to the types of investments allowed. It is recommended that the City Council receive and file the attached Quarterly Investment Report.

#### DISCUSSION

The City maintains a portfolio of investments in order to earn interest on cash balances that are not currently required to fund operations. California Government Code Sections 53601 and 53646 establish the types of investments allowed, the governing restrictions on these investments, the third-party custodian arrangement for certain investments, and the reporting practices related to the portfolios of local agencies. In keeping with best practices, the City has implemented an Investment Policy, which was last reviewed by the City Council on April 7, 2020. The policy is in full compliance with the requirements of both of the above-mentioned Code Sections.

The attached Quarterly Investment Report presents the City's cash and investments for the quarter that ended June 30, 2022. The report complies with California Government Code Section 53646 regarding the reporting of detailed information on all securities, investments, and monies of the City, as well as the reporting of the market value of the investments held. All of the investments contained within the portfolio are in full compliance with the City's Investment Policy and Government Code Section 53601 as to the types of investments allowed. As stated in the attached report, there is more than adequate liquidity within the portfolio for the City to meet its budgeted expenditures over the next six months.

The City's investment policy has set the primary goals of the portfolio management as Safety and Liquidity followed by Yield. The City's cash flow requirements are evaluated on an ongoing basis, with short-term needs accommodated through the City's pooled investment funds with the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF). LAIF is a pool of public funds managed by the State Treasurer of California, providing 24-hour liquidity while yielding a rate of return approximately equivalent to a one-year treasury bill. With the combined use of a conservative approach to evaluating cash flow needs and LAIF liquidity, the City will not have to liquidate securities at current market rates that are intended to be held for longer-term investment.

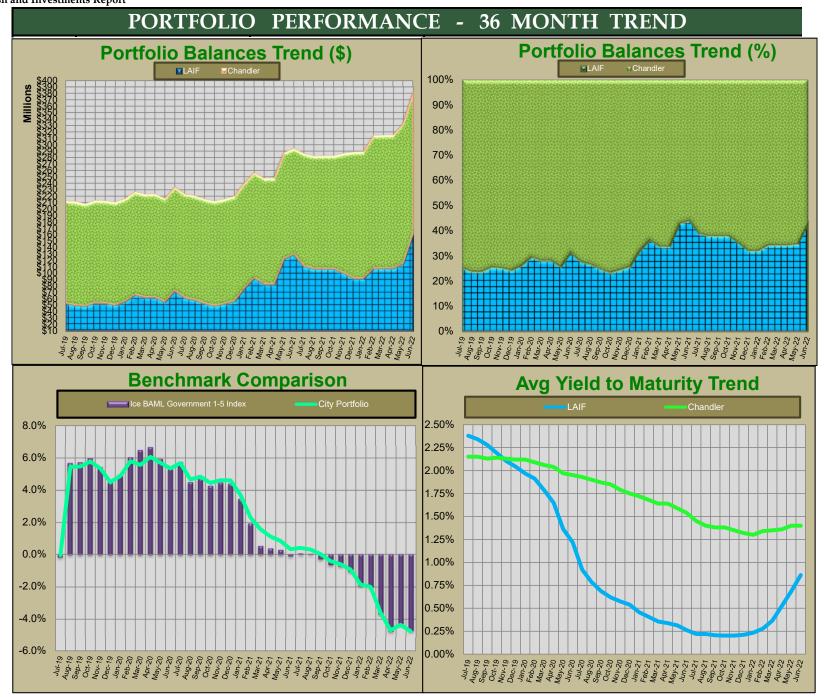

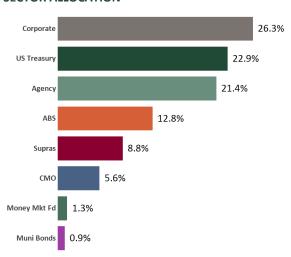

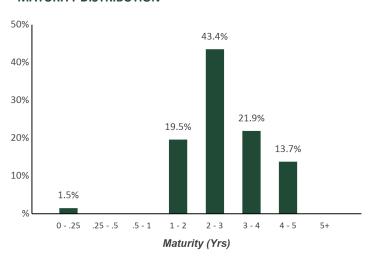

#### **SECTOR ALLOCATION**

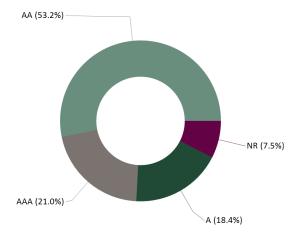
Average Life

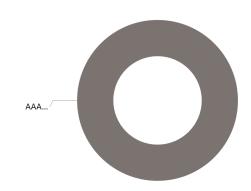

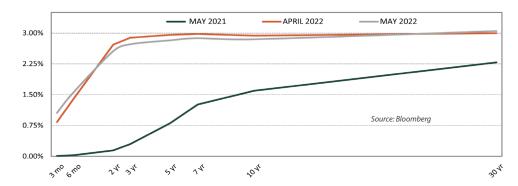
## **Market Summary**

Financial markets are experiencing heightened volatility and tighter conditions as central banks employ more restrictive monetary policies to combat persistent inflation. The conflict between Russia and Ukraine has exacerbated inflationary pressures, particularly with energy an commodities, and strict COVID lockdowns in China are intensifying distressed supply chains. While US inflation may have approached a peak, elevated levels will likely persist. Labor markets an consumer spending remain strong, but we believe the risk of an economic slowdown later this year has increased. While we expect the Fed to continue to tighten monetary policy, the Federal Ope Market Committee (FOMC) has very little margin for error as it attempts to combat inflation without pushing the economy into a recession. Over the near term, we expect financial market volatilit to remain intensified and conditions to remain tighter with persistent inflation, geopolitical risk supply chain bottlenecks, and the Fed's shift to a more hawkish monetary policy.

As expected at the May meeting, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) announced would raise the federal funds rate by 0.50% to a range of 0.75% - 1.00% and begin shrinking it \$9 trillion balance sheet starting June 1st. Federal Reserve Chair Powell indicated that a 75-bas point increase is not currently under consideration, and the Treasury yield curve steepened after the announcement. We are anticipating additional rate hikes by the Fed in the near term, but we believe that monetary policy is not on a pre-set course, and the timing and magnitude of rate hike in the second half of this year will be dependent on how economic and geopolitical condition continue to transpire.

In May, yields fell and the curve steepened. The 2-year Treasury yield declined 16 basis points t 2.56%, the 5-year Treasury yield fell 14 basis points to 2.82%, and the 10-year Treasury yield droppe 9 basis points to 2.85%. The spread between the 2-year and 10-year Treasury yield increased to 2 basis points at May month-end versus 22 basis points at April month-end but down from 145 bas points one year ago. While the flat yield curve bears watching over the longer run, the sprea between 3-month and 10-year treasuries is still steep at about 179 basis points, which indicate likely economic growth in the coming year.

#### **Treasury Yields Fell in May**



At the end of May, the 2-year Treasury yield decreased to 2.56%, and the 10-Year Treasury yield fell t 2.85%. The spread between the 2-year Treasury yield and 10-year Treasury yield increased to 29 bas points at the end of May compared to the average historical 20-year spread (since 2002) of 130 bas points.

#### **Consumer Prices**

US inflation data was worse than expected in May, hitting a 40-year high with broad-based price increases for most goods and services. The consume price index (CPI) increased 1.0% for the month of May and 8.6% from a year earlier with shelter, food, and gasoline as the largest contributors. The core CP which removes more volatile food and energy components, rose 0.6% in May and 6.0% from a year earlier. Persistent elevated levels of inflation are likel to keep the Federal Reserve (Fed) on the path of tightening monetary policy. The most recent inflation data suggests that the Fed is all but certain to hik the federal funds rate by 0.50% at its June 15, 2022 meeting.

#### **Retail Sales**

Retail sales rose in April, with signs that consumers are spending more on services. On a year-over-year basis, retail sales were up 8.2% in April versus u 6.9% in March. On a month-over-month basis, retail sales rose 0.9% from the 1.4% upwardly revised figure for March. Excluding vehicles and gas, retail sales were up just 0.6% month-over-month. The Consumer Confidence index fell to 106.4 in May from an upwardly revised 108.6 in April. U.S. consumer saving rates are declining, and the wealth effect is waning from recent financial market declines. Although the average consumer still has the capacity to spen from accumulated savings, higher wages, and credit lines, consumer balance sheets and discretionary spending decisions are increasingly pressured b elevated gas, food, and shelter costs.

#### **Labor Market**

The U.S. economy added 390,000 jobs in May, and job gains in April were revised upward from 428,000 to 436,000. Trends in employment remain strong with the three-month moving average payrolls at 408,000 and the six-month moving average at 505,000. Hiring was led by leisure and hospitality responsible for more than a quarter of payroll gains for the month, followed by professional and business services. The unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.6%, and the U-6 underemployment rate, which includes those who are marginally attached to the labor force and employed part-time for economic reasons, was 7.1%. Average hourly earnings rose 5.2% year-over-year in May, easing from a 5.5% year-over-year gain in April, which may reflect the beginning of a deceleration in wage growth that could help ease broad cyclical price pressures. The labor participation rate ticked up to 62.3% from 62.2%, a possible sign that higher wages and number of available jobs are compelling enough to draw workers back into the labor force.

#### **Housing Starts**

Total housing starts declined slightly to 0.2% to an annual rate of 1,724,000 in April, from a revised 1,728,000 units in March. Single-family home starts fell b 7.3% and multi-family starts increased 15.3% month-over-month. On a year-over-year basis, total housing starts increased by 14.6%, driven by multi-family According to the Case-Shiller 20-City home price index, home prices were up 21.2% in March versus 20.3% year-over-year in February, setting another new record. While tight supply has continued to support prices, rising mortgage rates and affordability could be headwinds to further price growth.

#### SUMMARY

Adoption of the resolutions will certify the annexation of thirteen parcels into Community Facilities District (CFD) No. 2014-01 (Maintenance Services) ("District"). This action impacts only the property owners identified below, not the general citizens or taxpayers of the City.

The City requires property owners of new development projects to mitigate the cost of certain impacts created by the proposed developments (e.g., the cost of operation and maintenance of public street lighting, landscape, and/or streets and drainage). The City created CFD No. 2014-01 to provide the development community with a funding mechanism to assist in satisfying the requirement. After a property owner elects to annex their property into the District and the City Council approves the annexation, a special tax can be levied on the annual property tax bill of the annexed parcels to fund the cost to provide the services.

The Property Owners, as defined below, have elected to annex the parcels of their project into the District to satisfy the condition. The Property Owners submitted a Landowner Petition approving the annexation and the City Clerk confirmed the Petition is valid.

#### **DISCUSSION**

As a condition of approval for the development projects identified below, the Property Owners are required to provide an ongoing funding source for certain public services (i.e., the operation and maintenance services of public street lighting, landscape, and/or streets and drainage), which are required to be installed as part of the development project. The table below provides information for the properties under development.

The City Council formed CFD No. 2014-01 (Maintenance Services) to provide an alternative funding tool for the development community. It provides a mechanism to fund the operation and maintenance of public street lighting services, landscaping, and streets and drainage. After a landowner approves annexation of their property into the District and the City Council approves the annexation, the City is authorized to levy a special tax onto the annual property tax bill to fund the services related to or impacted by their development.

The Third Amended and Restated Rate and Method of Apportionment of Special Tax ("RMA") for the District describes the different special tax rate areas, services provided, and formula to calculate the special tax rate for each of the tax rate areas. Several special tax rate areas were created to accommodate a variety of scenarios to ensure costs are fairly shared between property owners. For example, there is a tax rate area for "single-family residential street lighting" and one for "street lighting for property other than single-family residential" (e.g., commercial, industrial, or multi-family projects). Different tax rate areas are needed for street lighting because the spacing and size/type of lights differ based on the type of development. Likewise, there are several tax rate

areas for maintenance of public landscaping (i.e. medians, parkways, and/or traffic circles). A property owner's proportionate share of landscape maintenance costs will vary depending upon the total square footage of landscaping to be maintained and the number of properties sharing in the cost for that development. There is also a tax rate area for streets and drainage within single-family residential projects, which is calculated based on each parcel's proportionate share of the improvements.

On April 20, 2021, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 980, which designated the entire territory of the City as a future annexation area for the District. With the future annexation area designated, annexations can occur without an additional public hearing as long as the annexing landowner provides unanimous consent. Once annexed, parcels are subject to the annual special tax to fund the service they are receiving.

With the establishment of the District, a property owner now has two options to satisfy the conditions of approval:

- Submit a Landowner Petition unanimously approving annexation of the property into the District. Approval of the petition and special tax rate allows the City to annually levy the special tax on the property tax bill of the property. This option is only available if there are fewer than 12 registered voters living within the proposed annexation area; or
- 2. Establish a homeowner or property owner association to provide the ongoing operation and maintenance of the improvements.

The Property Owners elected to annex their property into CFD No. 2014-01 and have the special tax applied to the annual property tax bill. The Office of the Riverside County Registrar of Voters confirmed there were no registered voters residing at the property, allowing a special election of the landowner. Adoption of the attached resolutions (Attachments 1-6) amends the District and adds the properties to the tax rate area identified in the Fiscal Impact section of this report and directs the recordation of the boundary maps (Attachments 7-12) and amended notice of special tax lien for the amendments. The City Clerk received and reviewed the Landowner Petitions and confirmed the Property Owners unanimously approved the annexation of their property into the District (Attachments 13-18).

Successful completion of the annexation process satisfies the project's condition of approval to provide a funding source for the operation and maintenance of public street lighting and/or streets and drainage.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

1. Adopt the resolutions. Staff recommends this alternative as it will annex the properties into CFD No. 2014-01 at the request of the Property Owners and satisfy the condition of approval for the proposed developments.

- 2. Do not adopt the resolutions. Staff does not recommend this alternative as it is contrary to the request of the Property Owners, will not satisfy the condition of approval, and may delay development of the projects.
- 3. Do not adopt the resolutions but rather continue the item to a future regularly scheduled City Council meeting. Staff does not recommend this alternative as it will delay the Property Owners from satisfying the condition of approval and may delay development of the projects.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Revenue received from the special tax is restricted and can only be used to fund the services for each tax rate area within the District. The special tax can only be applied to a property tax bill of a parcel wherein the qualified electors (i.e., landowners or registered voters, depending upon the number of registered voters) have previously provided approval. The maximum special tax rates for the tax rate areas are detailed below. If the projected revenue from the maximum special tax exceeds what is necessary to fund the services within the tax rate area, a lower amount will be applied to the property tax bill for all the properties within the affected tax rate area.

The maximum special tax rate is subject to an annual inflation adjustment based on the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) or five percent (5%), whichever is greater. However, the annual adjustment cannot be applied unless the City Council annually authorizes such adjustment. The increase to the maximum special tax rate cannot exceed the annual inflationary adjustment without a two-thirds approval of the qualified electors within the affected tax rate area.

WHEREAS, by its Resolution No. 2014-25, the City Council established the City of Moreno Valley Community Facilities District No. 2014-01 (Maintenance Services) (the "CFD"), a citywide district, pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982 (Government Code Section 53311 et seq.) (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, by its Ordinance No. 874, the City Council authorized an annual special tax to be levied against all non-exempt parcels of real property within the CFD (the "Special Tax") to fund street lighting services and landscape maintenance services; and

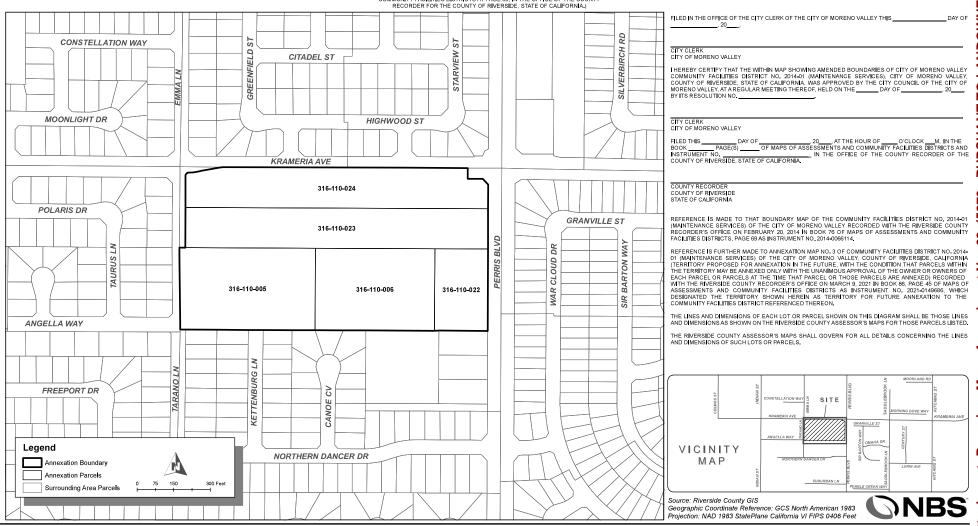

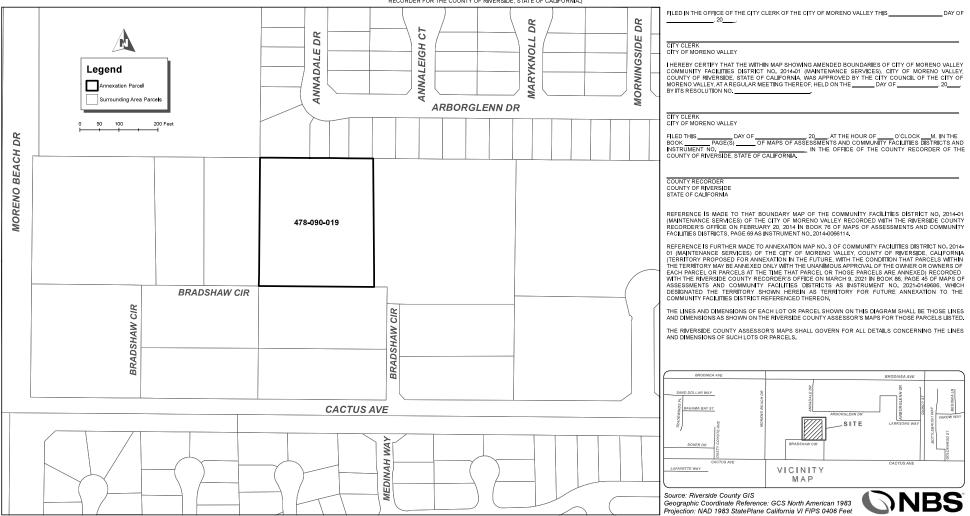

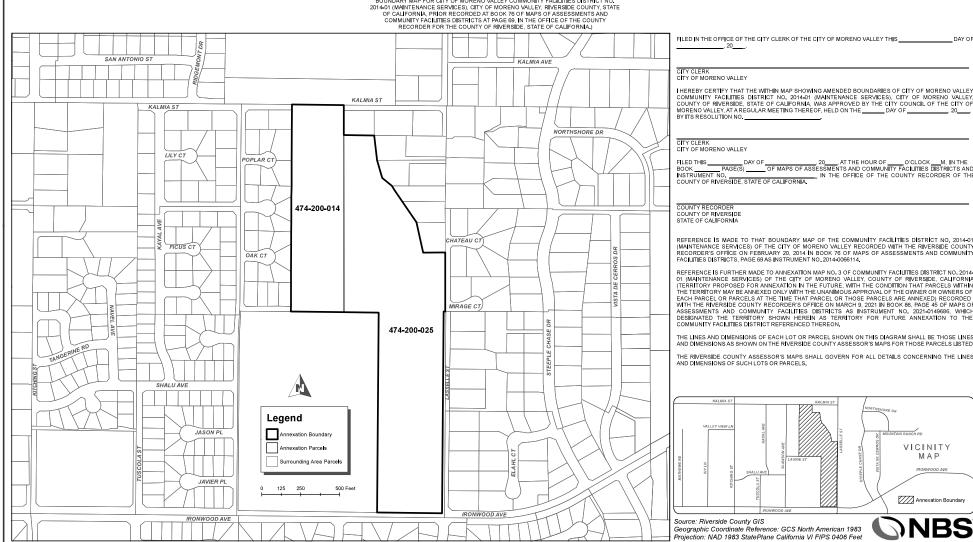

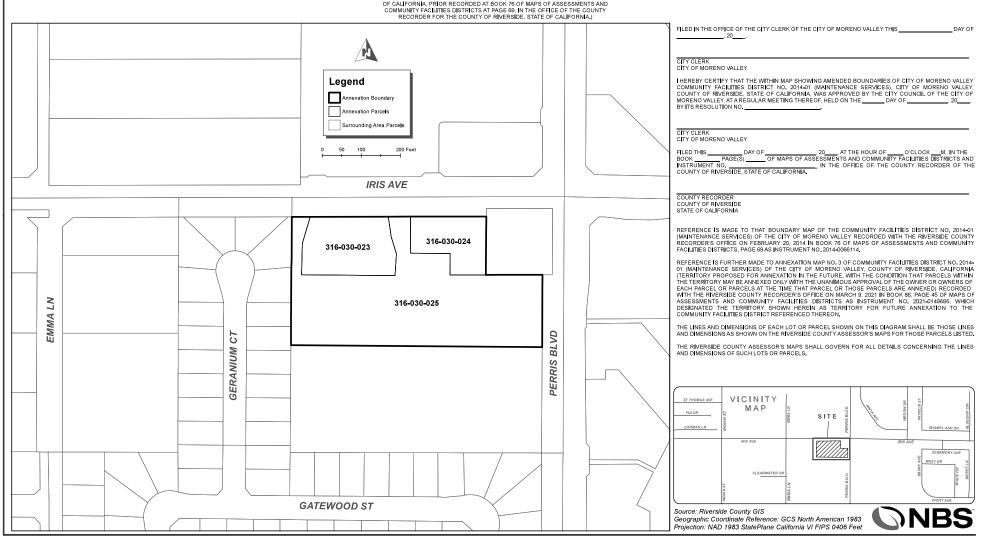

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

#### **Recommendation:**

Adopt Resolution No. 2022-xx, a Resolution Approving the Joint Community Facilities Agreement between the Moreno Valley Unified School District, City of Moreno Valley and KB Home Coastal Inc, in substantially the form attached hereto with modifications subject to City Attorney approval, and authorize the City Manager to execute the Agreement and related documents.

#### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends adopting a Resolution, which approves a Joint Community Facilities Agreement (JCFA) (Attachment 1). The JCFA is for the Moreno Valley Unified School District (MVUSD) Community Facilities District (CFD) 2022-1 and is between the City, MVUSD and KB Home Coastal Inc. ("Developer"). This action will provide the Developer with a financing option for the construction of City public infrastructure improvements and the payment of the City's Development Impact Fees (City Facilities) with bonds issued by MVUSD, acting as the legislative body of CFD 2022-1.

Acting on behalf of the CFD, MVUSD is responsible for formation and annual administration activities related to the District. The City is not a party to or liable for CFD 2022-1 or the debt issued by MVUSD. The City's role is limited to agreeing to allow the

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financing of certain City Facilities with bond proceeds and managing the activities related to implementation of the JCFA and compliance with its terms.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Developer plans to construct 104 single-family residential lots as part of Tract 33436. Tract 33436 is located north of Lasselle Street, east of Ironwood Ave. The Developer plans to construct 78 single-family residential lots as part of Tract 32408. Tract 32408 is located north of Bay Ave., east of Bethany Road. Boundary maps are included as Attachment 3. As part of the project's development requirements, the Developer is required to construct certain public infrastructure improvements and pay certain fees.

At the request of the Developer and pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982 (the "Act"), the MVUSD is forming CFD 2022-1, which includes those parcels of Tract 33436 and Tract 32408. Formation of the CFD allows the Developer to finance certain public infrastructure improvements and fees with the issuance of tax-exempt bonds. Tax-exempt bonds typically have lower interest rates than the rates associated with conventional financing methods and therefore, are a preferred financing method of the development community.

The Act requires approval of a JCFA if the financed improvements will be owned and operated by an agency (i.e. City) other than the agency forming the CFD. Exhibit C of the JCFA (Attachment 2) identifies the types of City Improvements and Development Impact Fees (City Facilities) that can be financed through the CFD. The JCFA requires the public improvements be constructed as if the City were constructing the improvements (e.g., subject to public bidding, prevailing wage, City insurance requirements, etc.) and as such, requires oversight by the City to ensure compliance. Costs associated with the City oversight will be the responsibility of the Developer.

The future bonds will be issued by MVUSD and secured by a special tax, which will be levied on the property tax bill of the properties included within the CFD for the term of the bonds (typically 25-30 years). With the special tax, the property tax rate of properties within the CFD is projected to be an average of 1.98% for Tract 33436 and 1.97% for Tract 32408 of the property value at the time the homes are originally sold. The average property tax rate for other new home developments within the City ranges from 1.95%-2.00%.

The City's Special District Financing Policy ("Policy") limits the property tax rate to 1.75% when the City, acting as the legislative body of a district, issues the bonds. However, the Policy is silent on the property tax rate when the City is not the legislative body of a CFD but rather a party to a JCFA.

As the legislative body of the CFD, MVUSD will be responsible for formation of the CFD, bond issuance and compliance, annual administration, levy of the special tax levy on the property tax roll of those parcels in the CFD, and responding to customer inquiries.

The City will have no responsibility for the CFD other than to ensure City Facilities paid with bond proceeds are used in compliance with the JCFA and the Act.

This action meets the Strategic Plan Priorities by providing the financial resources to manage and maximize Moreno Valley's public infrastructure to ensure an excellent quality of life.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Adopt the Resolution and related actions as recommended herein. Staff recommends this alternative to facilitate development of the property.
- 2. Do not adopt the Resolution. Staff does not recommend this alternative since it will not facilitate development of the property.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no fiscal impact to the City. City costs associated with preparation of the staff report and review of the JCFA are being funded by the Developer. The Developer will also pay an administration fee at the time of payment of the financed City Facilities to cover expenses related to administration of and compliance with the terms of the JCFA. The City is not party to nor liable for the formation or administration of the CFD or any bond issuance related to the CFD.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of Moreno Valley Unified School District (the "School District") is forming Moreno Valley Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 2022-1 (KB Home Coastal Inc) (the "CFD") pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, being Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Act") for the primary purpose of financing school facilities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 53316.2 of the Act, a community facilities district is authorized to finance facilities to be owned or operated by an entity other than the agency that created the community facilities district pursuant to a joint community facilities agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the School District and KB Home Coastal Inc, a California corporation (the "Property Owner"), the owner of the taxable property within the CFD, are considering the use of the CFD to finance various public facilities that will be constructed by the Property Owner and/or City and owned and operated by the City of Moreno Valley (the "City") and have requested the City to enter into a joint community facilities agreement that would permit the CFD to finance such facilities and payment of certain Development Impact Fees, the form of which is on file with the Secretary of this City Council and which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Joint Community Facilities Agreement");

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MORENO VALLEY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Recitals. The above recitals are all true and correct and are herein incorporated.
- 2. Joint Community Facilities Agreement Approved. Pursuant to Section 53316.2 of the Act, this City Council hereby approves the Joint Community Facilities Agreement substantially in the form as Exhibit A and on file with the City Clerk and determines that the Joint Community Facilities Agreement will be beneficial to the residents of the territory included within the jurisdictional boundaries of the CFD. THIS JOINT COMMUNITY FACILITIES AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into \_, 2022, by and among MORENO VALLEY UNIFIED effective as of the day of SCHOOL DISTRICT, a California School District ("School District"), the CITY OF MORENO VALLEY, a California general law city (the "City") and KB Home Coastal Inc., a California corporation ("Property Owner"). This Agreement relates to the formation by the School District of a community facilities district known as "Moreno Valley Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 2022-1" (the "CFD").

#### RECITALS:

- The property is within Tentative Tract Nos. 33436 and 32408 of the City ("Tracts 33436 and 32408") and is depicted in Exhibit "A" and described in Exhibit "B" hereto (the "Property"), which is located in the City of Moreno Valley, County of Riverside, State of California, and constitutes the land within the boundaries of the CFD.
- Property Owner owns the Property and intends to develop the Property for residential purposes.
- Property Owner petitioned the School District to form the CFD for the purpose of financing, among other things, the acquisition of various public facilities to be owned and operated by the City as described in Exhibit "C" hereto, which facilities will benefit the Property in whole or in part, and will be constructed by the Property Owner and acquired by the City (the "Facilities").
- Property Owner has yet to determine whether it will finance any or all of the Facilities with Bond Proceeds (defined below) that are available for such purpose. The Parties (defined below) hereto acknowledge that the purpose of this Agreement is to satisfy the requirements of the Act (defined below).
- E. In addition to the Facilities, certain facilities to be owned and operated by the School District (the "School Facilities") and certain facilities to be owned and operated by Eastern Municipal Water District ("EMWD Facilities") are also expected to be funded from Bond Proceeds. The construction, funding, and transfer of ownership of School Facilities and EMWD Facilities will be the subject of separate agreements.
- The School District will have sole discretion and responsibility for the formation and administration of the CFD.
- The School District is authorized by Section 53313.5 of the Act to assist in the financing of the acquisition and/or construction of the Facilities. This Agreement constitutes a joint

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community facilities agreement, within the meaning of Section 53316.2 of the Act, by and among the City, the Property Owner, and the School District, pursuant to which the CFD, when and if formed, will be authorized to finance the acquisition and/or construction of all or a portion of the Facilities. As authorized by Section 53316.6 of the Act, responsibility for constructing, providing for, and operating the Facilities is delegated to the City.

H. The Parties (defined below) hereto find and determine that the residents residing within the boundaries of the City, the School District, and the CFD will be benefited by the construction and/or acquisition of the School Facilities and Facilities and that this Agreement is beneficial to the interests of such residents.

#### AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Recitals. Each of the above recitals is incorporated herein and is true and correct.
- 2. <u>Definitions</u>. Unless the context clearly otherwise requires, the terms defined in this Section shall, for all purposes of this Agreement, have the meanings herein specified.
  - (a) "Facility(ies)" means the facilities described in Exhibit "C" hereto.
  - (b) "Act" means the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 53311) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the California Government Code.
  - (c) "Bond Proceeds" or "Proceeds of the Bonds" shall mean those net funds generated by the sale of the Bonds and investment earnings thereon, net of costs of issuance, reserve fund, capitalized interest and administrative expenses and may include net funds generated by the levy of Special Taxes and investment earnings thereon.
  - (d) "Bond Resolution" means that resolution, resolution supplement, fiscal agent agreement, indenture of trust or other equivalent document(s) providing for the issuance of the Bonds.
  - (e) "Bonds" shall mean those bonds, or other securities, issued by, or on behalf of, the CFD in one or more series, as authorized by the qualified electors within the CFD.
  - (f) "City Engineer Representative" means the project manager or engineer or engineers representing the City in the inspection and review of the Facilities, which may be employees of the City or outside consultants representing the City.
  - (g) "Other Facilities Account of the Improvement Fund" means the fund, account or sub-account of the CFD (regardless of its designation within the Bond Resolution) into which a portion of the Bond Proceeds may be deposited in accordance with the Bond Resolution to finance the Facilities and which may have subaccounts.
    - (h) "Party" or "Parties" shall mean any or all of the parties to this Agreement.

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- (i) PIA" shall mean the Public Improvements Agreement, by and between the City and the Property Owner, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit E.
- (j) "Payment Request" means a request for payment relating to Facilities in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "D".
- (k) "Rate and Method" means the Rate and Method of Apportionment of the Special Tax authorizing the levy and collection of Special Taxes pursuant to proceedings undertaken for the formation of the CFD pursuant to the Act.
- (l) "School Facilities" means those public improvements to be owned, operated, or maintained by the School District identified in proceedings to form the CFD that are eligible to be financed with Bond Proceeds.
- (m) "Special Taxes" means the special taxes authorized to be levied and collected within the CFD pursuant to the Rate and Method.
  - (n) "State" means the State of California.
- 3. <u>Formation of the CFD</u>. The School District has undertaken to analyze the appropriateness of forming the CFD to finance the Facilities and other facilities. The School District has and will retain, at the expense of Property Owner, the necessary consultants to analyze the formation of the CFD. In addition, the City has retained the necessary consultants to analyze the CFD and this Agreement, at the expense of Property Owner and the funds advanced by Property Owner to the City for such purpose shall be reimbursed from Bond Proceeds provided to City.
- 4. Sale of Bonds and Use of Bond Proceeds. In the event that the CFD is formed and Bonds are issued, the Board of Education of the School District acting as the legislative body of the CFD may, in its sole discretion, finance the Facilities by issuing one or more series of Bonds. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide a mechanism by which the CFD may issue the Bonds and levy Special Taxes to provide a source of funds to finance all or a portion of the Facilities. In the event that Bond Proceeds, including investment earnings thereon, are not available or sufficient to fully fund the Facilities, then Property Owner shall remain obligated to construct the Facilities in accordance with the City's conditions of approval for Tracts 33436 and 32408. The City and Property Owner shall enter into a PIA for all of the Facilities. All Facilities shall be constructed in accordance with the PIA and nothing in this Agreement shall amend, restate or supercede the requirements set forth in the PIA. The City and not the School District, shall be responsible for determining the Property Owner's compliance with the PIA and Section 6 below.

The Bonds shall be issued only if, in its sole discretion, the Board of Education of the School District determines that all requirements of State and federal law and all School District policies have been satisfied or have been waived by the School District. Nothing in this Agreement shall confer upon the City or any owner of the Property, including Property Owner, a right to compel the issuance of the Bonds or the disbursement of Bond Proceeds to fund the Facilities except in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

In connection with the issuance of any Bonds, the City agrees to execute and deliver a Certificate Concerning Use of Bond Proceeds ("City Certificate"), the form of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "F," in order for bond counsel to conclude that interest will be excluded from gross income

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under Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and any other provision of law. Each such City Certificate shall be provided by bond counsel prior to the pricing of the Bonds, and shall be executed by a duly authorized officer of the City within fifteen (15) calendar days of such receipt of each such City Certificate(s). Should the City fail to execute and deliver the applicable City Certificate within fifteen (15) calendar days, the School District may issue taxable Bonds to fund the Facilities and tax exempt Bonds to fund School Facilities.

5. Ownership of Facilities; Payment of Administrative Fees. The Facilities, once accepted and acquired by the City, shall be and remain the property of the City.

At the time of payment request, an administrative fee of \$400 per home will also be paid to defray the costs of the City to administer this Agreement and to ensure compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

- 6. <u>Requirements for Bidding and Construction of Facilities</u>. The requirements of this Section 6 shall apply only as between City and Property Owner. School District shall have no responsibility for review of, validity of or compliance with any duty or obligation contained in this Section 6. This Section 6 shall apply to any Facility for which a Payment Request is submitted to the City pursuant to this Section 6.
- (a) <u>Design Plans and Specifications</u>. All plans, specifications and bid documents for the Facility ("Plans") constructed or to be constructed by or on behalf of the Property Owner shall be prepared by the Property Owner at the Property Owner's initial expense, subject to approval by the City. Costs for preparation of the Plans shall be included in the acquisition price. Reimbursement of costs for plan revisions will be considered on a case by case basis, at the sole discretion of the City.
- (b) <u>Construction of Facilities</u>. A qualified engineering firm (the "**Field Engineer**") shall be employed by the Property Owner to provide all field engineering surveys determined to be necessary by the City's inspection personnel. Field Engineer shall promptly furnish to the City a complete set of grade sheets listing all locations, offsets, etc., in accordance with good engineering practices, and attendant data and reports resulting from Field Engineer's engineering surveys and/or proposed facility design changes. The City shall have the right, but not the obligation, to review, evaluate and analyze whether such results comply with applicable specifications.

A full-time soils testing firm, approved in writing by City, shall be employed by Property Owner to conduct soil compaction testing and certification. Property Owner shall promptly furnish results of all such compaction testing to City for its review, evaluation and decision as to compliance with applicable specifications. In the event the compaction is not in accordance or compliance with applicable specifications, Property Owner shall be fully liable and responsible therefore. A final report shall be required fully certifying all required compaction efforts prior to acceptance of each component of the Facilities.

The costs of all surveying, testing and reports associated with the Facility furnished and constructed by the Property Owner's contractor(s) shall be included in the acquisition price.

The City shall not be responsible for conducting any environmental, archaeological, biological, or cultural studies or any mitigation or permitting requirements that may be requested by appropriate Federal, State, and/or local agencies with respect to the Facility. Any such work

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shall be paid for and conducted by the Property Owner and included in the acquisition price of the Facility.

- (c) <u>City Public Works Requirements</u>. In order that the Facility may be properly and readily acquired by the City, the Property Owner shall comply with all of the following requirements with respect to the Facility, and the Property Owner shall provide such proof to the City as the City may reasonably require and at such intervals and in such form as the City may reasonably require, that the following requirements have been satisfied as to the Facility:
- (i) The Property Owner will prepare a bid package, using the City's standard public works documents, for review, comment and approval by the City Manager of the City or his designee (the "City Representative") in accordance with the City's requirements and the California Public Contracts Code.
- (ii) The Property Owner shall attempt to obtain at least three sealed bids for the construction of the Facility and submit to the City a listing of all responsive bids and their amounts, and the name or names of the contractor or contractors to whom the Property Owner proposes to award the contracts for such construction, which shall be the lowest responsible bidder. If the City Representative disapproves of any such contractor, the Property Owner shall select the next lowest responsible bidder from the competitive bids received who is acceptable to the City Representative.
- (iii) Property Owner shall make arrangements with City to schedule the bid opening, which is to be held at City offices, conducted by Property Owner and witnessed by City staff.
- (iv) The specifications and bid and contract documents shall require all contractors for the Facility to pay prevailing wages and to otherwise comply with applicable provisions of the Labor Code, the Government Code and the Public Contract Code relating to public works projects and as required by the procedures and standards of the City with respect to the construction of its public works projects.
- (v) All Contractors and its contractor and subcontractors shall be required to furnish labor and material payment bonds and contract performance bonds in accordance with the City requirements set forth in the PIA for the Facilities. All such bonds shall be in a form approved by the City Representative.
- (vi) All Contractors and its contractor and subcontractors shall be required to provide proof of insurance coverage throughout the term of the construction of the Facilities which they will construct in conformance with the approved Plans and in accordance with the PIA for such Facilities.
- (vii) The Property Owner shall provide proof to the City, at such intervals and in such form as the City Representative may require that the foregoing requirements have been satisfied as to all of the Facilities constructed by Property Owner, acquired by City and paid for with Bond Proceeds
- (viii) The Property Owner and all such contractors shall comply with such other requirements relating to the construction of the Facility which the City may impose by written notification delivered to the Property Owner and each such contractor at the time either prior to the receipt of bids by the Property Owner for the construction of such Facility or, to the extent required as

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a result of changes in applicable laws, during the progress of construction thereof. In accordance with Section 6(f), the Property Owner shall be deemed the awarding body and shall be solely responsible for compliance and enforcement of the provisions of the Labor Code, Government Code, and Public Contract Code.

- (ix) A "Change Order" is an order from the Property Owner to a contractor authorizing material change in the work to be performed. The Property Owner shall receive comments from the City Representative prior to the Property Owner's approval of any Change Order. The City Representative shall comment on or deny the Change Order request within ten (10) business days of receipt of all necessary information. The City's comments to a Change Order shall not be unreasonably delayed, conditioned or withheld. The Property Owner shall not be entitled to include in the acquisition price costs associated with a Change Order that have not been approved by the City Representative.
- (d) <u>Inspection; Completion of Construction</u>. The City shall regularly inspect the Facilities with a final inspection at the request of the Property Owner. Such inspection does not include inspection for compliance with safety requirements by the Property Owner's contractor(s). The City's personnel shall be granted access to each construction site at all reasonable times for the purpose of accomplishing such inspection. Upon satisfaction of the City's inspectors, the Property Owner shall notify the City in writing that the Facilities has been completed in accordance with the Plans. The Property Owner shall pay the City the estimated costs associated with the activities of the City Representative in administering its obligations with respect to this Agreement in advance at the request of the City.

The Property Owner shall request the City to perform a final inspection of the Facilities, prior to which such Facilities shall not be deemed complete. Within three (3) business days of receipt of written notification from the City inspectors that the Facility has been completed in accordance with the Plans, the City Representative shall notify the Property Owner in writing that such Facility has been satisfactorily completed. Upon receiving such notification, the Property Owner shall file a Notice of Completion with the County of Riverside Recorder's Office, pursuant to the provisions of Section 3093 of the Civil Code. The Property Owner shall furnish to the City a duplicate copy of each such Notice of Completion showing thereon the date of filing with the County of Riverside (the "County"). The City will in turn file a notice with the County for acceptance.

- (e) <u>Liens</u>. With respect to the Facility, upon the earlier of (i) receipt of all applicable lien releases, or (ii) expiration of the time for the recording of claim of liens as prescribed by Sections 3115 and 3116 of the Civil Code, the Property Owner shall provide to the City such evidence or proof as the City shall require that all persons, firms and corporations supplying work, labor, materials, supplies and equipment for the construction of the Facility have been paid, and that no claims of liens have been recorded by or on behalf of any such person, firm or corporation.
- (f) <u>Acquisition; Acquisition Price; Source of Funds</u>. The costs eligible to be included in the acquisition price of the Facility (the "**Actual Costs**") shall include:
- (i) The actual hard costs for the construction of such Facility as established by the applicable construction contracts and approved Change Orders, including costs of payment, performance and maintenance bonds and insurance costs, pursuant to this Agreement;

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- (ii) The design and engineering costs of such Facility including, without limitation, the costs incurred in preparing the Plans. Costs for plan revisions will be considered on a case by case basis:
- (iii) The costs of environmental evaluations and public agency permits and approvals attributable to the Facility;
- (iv) Costs incurred by the Property Owner for construction management and supervision of such Facility, not to exceed five percent (5%) of the actual construction cost;
- (v) Professional costs associated with the Facility such as engineering, inspection, construction staking, materials, testing and similar professional services; and
- (vi) Costs approved by the City of acquiring from an unrelated third party any real property or interests therein required for the Facility including, without limitation, temporary construction easements, temporary by-pass road and maintenance easements.

Provided the Property Owner has complied with the requirements of this Agreement, the City agrees to execute and submit to the School District a Payment Request for payment of the acquisition price of the completed Facility to the Property Owner or its designee within thirty (30) days after the Property Owner's satisfaction of the preconditions to such payment stated herein.

As a condition to the City's execution of the Payment Request for the acquisition price, the property ownership of the completed Facility shall be transferred to the City by grant deed, bill of sale or such other documentation as the City may require free and clear of all taxes, liens, encumbrances, and assessments, but subject to any exceptions determined by the City to not interfere with the actual or intended use of the land or interest therein (including the lien of a community facilities district so long as the subject property is exempt from taxation or is otherwise not taxable by such community facilities district). Upon the transfer of property ownership of the Facility or any portion thereof to the City, the City shall be responsible for the maintenance of such Facility may be paid prior to transfer of property ownership and acceptance of the Facility if it is substantially completed at the time of payment. The Facility shall be considered "substantially complete" when it has been reasonably determined by the City to be usable, subject to final completion of "punch list" items still required to be completed based solely upon approval of the City's inspectors.

For purposes of determining the acquisition price to be paid by the CFD for the acquisition of each Facility by the City, the value of such Facility shall include the construction costs specified in the construction contracts and the City-approved change orders conforming to this Section 6, as hereinbefore specified. However, if the City reasonably determines that the Actual Costs are excessive and that the value of the Facility is less than the total amount of such Actual Costs, the price to be paid for the acquisition of the Facility shall be the value thereof as determined by the City Engineer Representative, subject, however, to the Property Owner's right to appeal to the City Council.

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Upon completion of the construction of a Facility, the Property Owner shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the City a Payment Request in substantially the form of Exhibit "D," attached hereto, copies of the contract(s) with the contractor(s) who have constructed the Facility and other relevant documentation with regard to the payments made to such contractor(s) and each of them for the construction of the Facility, documentation evidencing payment of prevailing wages, and shall also provide to the City invoices and purchase orders with respect to all equipment, materials and labor purchased for the construction of the Facility. The City shall require the City Representative to complete its determination of the acquisition price of the Facility as promptly as is reasonably possible.

Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Section 6, the source of funds for the acquisition of the Facility or any portion thereof shall be funds on deposit in the Other Facilities Account of the Improvement Fund. If no such funds are available, the City shall not be required to acquire the Facility from the Property Owner. In such event, the Property Owner shall complete the design and construction and offer to the City property ownership of such portions of the Facility as are required to be constructed by the Property Owner as a condition to recordation of subdivision maps for the Property, but need not construct any portion of the Facility which it is not so required to construct.

- (g) <u>Easements and/or Fee Title Property Ownership Deeds</u>. The Property Owner shall, at the time the City acquires the Facility as provided in Section 7(f) hereof, grant or cause to be granted to the City, by appropriate instruments prescribed by the City, all easements across private property and/or fee title property ownership deeds which may be reasonably necessary for the proper operation and maintenance of such Facility, or any part thereof.
- (h) <u>Permits</u>. The Property Owner shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary construction permits and encroachment permits from the City covering construction and installation of the Facility.
- (i) <u>Maintenance</u>. Prior to the transfer of property ownership of a Facility by the Property Owner to the City, as provided in Section 6(f) hereof, the Property Owner shall be responsible for the maintenance thereof and shall require its contractor(s) to repair all facilities damaged by any party, prior to acceptance by the City and/or make corrections determined to be necessary by the City's inspection personnel.
- (j) <u>Inspection of Records</u>. The City shall have the right to review all books and records of the Property Owner pertaining to the costs and expenses incurred by the Property Owner for the design and construction of the Facility during normal business hours by making arrangements with the Property Owner. The Property Owner shall have the right to review all books and records of pertaining to costs and expenses incurred by the City for services of the City Representative by making arrangements with the City and paying the City the City's estimated costs for such services in advance.
- (k) <u>Property Ownership of Improvements</u>. Notwithstanding the fact that some or all of the Facility may be constructed in dedicated street rights-of-way or on property which has been or will be dedicated to the City, each Facility shall be and remain the property of the Property Owner until acquired by the City as provided in this Agreement.
- (l) <u>Independent Contractor</u>. In performing this Agreement with respect to the Facilities, the Property Owner is an independent contractor and not the agent of the City. The City shall not have any responsibility for payment to any contractor, subcontractor or supplier of the Property Owner. It

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is not intended by the Parties that this Agreement create a partnership or joint venture among them and this Agreement shall not otherwise be construed.

(m) <u>Insurance Requirements.</u> Neither the Property Owner nor its contractor shall commence work on a Facility under this Agreement prior to obtaining all insurance required by the PIA for such Facility with a company or companies acceptable to the City, nor shall the Property Owner's contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on its subcontract until all insurance required of the subcontractor has been obtained.

The Property Owner shall, during the life of this Agreement, notify the City in writing of any incident giving rise to any potential bodily injury or property damage claim and any resultant settlements, whether in conjunction with this or any other project which may affect the limits of the required coverage, as soon as is reasonable and practical.

#### Indemnification.

- (a) Indemnification by the School District. The School District shall assume the defense of, indemnify and save harmless, the City and its respective officers, employees, and agents, and each and every one of them, from and against all actions, damages, claims, losses, or expenses of every type and description to which they may be subjected or put, by reason of, or resulting from, any act or omission of the School District with respect to its performance under this Agreement and the issuance of the Bonds; provided, however, that the School District shall not be required to indemnify any person or entity as to damages resulting from negligence or willful misconduct of such person or entity or their officers, agents, or employees.
- (b) Indemnification by Property Owner. Property Owner shall assume the defense of, indemnify and save harmless, the School District, the CFD, and the City, their respective officers, employees, and agents, and each and every one of them, from and against all actions, damages, claims, losses, or expenses of every type and description to which they may be subjected or put, by reason of, or resulting from, any act or omission of Property Owner with respect to this Agreement; provided, however, that Property Owner shall not be required to indemnify any person or entity as to damages resulting from willful misconduct of such person or entity or their officers, agents, or employees.
- (c) Indemnification by the City. The City shall assume the defense of, indemnify and save harmless, the School District, the CFD and their respective officers, employees, and agents, and each and every one of them, from and against all actions, damages, claims, losses, or expenses of every type and description to which they may be subjected or put, by reason of, or resulting from, any act or omission of the City with respect to this Agreement, and the design, engineering, and construction of the Facilities acquired by the City; provided, however, that the City shall not be required to indemnify any person or entity as to damages resulting from negligence or willful misconduct of such person or entity or their officers, agents, or employees. In addition to the obligations set forth in Section 7(b) above, Property Owner shall indemnify the City, their respective officers, employees, and agents, and each and every one of them, from and against all actions, damages, claims, losses, or expenses of every type as a result of the City indemnifying the School District and/or the CFD under this Section 7(c).

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- 8. <u>Allocation of Special Taxes</u>. The Board of Education of the School District, as the legislative body of the CFD, shall annually levy the Special Tax as provided for in the formation proceedings of the CFD. The entire amount of any Special Tax levied by the CFD to repay Bonds, or to fund other obligations, shall be allocated to the CFD.
- 9. <u>Amendment and Assignment</u>. This Agreement may be amended at any time but only in writing signed by each Party hereto. This Agreement may be assigned, in whole or in part, by Property Owner to the purchaser of any parcel of land within the Property provided, however, such assignment shall not be effective unless and until the City and the School District have been notified, in writing, of such assignment and the assignment specifies whether the Property Owner or such assignee is authorized to execute Payment Requests.
- 10. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the matters provided for herein and supersedes all prior agreements and negotiations between the Parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, payment, or instrument required or permitted by this Agreement to be given or delivered to either Party shall be deemed to have been received when personally delivered or seventy-two hours following deposit of the same in any United States Post Office in California, registered or certified, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

Each such notice, statement, demand, consent, approval, authorization, offer, designation, request or other communication hereunder shall be deemed delivered to the party to whom it is addressed (a) if personally served or delivered, upon delivery, (b) if given by electronic communication, whether by telex, telegram or telecopier upon the sender's receipt of written acknowledgement from the addressee, (c) if given by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, deposited with the United States mail postage prepaid, 72 hours after such notice is deposited with the United States mail, (d) if given by overnight courier, with courier charges prepaid, 24 hours after delivery to said overnight courier, or (e) if given by any other means, upon delivery at the address specified in this Section.

- Exhibits. All exhibits attached hereto are incorporated into this Agreement by reference.
- 13. <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. Except as set forth in Section 7, each party shall be responsible for its own attorney fees' and costs.
- 14. <u>Interpretation in the event of Ambiguities or Disputes</u>. The Parties acknowledge and agree that each has been given the opportunity to review this Agreement with legal counsel independently, and/or has the requisite experience and sophistication to understand, interpret, and agree to the particular language of the provisions hereof. In the event of an ambiguity in or dispute regarding the interpretation of same, the interpretation of this Agreement shall not be resolved by any rule of interpretation providing for interpretation against the Party who causes the uncertainty to exist or against the drafter.
- 15. <u>Severability</u>. If any part of this Agreement is held to be illegal or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Agreement shall be given effect to the fullest extent reasonably possible.
- 16. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement and any dispute arising hereunder shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 17. <u>Waiver</u>. Failure by a Party to insist upon the strict performance of any of the provisions of this Agreement by any other Party hereto, or the failure by a Party to exercise its rights upon the default of any other Party, shall not constitute a waiver of such Party's right to insist and demand strict compliance by such other Party with the terms of this Agreement thereafter.
- 18. No Third Party Beneficiaries. No person or entity other than the CFD, when and if formed, shall be deemed to be a third party beneficiary hereof, and nothing in this Agreement (either express or implied) is intended to confer upon any person or entity, other than the City, the School District, the CFD, and Property Owner (and their respective successors and assigns, exclusive of individual homebuyers), any rights, remedies, obligations, or liabilities under or by reason of this Agreement.
- 19. <u>Singular and Plural; Gender</u>. As used herein, the singular of any word includes the plural, and terms in the masculine gender shall include the feminine.
- 20. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute but one instrument.

The facilities listed above are representative of the types of facilities eligible to be financed by the CFD as Acquisition Facilities. All capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the meanings given such terms in the Joint Community Facilities Agreement by and between the Moreno Valley Unified School District ("School District"), the City, and KB Home Coastal Inc., dated , 20 ("JCFA").

I further certify on behalf of the City that:

- 1. City is a city formed and operating pursuant to California law.
- City has been informed by the School District and CFD No. 2022-1 that they are in the process of issuing the Bonds on behalf of CFD No. 2022-1.
- City is informed that a portion of the net Bond proceeds are being allocated in order to finance the costs of certain facilities to be owned and operated by the City, as further described in Attachment "1" attached herein.
- 4. The financing of the City Facilities is in satisfaction of the requirements of the City to provide services to the property within the boundaries of CFD No. 2022-1.
- 5. The City represents that the City Facilities financed with proceeds of the Bonds will not be used for any activity that constitutes a trade or business that is carried on by persons or entities, other than governmental entities ("Private Use"). The leasing of the City Facilities or the access of a person or entity other than a governmental unit to the City Facilities or services provided thereby on a basis other than as a member of the general public ("General Public Use") shall constitute a Private Use unless the City obtains an opinion of bond counsel to the contrary. Use of the City Facilities in a trade or business constitutes General Public Use only if the property is intended to be available and is in fact reasonably available for use on the same basis by natural persons not engaged in a trade or business.
- 6. With respect to management and service contracts, the determination of whether a particular use of the City Facilities constitutes Private Use shall be determined on the basis of applying Revenue Procedure 2017-13. The City represents that, as of the date hereof, no portion of the City Facilities is expected to be subject to contracts or other arrangements with persons or entities engaged in a trade or business (other than

governmental units) that involve the management of property or the provision of services that do not comply with the standards of Revenue Procedure 2017-13.

This Certificate may be relied upon by the School District, CFD No. 2022-1, and bond counsel in reaching its terms of confirmation of the tax-exempt status of the Bonds.

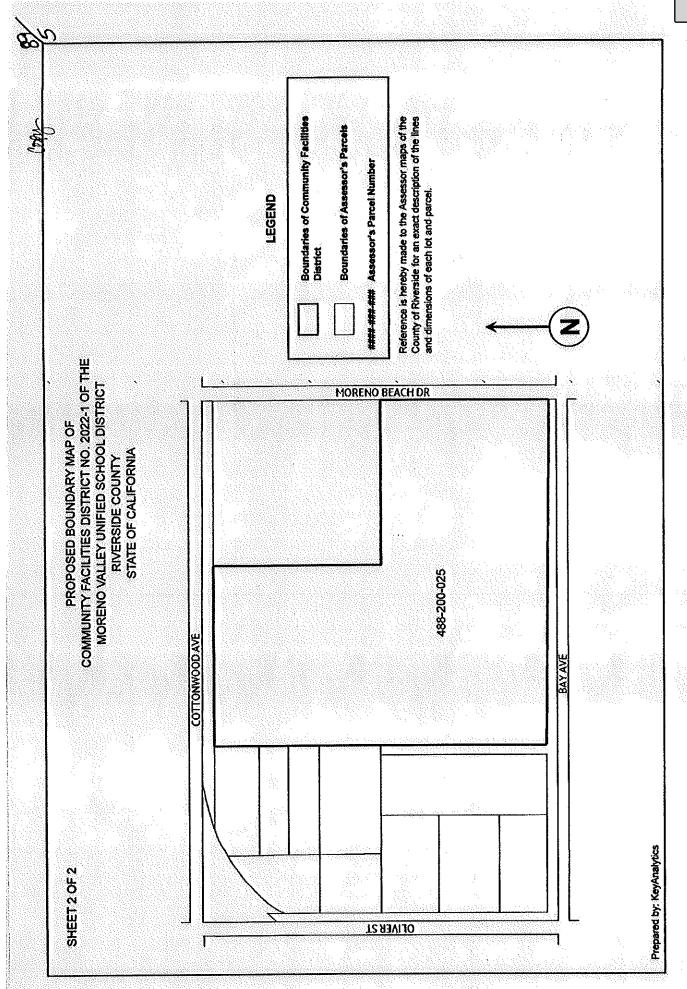

# **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

#### **Recommendation:**

 Approve Resolution No. 2022-XX, acknowledging the receive and file report submitted by the Moreno Valley Fire Department Fire Chief, regarding the inspection of certain occupancies requiring annual inspections in such occupancies pursuant to sections 13145, 13146 and 17921 of the California Health and Safety Code.

# **SUMMARY**

Senate Bill (SB) 1205 was approved on September 27, 2018, requiring the Fire Department to provide an annual report to the City Council regarding the completion of State-Mandated Annual Inspections per California Health and Safety Codes 13146.2 and 13146.3.

In accordance with California Health and Safety Codes 13145, 13146, and 17921, the Moreno Valley Fire Department, inspects all state-mandated structures, each year, for compliance with fire and life safety standards, as well as other regulations, as set forth by the State Fire Marshal. These state-mandated structures include apartments, hotels, lodging homes, motels, public or private schools, and certain residential care facilities annually.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The California Health and Safety Codes 13145, 13146, and 17921 mandate City and County Fire Departments, to enforce fire and life safety standards, adopted by the State Fire Marshal. Since 2010, the City of Moreno Valley has seen the benefits of an annual,

comprehensive inspection program, as well as an increased level of safety, at these types of facilities.

In accordance with the City of Moreno Valley's adopted fee schedule, inspection fees are charged as set forth, by the California Health and Safety Codes 13146.2 and 13146.3. The Moreno Valley Fire Department inspects various buildings, identified as state-mandated structures, consisting of apartments, hotels, lodging homes, motels, public or private schools, and certain residential care facilities for compliance with fire and life safety standards.

The Moreno Valley Fire Department ensures compliance of these facilities, by scheduling inspections with property managers and/or owners, during each facility's assigned inspection month. The Moreno Valley Fire Department is mandated by the state of California to complete inspections at 344 facilities and/or complexes for FY 2021/2022; 100% of which have been completed. The 344 inspected facilities and/or complexes equates to a total of 1,137 individual buildings inspected required per SB 1205 annual inspections for FY 2021/2022. A copy of the SB 1205 Annual Report is attached to Resolution No. 2022-XX as Exhibit A.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- Approve Resolution No. 2022-XX, acknowledging the receive and file report submitted by the Moreno Valley Fire Department Fire Chief, regarding the inspection of certain occupancies requiring annual inspections in such occupancies pursuant to sections 13145, 13146 and 17921 of the California Health and Safety Code. Staff recommends this alternative in order to complete the process as mandated by SB 1205.
- 2. Do Not Approve Resolution No. 2022-XX, acknowledging the receive and file report submitted by the Moreno Valley Fire Department Fire Chief, regarding the inspection of certain occupancies requiring annual inspections in such occupancies pursuant to sections 13145, 13146 and 17921 of the California Health and Safety Code. Staff does not recommend this alternative as not approving the Resolution does not allow for the completion of the process mandated by SB 1205.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

There is no cost to the City of Moreno Valley for approval of Resolution 2022-XX. The City of Moreno Valley will request reimbursement of incurred costs, if the State of California identifies this specific statute has imposed State-Mandated Costs. The reimbursement of a State-Mandated Cost is legislated by Senate Bill 90 and is managed by the Financial & Management Services Department.

#### Senate Bill No. 1205

#### **CHAPTER 854**

An act to add Section 13146.4 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to fire protection.

[Approved by Governor September 27, 2018. Filed with Secretary of State September 27, 2018.]

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1205, Hill. Fire protection services: inspections: compliance reporting. Existing law requires the chief of any city or county fire department or district providing fire protection services and his or her authorized representatives to inspect every building used as a public or private school within his or her jurisdiction, for the purpose of enforcing specified building standards, not less than once each year, as provided. Existing law requires every city or county fire department or district providing fire protection services that is required to enforce specified building standards to annually inspect certain structures, including hotels, motels, lodging houses, and apartment houses, for compliance with building standards, as provided.

This bill would require every city or county fire department, city and county fire department, or district required to perform the above-described inspections to report annually to its administering authority, as defined, on the department's or district's compliance with the above-described inspection requirements, as provided. The bill would require the administering authority to acknowledge receipt of the report in a resolution or a similar formal document. To the extent this bill would expand the responsibility of a local agency, the bill would create a state-mandated local program.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 13146.4 is added to the Health and Safety Code, to read:

13146.4. (a) Every city or county fire department, city and county fire department, or district required to perform an annual inspection pursuant

to Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 shall report annually to its administering authority on its compliance with Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3.

- (b) The report made pursuant to subdivision (a) shall occur when the administering authority discusses its annual budget, or at another time determined by the administering authority.
- (c) The administering authority shall acknowledge receipt of the report made pursuant to subdivision (a) in a resolution or a similar formal document.
- (d) For purposes of this section, "administering authority" means a city council, county board of supervisors, or district board, as the case may be.
- SEC. 2. If the Commission on State Mandates determines that this act contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

- 3. Authorize an increase to Purchase Order 2022-755 with HR Green Pacific Inc. from a not-to-exceed amount of \$100,000 to a not-to-exceed amount of \$600,000 using existing funds already approved in the Public Works Operating Budget.

#### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends approval of an amendment to the agreement with HR Green Pacific, Inc. for staff support services related to the review of development applications on behalf of the Transportation Engineering Division, under the supervision of that Division's manager. The amendment will allow services to continue through June 2024.

#### DISCUSSION

The City has contracted for professional services to meet its development review obligations in multiple divisions, as doing so allows effort to be tailored to workload. The development review obligation for the Transportation Engineering Division remains high along with the other engineering-oriented assignments for the Divisions. As such, and in order to not delay development projects, consultant assistance is necessary.

In 2021, the Transportation Engineering Division solicited firms to submit proposals for Transportation Planning services, including development review. HR Green Pacific Inc. (HR Green) was selected on the basis of their qualifications to perform the required work.

In February 2022, HR Green was awarded a contract up to \$100,000 to provide development review services for the Transportation Engineering Division under the terms of their agreement. Since that time, HR Green has successfully completed all assigned reviews.

The recommended actions will allow HR Green to continue to review development applications through June 2024.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Approve the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. Staff recommends this alternative in order to fulfill the City's obligations to developers and deliver high-quality development projects in a timely manner.
- 2. Do not approve the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. Staff does not recommend this alternative, as it would result in extended development application review times and potentially impact review quality.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The proposed First Amendment includes a \$500,000 increase in compensation for review services, which are recovered through fees collected on development applications. The existing Public Works Operating Budget has sufficient funds. There is no net impact to the General Fund.

- Adopt Resolution No. 2022-XX. A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Moreno Valley, California, Ordering the Summary Vacation of a Public Drainage Easement Located Within Private Property Abutting Krameria Avenue Approximately 600' East of Lasselle Street.
- 2. Direct the City Clerk to certify said resolution and transmit a copy of the resolution to the office of the County Recorder for recordation.

### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends adoption of Resolution No. 2022-XX, ordering the summary vacation of a public drainage easement which was originally dedicated per Parcel Map 22701. The public drainage easement is located within private property abutting Krameria Avenue approximately 600 feet east of Lasselle Street (Attachment 1).

#### **DISCUSSION**

The public drainage easement dedicated on Parcel Map 22701 in Parcel Map Book 159, Pages 3 to 14, official records of Riverside County, is no longer beneficial to the public as the 24-inch cast in place storm drainpipe constructed within the easement is no longer in use. The current, underlying landowner has received City approval to develop the land and is requesting the vacation of the existing public drainage

easement which encumbers his property. The proposed development will construct a drainage system that does not drain to the abandoned storm drain lateral.

The City Council's approval of a summary vacation for this public drainage easement will abandon the City's rights for public use purposes and facilitate development of the site. Vacation of the public drainage easement, as shown in the exhibit attached to the proposed resolution (Attachment 2), is in accordance with the Streets and Highways Code. The provisions of Chapter 4, Part 3, of Division 9 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California, designated "Summary Vacation", allows the City to summarily vacate said easement if certain conditions are met. This request meets those conditions since the public drainage easement has not been used for flood control and drainage purposes for a period greater than five years and the public drainage easement has been superseded by relocation and there are no other public facilities located with the public drainage easement.

# **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Approve and authorize the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. Staff recommends this alternative as it will allow the underlying landowner to develop without an unnecessary encumbrance.
- 2. Do not approve and authorize the recommended actions as presented in this staff report. Staff does not recommend this alternative as the public drainage easement, which is no longer required, will encumber the landowner's property.

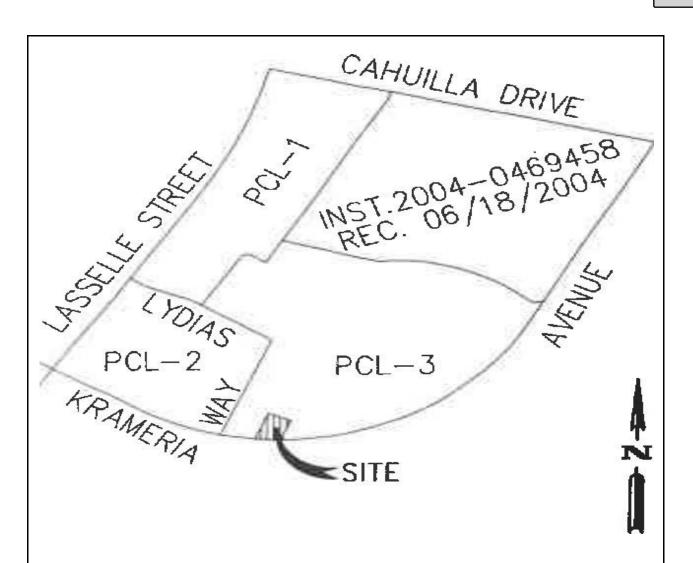

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-XX**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MORENO VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, ORDERING THE SUMMARY VACATION OF A PUBLIC DRAINAGE EASEMENT LOCATED WITHIN PRIVATE PROPERTY ABUTTING KRAMERIA AVENUE APPROXIMATELY 600' EAST OF LASSELLE STREET

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Moreno Valley, California, acquired a public drainage easement located within private property abutting Krameria Avenue approximately 600 feet east of Lasselle Street shown on Parcel Map 22701 in Parcel Map Book 159, Pages 3 to 14, official records of Riverside County; and

WHEREAS, a 24-inch cast in place storm drainpipe constructed within the easement is no longer in use and the public drainage easement has not been used for the purpose for which it was dedicated or acquired for five consecutive years immediately preceding the proposed summary vacation; and

WHEREAS, the public drainage easement has been superseded by relocation and there are no other public facilities located within the easement.

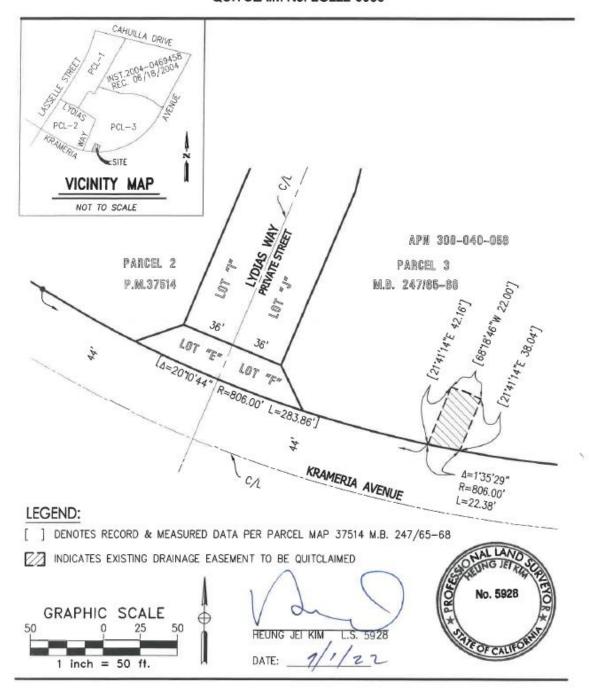

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

#### **Recommendations:**

- 1. Award the Bid to G&W Electric Company, the lowest responsible bidder, for the purchase of 3-Way and 4-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears; and
- 2. Authorize the issuance of a Purchase Order to G&W Electric Company for \$336,718 (including \$9,416 for shipping and \$23,541 for taxes) plus a 10% contingency of \$33,672 for a total of \$370,390.
- 3. Authorize the City Manager to amend the scope of work and budget if necessary, upon approval of the City Attorney.

#### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends award of bid for solid dielectric switchgear to replace existing SF6 insulated switchgear along Day Street, North of Alessandro Blvd. The project includes the purchase of three (3) 3-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears and two (2) 4-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears. The project is funded with Moreno Valley Utility (MVU) operating funds and has been approved in the 2022/2023 Capital Improvement Plan. The total cost is \$370,390 including a 10% contingency.

# **DISCUSSION**

The California Air Resources Board (CARB) recently passed regulatory amendments to phase out the use of SF6 as an insulating medium for electrical equipment starting in 2025. These will likely restrict MVU from purchasing the same SF6 insulated

switchgears that it has used in the past for underground vault applications and will require the use of new solutions. CARB has also established limits in 2020 for the amount of SF6 discharge allowed. The 3-Way and 4-Way solid dielectric vacuum switchgears proposed will serve as effective replacements for the SF6 insulated switchgear that MVU has used historically, and will be installed along Day St. as part of the electric distribution system to provide service to new and existing customers.

The Request for Quotes (RFQ) was prepared and placed on PlanetBids, the City's online bidding portal, from June 02, 2022 through June 29, 2022. All RFQ Addendums, Questions and Answers were posted on PlanetBids.

# 3-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears

The following bids were received for the three (3) 3-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears segment of the RFQ. G&W Electric Company, OneSource Supply Solutions, and Anixter all responded to the RFQ. G&W responded with a quote for their own G&W product, while OneSource Supply Solutions provided quotes for both ABB and Eaton products, and Anixter provided a quote for an Eaton product as well. The bid from G&W Electric Company was found to be the lowest bidder. The total price quoted for three (3) 3-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears from each bidder are shown below.

The following bids were received for the two (2) 4-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears segment of the RFQ. G&W Electric Company, OneSource Supply Solutions, and Anixter all responded to the RFQ. G&W responded with a quote for their own G&W product, while OneSource Supply Solutions provided quotes for both ABB and Eaton products, and Anixter provided a quote for an Eaton product as well. The bid from G&W Electric Company was found to be the lowest bidder. The total price quoted for two (2) 4-Way Solid Dielectric Vacuum Switchgears from each bidder are shown below.

Therefore, G&W Electric Company was deemed to be the lowest responsible bidder, and staff is recommending that the City issue a Purchase Order to G&W Electric Company for \$336,718 (includes \$9,416 shipping and \$23,541 for taxes) plus a 10% contingency for a total of \$370,390.

#### MATERIALS. WORKMANSHIP AND DESIGN

All equipment and materials added will be new, of the highest quality, clean and properly assembled, finished, or aligned and design will be in accordance with latest applicable industry standards and City specifications. All work will be performed and completed in a thorough, professional manner by persons skilled in their various trades. All materials furnished and all work done must be satisfactory to the City, and in accordance with this RFQ. Any defects or failures to so comply will be corrected at Vendor's expense.

#### TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

This RFQ provides electrical and mechanical requirements for a 15kV, three phase, solid dielectric vacuum switchgear for submersible vault mounted applications. The switchgear system will be installed on underground main line feeders of a 12,000 volt, four-wire, grounded wye distribution system for sectionalizing three-phase, main line, 600 ampere rated feeders.

The switchgear will be installed inside vaults subject to water intrusion and shall be suitable for submersible operation.

The number of vacuum switch positions will be stated in the bid document and are shown on the attachments to this RFQ

#### CONFORMANCE

Only switches which have been approved by MVU are acceptable.

Manufacturers requesting approval of switches shall submit a written request for approval to MVU. The request shall include a description of the switches for which approval is requested, supplementary data and Certified Test Reports, and the completed "Switch Manufacturer's Questionnaire" included in E13a Appendix A of the Specification.

#### **Deviation and Non-Conformance**

MVU shall be notified in writing of any proposed or actual deviation from the requirements of this RFQ before switches are shipped to MVU.

Any deviations from this RFQ must be approved in writing by MVU prior to acceptance of the switches.

#### Rejection

Non-conformance to any of the requirements of this RFQ shall be reason for rejection, non-payment and/or liquidated damages.

#### Certification of Ratings

The switch shall have 3-phase ganged operated load break switched positions as required.

#### **Switch Construction**

The switch shall be a dead-front design. The operating mechanism housing shall be stainless steel SAE 304 grade with a viewing window for verification of contact position. Operating handles shall be padlock able and adaptable to key lock schemes and shall be rope-rig capable. The operating shaft shall be stainless steel providing maximum corrosion resistance. A double "O" ring shaft seal shall be used for a leak resistant, long-life seal.

The solid dielectric module must be coated with a semi-conductive layer of epoxy, providing a completely dead front device. The semi-conductive layer must be tested to IEEE 592 to ensure it can carry fault current to ground to ensure operator safety.

The switch shall be designed for long-term operation in the harshest environments. The switch shall provide a visible break that is tested to 95kVBIL

All switch positions shall be equipped with an integral blade type disconnect switch incorporated within the solid dielectric module to provide a true visible break. The Visible Break switch shall provide a clear three-phase visible break of the circuit. The visible break must be easily seen through a viewing window molded as an integral part of each solid dielectric module.

The switch shall interrupt all load currents within the vacuum bottle.

The switch mechanism shall consist of three vacuum bottle assemblies mechanically linked to a single spring-assisted operating mechanism. Manual opening and closing of the switch shall be via an operating handle.

#### LOAD INTERRUPTER SECTIONALIZING SWITCHES

The three-phase, gang-operated vacuum load interrupter switch shall have the specified 20kA fault closing rating which defines the ability to close the switch against a three-phase fault with symmetrical, asymmetrical, and peak current in at least one phase equal to the rated value, with the switch remaining operable and able to carry and interrupt rated current.

The vacuum load interrupter switch shall be provided with visible open isolation point device operating that is in series with the vacuum load interrupter contacts and readily visible through the viewing window to eliminate the need for cable handling and exposure to high voltage to establish a visible gap.

The open gaps of the switch shall be sized to allow cable testing through a feed-thru bushing or the back of the elbow.

#### OPERATING MECHANISM

Load-interrupter switches shall be operated by means of a quick-make, quick-break mechanism.

The manual handle shall charge the operating mechanism for opening, closing, of the switches. The manual handle shall be able to operate a switch position. The handle should also have a ring welded at the end to make its operation possible from outside the vault by hot stick or by rope operation. Handle drawing shall be submitted to MVU for review and approval.

Operating handles shall be pad-lockable in any position to prevent operation.

The operating mechanism shall indicate the vacuum contacts position, which shall be clearly visible from the normal operating position. Flag in viewing window shall be visible for verification of mechanical position.

No fluids or gases other than air should be used in the visible gap chamber.

All 600A positions/ways shall be load interrupter.

#### **BUSHING**

Switchgear electrical entrances shall be 600-Ampere apparatus bushing for the load interrupter switch positions.

Bushings and bushing wells shall include semi-conductive coating and shall be mounted on such a way the coating is solidly grounded to the tank.

All bushings shall be x-rayed to insure there are no voids that could result in leaks over the life of the switchgear.

Bushings and bushing wells shall be equipped with protective shipping caps.

Bushing and bushing wells shall be installed with minimum 5 inch spacing.

#### SWITCHGEAR ACCESSORIES

The switchgear shall be equipped with the following accessories:

Means for lifting tank/enclosure shall be provided for each switch.

Means for adding legs to the switchgear, when installed in vaults with no platforms

#### **NAMEPLATE**

The following information shall be clearly shown on engraved stainless-steel equipment nameplate visible from the top of the tank.

- Date of manufacture
- Continuous ampere rating
- Load break ampere rating (symmetrical)

- o BIL rating
- o Total weight

- An engraved stainless steel bushing nameplate shall be welded next to each bushing, showing bushing designation.

The following optional equipment will not be required with this RFQ. However, the equipment should be adaptable to install the following options

#### **OPTIONAL**

Communication, RTU, and Voltage Sensor Indicators

For each switch, the following equipment shall be provided, installed, and wired by the supplier:

When specified on the bid documents for radio control, one MDS Orbit ECR 900 MHz Ethernet transceiver radio, 1 Serial port, and a Standard port. Order Code ECRU91NNNNNS1S1USUNNN and a Laird Technologies Yagi Antenna part # Y8966. The antenna shall be installed typically on a street light pole adjacent to the submersible switch location via Coaxial cable in a 1" conduit with the option of being removable. This will permit MVU to remove the antenna and install it at another location if required for radio communications.

The switch shall be supplied with three 15 kV class line voltage sensors on each remote operable position which shall provide individual phase voltages for each switch position.

Motorized Switch Operator for Remote Operation

Motorized operators for remote-supervisory control shall be provided to operate the switches as noted in the online.

Motorized operators shall charge and trip the associated switch in response to a remote-control signal.

Open-Close push buttons shall be provided on the control panel for local electrical operation of the switch.

Motorized operators shall be operated either remotely or locally.

The switch status Open-Close shall be locally and remotely indicated when manually or electrically operated.

Motorized operators shall be provided with a decoupling feature to allow operation of the motor operator without affecting the position of the switch.

The term "motorized operator" is defined as the complete switch accessory, with two-way communication, which shall provide remote indication of the open or closed switch positions, voltage magnitudes, faulted circuit indicators status, major alarm and minor alarm as specified herein.

Motor and DC Sources

The motor operating voltage is 24 VDC supplied by a NiCad battery.

A 24 VDC voltage source shall be provided for the operation of the radio, the RTU and other electronic equipment.

A complete charging system for both 24VDC provided and powered by a 120/240 single phase 3 wire source provided by MVU.

Motor Operator Controller for Above Ground Installation

The motor operator enclosure shall provide sufficient room to house the RTU, radios and media converter.

A separate enclosure for electronic equipment, installed next to the motor operator enclosure, is acceptable. The control cabinet shall be IP68 rated for vault switches.

The above ground Underground Automated Distribution (UAD) Controller and Motor Mechanism pedestal enclosure is rated NEMA 4. with 14 gauge stainless steel welded construction. The door shall be gasketed to limit the entrance of dust, water, and humidity.

The enclosure of the pad mounted UAD is painted with a Munsell 7.0GY3.29/1.5 green finish.

The UAD may be operated remotely by SCADA or locally via a selector switch on the front panel of above ground controllers. Auto-transfer functions must be available if specified.

#### **UAD Handheld Control Pendant**

A handheld control pendant is provided for local electrical operation of the switch.

Standard features of the control pendant include:

- Non-metallic submersible enclosure with padlock able door and stainless steel hanging bracket.
- o Stainless steel hanging bracket.
- o 25 ft. long cable
- Watertight cable connection
- Momentary open/close switch position
- Open and close switch position indicating lights.

For fiber optic connectivity option use the following Corning parts:

- Corning Single-Panel Wall-mounted Housing (SPH). 5.30"x6.25"x1.5"), part number: SPH-01P
- Corning closet connector housing pigtail panel (single mode fiber UPC), part number: CCH-CP12-3CP03RH
- $\circ$  Corning closet connector housing pigtail panel (multimode fiber 62.5  $\mu m),$  part number: CCH-CP12-56P03RH

#### **TESTS**

Manufacturer shall perform production tests required by ANSI/IEEE to check the quality and uniformity of the workmanship and materials used in the manufacture of switches. The switchgear shall meet the requirements of the following ANSI production tests:

- Circuit Resistance Test
- o 60 HZ Withstand Test
- Leak Test
- Operating Assurance Test

#### **TRAINING**

As a separate item, Switchgear Manufacturer shall include two days of on-hand personnel training as part of their proposal. These two days of training shall be scheduled as follows. The first training shall be for eight hours at the City of Moreno Valley Corporate Yard, 15670 Perris Blvd, Moreno Valley, CA, 92551 for line crew, troubleshooters, and test technicians. The second day of training will be at the site and the manufacturer engineer will train the operation, setting and testing of the switch at the final, job site location of the switch.

The two-day training will be a one-time training per switchgear design, as required by the City of Moreno Valley.

# MANUFACTURE DATA

Each Bidder shall submit the following data along with the electronic quote.

- 1. Manufacturer / Model / Supplier. A copy of the manufacturer's published specifications shall be included in the quote package.
- 2. Warranty shall be stated in years, months, or operation hours.
- 3. Bidder must submit with their quote, manufacturer specifications on the proposed materials. The manufacturer specifications/brochures must identify the items quote and other required data as outlined herein.
- 4. When applicable, all operating specifications are based on current OSHA standards and shall be the basis for determining compliance with specific requirements. All dimensions shall be in accordance with Occupational Safety and Health Administration standards and the American with Disabilities Act (ADA).

# **LAWS**

Bidders shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, City and City laws, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the bidding and performance of the contract(s).

# **PAYMENT POLICY**

The City shall not pay for any services, supplies, materials, or equipment in advance of receipt of such services, supplies, materials, or equipment. No orders shall be placed by the City, or invoices received by a vendor, prior to a purchase order being issued; an invoice cannot be dated prior to the purchase order date.

Fig. 1 4-600A One-Line Diagram

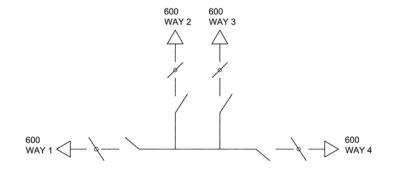
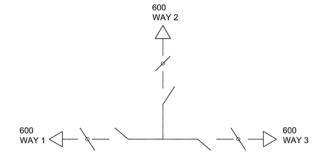


Fig. 2 3-600A One-Line Diagram

#### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends approval of the parcel map for finance and conveyance purposes for PEN21-0162 (Parcel Map 38209), which is owned by Mr. Peter Weaver. Parcel Map 38209 will subdivide one (1) parcel into two (2) parcels and is located at the southeast corner of Redlands Boulevard and Kalmia Avenue.

#### DISCUSSION

On December 9, 2021, the Planning Commission of the City of Moreno Valley approved PEN21-0162 (TPM 38209), an 11.5 gross acre tentative parcel map for finance and conveyance purposes. The developer is proposing to divide the overall tentative parcel map into two parcels. Parcel 1, a 1.92-acre lot is located at the southeast corner of Redlands Boulevard and Kalmia Avenue, and parcel 2, a 9.58-acre lot is located southeast of parcel 1. Parcel 1 and Parcel 2 each contain an existing a dwelling unit. The owner desires that each dwelling unit be on its own parcel.

Parcel Map 38209 is an 11.5-acre, two-parcel, parcel map proposed for finance and conveyance purposes. Therefore, no right-of-way dedications or improvements are required. Any right-of-way dedications and improvements required at the time development is proposed would be through a separate planning application process. Due to the size of the map, it is not attached to this report. However, the map is available for review at the Public Works/Land Development counter at City Hall.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL**

The Planning Commission at the public hearing on December 9, 2021, found that Tentative Parcel Map 38209 (PEN21-0162) is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under CEQA Guidelines Section 15061.b.3 as the proposed project qualifies as an activity that is covered by the commonsense exemption that CEQA applies only to projects, which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment; in such cases, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

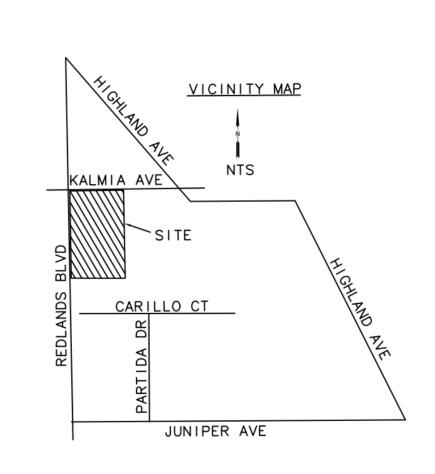

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

#### Recommendations:

- 1. Approve the Cooperative Agreement with the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (the District), the City of Moreno Valley, and Beazer Homes, LLC (Developer), for the Sunnymead MDP line M-2, Stage 3.
- 2. Authorize the City Manager to execute the Cooperative Agreement, and any amendments contingent upon approval of the City Attorney.
- 3. Direct the City Clerk to forward the signed Cooperative Agreement to the District.

### **SUMMARY**

This report recommends approval of the Cooperative Agreement between the District, the City, and Beazer Homes, LLC to allow for the construction of storm drain facilities. As a condition of approval for PEN20-0063 (TR 37909), an 81 single-family residential lot development, the City requires the developer to construct certain public improvements in order to provide flood protection and drainage as a result of the developer's planned development. The Cooperative Agreement (Attachment 2) is the District's mechanism by which the District, the City, and the Developer coordinate the construction and maintenance of master storm drain facilities.

### **DISCUSSION**

On February 2, 2021, the City Council of the City of Moreno Valley approved Tentative Tract Map 37909. The project is for the construction of 81 single-family residential lots on approximately 10.8 acres. The project site is located south of Iris Avenue, east of Perris Boulevard. (Attachment 1). The required facility for this project includes the construction of a 48-inch reinforced concrete pipe of approximately 722 lineal feet. The District's maintenance responsibility shall be this 48-inch reinforced concrete pipe which connects their storm drain at the downstream end.

The Developer will be responsible for the design and construction of the project improvements. The Developer will prepare plans and specifications in accordance with the District's and the City's standards and submit improvement plans to the District and the City for review and approval. The City and the District have different responsibilities as identified in the Cooperative Agreement including those pertaining to maintenance and operation. The City will review the plans and specifications, provide inspection for the construction, and accept responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the City's drainage facilities, limited to storm drain laterals and catch basins, if the developer meets all requirements of the agreement. The District will review the plans and specifications, provide inspection for the construction, and accept ownership and responsibility for the maintenance of the District's drainage facilities, if the developer meets all requirements of the agreement.

Prior to the construction of the facility or recordation of the final map, whichever occurs first, the Developer will be required to submit bonds for the improvements and execute an Agreement for Public Improvements, as approved by the Public Works Director/City Engineer for PEN20-0063. The Agreement will include a Faithful Performance bond and Material and Labor bond for both the District's drainage facility and the City's drainage facility. The storm drain portion of the bonds will be held by the City until completion of the storm drain and acceptance of the storm drain improvements by the City and the District.

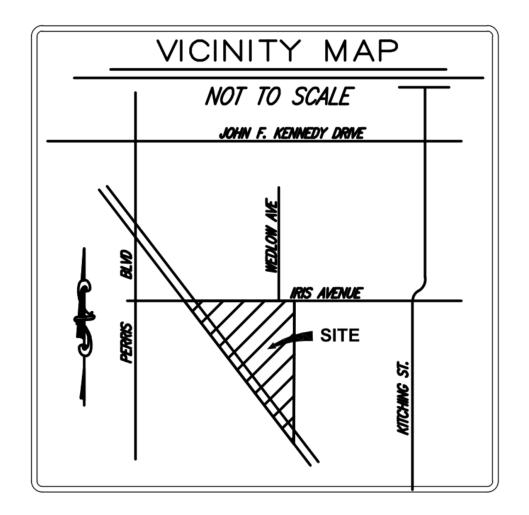

Sunnymead MDP - Line M-2, Stage 3 Project No. 4-0-00686 Tract Map No. 37909

#### **RECITALS**

- A. DEVELOPER is the legal owner of record of certain real property located within the City of Moreno Valley and has submitted for approval Tract Map No. 37909 related to the property. The legal description of the property related to Tract Map No. 37909 is provided in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof; and
- B. DEVELOPER has submitted for approval Tract Map No. 37909, related to the property, which is located in the City of Moreno Valley. As a condition of approval for Tract Map No. 37909, DEVELOPER must construct certain flood control facilities in order to provide flood protection and drainage for DEVELOPER's planned development; and
- C. The required flood control facilities and drainage improvements related to Tract Map No. 37909 are identified in DISTRICT's Sunnymead Master Drainage Plan ("MDP"), as shown on DISTRICT's Drawing No. 4-1209 and shown in concept on Exhibit "B", attached hereto and made a part hereof, and includes the construction of:
  - i. Sunnymead MDP LINE M-2, Stage 3 ("LINE M-2 STAGE 3") consisting of approximately 722 lineal feet of 48-inch reinforced

- concrete pipe, as shown in "blue" on Exhibit "B". At the downstream terminus, LINE M-2 STAGE 3 will connect to the DISTRICT's Sunnymead MDP Line M-2 facility (DISTRICT's Drawing No. 4-0385). At its upstream terminus, LINE M-2 STAGE 3 ends with concrete bulkhead for future extension; and
- ii. All safety devices requested by DISTRICT staff during the course of project construction and during any final field inspections, including, but not limited to, concrete pads, slope protection barriers, signage and fencing ("SAFETY DEVICES"). SAFETY DEVICES shall be purchased and installed by DEVELOPER's contractor and are subject to DISTRICT's inspection and approval.
- iii. Together, LINE M-2 STAGE 3, and SAFETY DEVICES are hereinafter called "DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES"; and
- D. Associated with the construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are the construction of various catch basins, curbs and gutters, connector pipes, and certain lateral storm drains that are thirty-six inches (36") or less in diameter within CITY's right of way, hereinafter called "CITY FACILITIES"; and
- E. Together, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and CITY FACILITIES are hereinafter called "PROJECT"; and
- F. Tract Map No. 37909 is located within Sunnymead Area Drainage Plan ("SUNNYMEAD ADP"). The SUNNYMEAD ADP fee obligation for Tract Map No. 37909 ("SUNNYMEAD ADP OBLIGATION") shall be calculated in accordance with the "Rules and Regulations for Administration of Sunnymead Area Drainage Plans", adopted dated September 16, 1980, and as amended ("RULES"); and

- G. LINE M-2 STAGE 3 is an identified segment of SUNNYMEAD ADP ("SUNNYMEAD ADP FACILITY"); and
- H. Pursuant to the RULES and the provisions of this Agreement, if DISTRICT estimates that upon constructing LINE M-2 STAGE 3, DEVELOPER would earn SUNNYMEAD ADP fee credit ("SUNNYMEAD ADP CREDIT") for constructing the SUNNYMEAD ADP FACILITY, SUNNYMEAD ADP CREDIT may be used to satisfy the SUNNYMEAD ADP fee obligation for future development for properties located within the boundaries of the SUNNYMEAD ADP, hereinafter called "ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES"; and
- I. DEVELOPER and DISTRICT desire CITY to accept ownership and the responsibility for the operation and maintenance of CITY FACILITIES; and
- J. DEVELOPER and CITY desire DISTRICT to accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES; and
- K. DISTRICT is willing to accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES provided DEVELOPER performs all of the following: (a) complies with this Agreement, (b) prepares PROJECT plans in accordance with DISTRICT and CITY approved plans and specifications and this Agreement, (c) constructs PROJECT in accordance with DISTRICT and CITY approved plans and specifications, (d) accepts ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of PROJECT following completion of PROJECT construction until such time as DISTRICT accepts ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and CITY accepts ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of CITY FACILITIES.
- L. CITY is willing to (i) review and approve, in conjunction with DISTRICT, DEVELOPER's plans and specifications for PROJECT, (ii) accept and hold faithful performance

and payment bonds submitted by DEVELOPER on behalf of DISTRICT for DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and CITY for CITY FACILITIES, (iii) inspect the construction of PROJECT, (iv) grant DISTRICT the right to inspect, operate and maintain DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES within CITY rights of way, and (v) accept ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of CITY FACILITIES, provided PROJECT is constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by DISTRICT and CITY.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the preceding recitals and the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the Parties hereto mutually agree that the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated into the terms of this Agreement and as follows:

### **SECTION I**

#### **DEVELOPER** shall:

- 1. Prepare PROJECT plans and specifications, hereinafter called "IMPROVEMENT PLANS", in accordance with applicable DISTRICT and CITY standards, and submit to DISTRICT and CITY for their respective review and approval.
- 2. Continue to pay DISTRICT, within thirty (30) days after receipt of periodic billings from DISTRICT, any and all such amounts as are deemed reasonably necessary by DISTRICT to cover DISTRICT's costs associated with (i) the review and approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, (ii) the processing and administration of this Agreement and (iii) construction inspection costs. Additionally, DEVELOPER shall pay CITY, within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of periodic billings from CITY, any and all such amounts as are deemed reasonably necessary by CITY to cover CITY's costs associated with (i) the review and approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, (ii) the review and approval of rights of way and conveyance documents, (iii) the processing and administration of this Agreement and (iv) construction inspection costs.

- 3. By execution of this Agreement, grant DISTRICT and CITY, the right to enter upon DEVELOPER's property where necessary and convenient for the purpose of gaining access to and performing inspection services for the construction of PROJECT, as set forth herein.
- 4. Upon execution of this Agreement, or not less than twenty (20) calendar days prior to recordation of the final map for Tract Map No. 37909 or any phase thereof, whichever occurs first, provide CITY with faithful performance and payment bonds in accordance with CITY's municipal code or ordinance, including any amendments thereto, for the estimated cost for construction of (i) DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as determined by DISTRICT, and (ii) of CITY FACILITIES as determined by CITY. The surety, amount and form of the bonds, shall list CITY as an oblige and shall be subject to approval of DISTRICT (Attention: Contract Services Section) and CITY. The bonds shall remain in full force and effect until DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are accepted by DISTRICT and CITY FACILITIES are accepted by CITY as complete. Both bonds shall be subscribed by an Admitted Surety Insurer, which is authorized to transact surety insurance business in the State of California with a policy holder's rating of A or higher and a Financial Class of VII or larger. Should any bond or surety become insufficient, DEVELOPER shall furnish a new bond within ten (10) calendar days after receiving notice from CITY.
- 5. Upon DISTRICT and CITY's approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, deposit with DISTRICT (Attention: Business Office Accounts Receivable), and notify Contract Services Section, the estimated cost of providing construction inspection for DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, in an amount as determined and approved by DISTRICT in accordance with CITY's municipal code or ordinance, including any amendments thereto, based upon the bonded value of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES.

- 6. Upon DISTRICT's and CITY's approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, furnish DISTRICT (Attention: Contract Services Section), with a complete list of all contractors and subcontractors to be performing work on PROJECT, including the corresponding license number and license classification of each. At such time, DEVELOPER shall further identify in writing its designated superintendent for PROJECT construction.
- 7. Upon DISTRICT and CITY's approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, furnish DISTRICT (Attention: Contract Services Section), with a construction schedule which shall show the order and dates in which DEVELOPER or DEVELOPER's contractor proposes to carry out the various parts of work, including estimated start and completion dates. As construction of PROJECT progresses, DEVELOPER shall update said construction schedule as requested by DISTRICT.
- 8. Upon DISTRICT and CITY's approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, furnish DISTRICT (Attention: Contract Services Section), with a confined space entry procedure specific to PROJECT. The procedure shall comply with requirements contained in California Code of Regulations, Title 8, Section 5158, Other Confined Space Operations; Section 5157, Permit Required Confined Space; and District Confined Space Procedures, SOM-18. The procedure shall be reviewed and approved by DISTRICT prior to the issuance of a Notice to Proceed, which shall be given by DISTRICT to DEVELOPER upon DISTRICT's and CITY's approval.
- 9. Upon DISTRICT and CITY's approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, an original certificate of insurance evidencing the required insurance coverage shall be provided to DISTRICT. At minimum, the procured insurance coverages should adhere to DISTRICT's required insurance provided in Exhibit "C", attached hereto and made a part hereof. DEVELOPER shall not commence operations until DISTRICT (Attention: Contract Services Section) and CITY

have been furnished with original certificate(s) of insurance and original certified copies of endorsements and, if requested, certified original policies of insurance including all endorsements and any and all other attachments. Failure to maintain the insurance required by this paragraph shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement and shall authorize and constitute authority for DISTRICT, at its sole discretion, to provide written notice to DEVELOPER that DISTRICT is unable to perform its obligations hereunder, nor to accept responsibility for ownership, operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES due, either in whole or in part, to said breach of this Agreement.

- 10. Upon DISTRICT and CITY's approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, or not less than twenty (20) calendar days prior to recordation of the final map for Tract Map No. 37909 or any phase thereof, whichever occurs first, furnish DISTRICT (Attention: Plan Check Section) and CITY with sufficient evidence of DEVELOPER having secured such necessary licenses, agreements, permits, approvals, rights of way, rights of entry and temporary construction easements, as may be needed for the construction, inspection, operation and maintenance of PROJECT as determined and approved by DISTRICT and CITY.
  - 11. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
  - 12. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
- 13. Furnish DISTRICT (Attention: Plan Check Section) and CITY each with a set of final mylar plans PROJECT plans and assign their ownership to DISTRICT and CITY respectively prior to the start on any portion of PROJECT construction.
- 14. After receiving DISTRICT's plan check and administrative clearance for PROJECT construction, as set forth in Sections I.4 through I.13., notify DISTRICT (Attention: Construction Management Section) and CITY with twenty (20) calendar days written notice of intent to start of construction of PROJECT, and include PROJECT's geotechnical firm, concrete

lab/test firm, D-Load test forms, trench shoring/false work calculations and concrete mix designs for DISTRICT's review and approval. Construction shall not begin on any element of PROJECT, for any reason whatsoever, until DISTRICT and CITY have issued to DEVELOPER a written Notice to Proceed authorizing DEVELOPER to commence construction of PROJECT. DISTRICT reserves the right to withhold issuance of the Notice to Proceed in accordance with Section IV.3.

- 15. Prior to commencing construction, obtain, at its sole cost and expense, and furnish DISTRICT (Attention: Plan Check Section) and CITY with copies of all permits, approvals or agreements required by any federal, state, or local resource and/or regulatory agency for the construction, operation and maintenance of PROJECT. Such documents include, but are not limited to, those issued by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, California Regional Water Quality Control Board, California State Department of Fish and Wildlife, State Water Resources Control Board and Western Riverside County Regional Conservation Authority ("REGULATORY PERMITS").
- 16. Not permit any change to or modification of DISTRICT and CITY approved IMPROVEMENT PLANS without the prior written permission and consent of DISTRICT and CITY.
- 17. Comply with all Cal/OSHA safety regulations, including, but not limited to, regulations concerning confined space and maintain a safe working environment for DEVELOPER, DISTRICT and CITY employees on the site.
- 18. Upon receipt of DISTRICT's written Notice to Proceed, construct or cause to be constructed PROJECT at DEVELOPER's sole cost and expense, in accordance with DISTRICT and CITY approved IMPROVEMENT PLANS.
- 19. Within two (2) weeks of completing PROJECT construction, provide DISTRICT (Attention: Construction Management Section) and CITY with written notice that

PROJECT construction is substantially complete and requesting that DISTRICT conduct a final inspection of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and CITY conduct a final inspection of PROJECT.

- 20. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
- 21. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
- 22. Upon completion of PROJECT construction, accept ownership, sole responsibility and all liability whatsoever for the operation and maintenance of PROJECT until such time as (i) DISTRICT accepts ownership and responsibility for operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES; and (ii) CITY accepts ownership and responsibility for operation and maintenance of CITY FACILITIES. If, subsequent to the inspection and, in the sole discretion of DISTRICT, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES is not in an acceptable condition, corrections shall be made at sole expense of DEVELOPER.
- 23. Upon completion of PROJECT construction but prior to DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES for ownership, operation and maintenance, provide or cause its civil engineer of record or construction civil engineer of record, duly registered in the State of California, to provide DISTRICT (Attention: Construction Management Section), with (i) soil compaction report(s) stamped and wet signed by the geotechnical engineer, (ii) concrete testing report(s) stamped and wet signed by the civil engineer of record and (iii) a redlined "record drawings" copy of IMPROVEMENT PLANS. After DISTRICT approval of the redlined "record drawings", DEVELOPER's engineer shall schedule with DISTRICT a time to transfer the redlined changes onto DISTRICT's original mylars at DISTRICT's office; after which, the engineer shall review, stamp and sign the original IMPROVEMENT PLANS as "record drawings".

- 24. Ensure that all work performed pursuant to this Agreement by DEVELOPER, its agents or contractors is done in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, all applicable provisions of the Labor Code, Business and Professions Code, and Water Code. DEVELOPER shall be solely responsible for all costs associated with compliance with applicable laws and regulations.
- 25. Pay, if suit is brought upon this Agreement or any bond guaranteeing the completion of PROJECT, all costs and reasonable expenses and fees, including reasonable attorneys' fees, and acknowledge that, upon entry of judgment, all such costs, expenses and fees shall be computed as costs and included in any judgment rendered.

### **SECTION II**

#### **DISTRICT** shall:

- Review IMPROVEMENT PLANS and approve when DISTRICT has determined that such plans meet DISTRICT standards and are found acceptable to DISTRICT prior to the start of PROJECT construction.
- 2. Provide CITY an opportunity to review and approve IMPROVEMENT PLANS prior to DISTRICT's final approval.
- 3. Upon execution of this Agreement, record or cause to be recorded a copy of this Agreement in the Official Records of the Riverside County Recorder.
  - 4. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
- 5. Endeavor to issue DEVELOPER a Notice to Proceed with twenty (20) calendar days of receipt of DEVELOPER's complete written notice of intent to start of construction of PROJECT as set forth in Section I.14.; however, DISTRICT's construction inspection staff is limited and, therefore, the issuance of a Notice to Proceed is subject to staff availability.

- 6. Reserves the right to withhold issuance of the Notice to Proceed pursuant to Section IV.3.
  - 7. Inspect construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES.
- 8. Keep an accurate accounting and submit periodic invoices to DEVELOPER of all DISTRICT costs associated with the (i) review and approval of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, and (ii) processing and administration of this Agreement.
- 9. Keep an accurate accounting of all DISTRICT construction inspection costs and within forty-five (45) calendar days after DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as being complete, submit a final cost statement to DEVELOPER. If the deposit as set forth in Section I.5. exceeds such inspection costs, DISTRICT shall reimburse DEVELOPER the excess amount within sixty (60) calendar days after DISTRICT's acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as being complete.
- 10. Upon (i) DISTRICT acceptance of PROJECT construction as being complete and (ii) DISTRICT receipt of stamped and signed "record drawing" of IMPROVEMENT PLANS as set forth in Section I.23, provide DEVELOPER with a reproducible duplicate copy of "record drawings" of IMPROVEMENT PLANS.
- 11. Prior to DISTRICT acceptance of ownership and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES shall be in a satisfactorily maintained condition as solely determined by DISTRICT. If, subsequent to any inspection and in the sole discretion of DISTRICT, DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are not in an acceptable condition, corrections shall be made at sole expense of DEVELOPER.
- 12. Accept ownership and sole responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES upon (i) DISTRICT inspection of DISTRICT

DRAINAGE FACILITIES in accordance with Section I.19., (ii) DISTRICT acceptance of PROJECT construction as being complete, (iii) DISTRICT receipt of stamped and signed "record drawings" of IMPROVEMENT PLANS as set forth in Section I.23., (iv) DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are fully functioning as a flood control drainage system as solely determined by DISTRICT and (vi) DISTRICT's sole determination that DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are in a satisfactorily maintained condition.

13. Upon (i) DISTRICT acceptance of PROJECT construction as being complete and (ii) DISTRICT receipt of stamped and signed "record drawing" of IMPROVEMENT PLANS, as set forth in Section I.23., provide CITY with (i) a reproducible duplicate copy of "record drawings" of constructed DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES, (ii) a written notice that PROJECT is complete, and (iii) request CITY release bonds held for DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES and CITY FACILITIES.

#### **SECTION III**

#### CITY shall:

- 1. Review IMPROVEMENT PLANS and approve when CITY has determined that such plans meet CITY standards and are found acceptable to CITY prior to the start of PROJECT construction. CITY shall not request any modifications on the IMPROVEMENT PLANS without prior DISTRICT approval.
- 2. Accept CITY and DISTRICT approved faithful performance and payment bonds submitted by DEVELOPER, in accordance with the CITY's municipal code or ordinance, including any amendments thereto, for the estimated cost for construction of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES as determined by DISTRICT and of CITY FACILITIES as determined by CITY and hold said bonds as provided in this Agreement. The surety, amount and form of the bonds, shall list CITY as an obligee and shall be subject to approval of DISTRICT (Attention:

Contract Services Section) and CITY. The bonds shall remain in full force and effect until DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are accepted by DISTRICT and CITY FACILITIES are accepted by CITY as complete. Both bonds shall be subscribed by an Admitted Surety Insurer, which is authorized to transact surety insurance business in the State of California with a policy holder's rating of A or higher and a Financial Class of VII or larger. Should any bond or surety become insufficient, DEVELOPER shall furnish a new bond within ten (10) calendar days after receiving notice from CITY. CITY shall not release said bonds until DISTRICT provides CITY with a reproducible duplicate copy of "record drawings" and written notification that the PROJECT is complete, as set forth in Section II.13.

- 3. Request DEVELOPER to update the construction schedule, as deemed necessary.
- Grant DISTRICT, by execution of this Agreement, the right to inspect,
   operate and maintain DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES within CITY rights of way.
  - 5. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
  - 6. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
  - 7. Inspect PROJECT construction.
  - 8. [INTENTIONALLY DELETED]
- 9. Accept ownership and sole responsibility for the operation and maintenance of CITY FACILITIES upon (i) DISTRICT acceptance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES for ownership, operation and maintenance, ii) CITY's final inspection of CITY FACILITIES, and (iii) CITY's sole determination that CITY FACILITIES are in a satisfactorily maintained condition.
- Release occupancy permits in accordance with the approved Conditions of Approval for Tract Map No. 37909.

11. Upon DISTRICT and CITY acceptance of PROJECT construction as being complete, accept sole responsibility for the adjustment of all PROJECT manhole rings and covers located within CITY rights of way which must be performed at such time(s) that the finished grade along and above the underground portions of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES are improved, repaired, replaced or changed. It being further understood and agreed that any such adjustments shall be performed at no cost to DISTRICT.

#### **SECTION IV**

It is further mutually agreed:

- 1. All construction work involved with PROJECT shall be inspected by DEVELOPER, DISTRICT and CITY but shall not be deemed complete until DISTRICT and CITY mutually agree in writing that construction of PROJECT is completed in accordance with DISTRICT and CITY approved IMPROVEMENT PLANS.
- 2. DISTRICT and CITY personnel may observe and inspect all work being done on DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES but shall provide any comments to DISTRICT personnel who shall be solely responsible for all quality control communications with DEVELOPER's contractor(s) during the construction of PROJECT.
- 3. If DEVELOPER fails to commence construction of PROJECT within twenty-four (24) consecutive months after execution of this Agreement, then DISTRICT reserves the right to withhold issuance of the Notice to Proceed after this period of time pending a review of the existing site conditions as they exist at the time DEVELOPER provides written notification to DISTRICT of the start of construction as set forth in Section I.14. In the event of a change in the existing site conditions that materially affects PROJECT function or DISTRICT's ability to operate and maintain DISTRICT FACILITIES, DISTRICT may require DEVELOPER to modify IMPROVEMENT PLANS as deemed necessary by DISTRICT.

- 4. If DEVELOPER fails to complete construction of PROJECT within twelve (12) months after commencement of construction of PROJECT, it is expressly understood that since time is of the essence in this Agreement, failure of DEVELOPER to perform the work within the agreed upon time shall constitute authority for CITY to perform the remaining work and require DEVELOPER's surety to pay to CITY the penal sum of any and all bonds. In which case, CITY shall subsequently reimburse DISTRICT from the funds paid by DEVELOPER's surety for any DISTRICT costs incurred. DISTRICT may withhold acceptance for ownership and sole responsibility for the operation and maintenance of DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES unless and until DEVELOPER performs all obligations under the Agreement.
- 5. In the event DEVELOPER wishes to expedite issuance of a Notice to Proceed, DEVELOPER may elect to furnish an independent qualified construction inspector at DEVELOPER's sole cost and expense. DEVELOPER shall furnish appropriate documentation of the individual's credentials and experience to DISTRICT for review and, if appropriate, approval. DISTRICT shall review the individual's qualifications and experience, and upon approval thereof, said individual, hereinafter called "DEPUTY INSPECTOR", shall be authorized to act on DISTRICT's behalf on all DISTRICT DRAINAGE FACILITIES construction and quality control matters. If DEVELOPER's initial construction inspection deposit furnished pursuant to Section I.5. exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), DISTRICT shall refund to DEVELOPER up to eighty percent (80%) of DEVELOPER's initial inspection deposit within forty-five (45) calendar days of DISTRICT's approval of DEPUTY INSPECTOR; however, a minimum balance of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) shall be retained on account.
- 6. PROJECT construction work shall be on a five (5) day, forty (40) hour work week with no work on Saturdays, Sundays or DISTRICT designated legal holidays, unless otherwise approved in writing by DISTRICT and CITY. If DEVELOPER feels it is necessary to

work more than the normal forty (40) hour work week or on DISTRICT or CITY designated legal holidays, DEVELOPER shall make a written request for permission from DISTRICT and CITY to work the additional hours. The request shall be submitted to DISTRICT and CITY at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the requested additional work hours and state the reasons for the overtime and the specific time frames required. The decision of granting permission for overtime work shall be made by DISTRICT and CITY at their sole discretion and shall be final. If permission is granted by DISTRICT and CITY, DEVELOPER will be charged the cost incurred at the overtime rates for additional inspection time required in connection with the overtime work in accordance with the CITY's municipal code or ordinance, including any amendments thereto.

DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s) to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, the DISTRICT, the County of Riverside and CITY (including their respective Agencies, Districts, Special Districts and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, contractors, agents and representatives) (individually and collectively hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitees") from any liability action, claim or damage whatsoever, based or asserted upon any acts, omissions, or services of DEVELOPER and/or DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s), (including their respective officers, employees, subcontractors, agents or representatives) (individually and collectively hereinafter referred to as "Indemnitors") arising out of or in any way relating to this Agreement, including but not limited to property damage, bodily injury, or death or any other element of any kind or nature whatsoever. DEVELOPER or DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s) shall defend, at its sole expense, the Indemnitees, including all costs and fees (including, but not limited, to attorney fees, cost of investigation, defense and settlements or awards), in any claim or action based upon such alleged

acts or omissions. All applicable indemnification provisions of this Agreement shall remain in effect following the termination of the Agreement.

- 8. With respect to any action or claim subject to indemnification herein by DEVELOPER, DEVELOPER shall, at its sole cost, have the right to use counsel of their own choice and may adjust, settle, compromise any such claim only with the prior consent of DISTRICT, the County of Riverside and CITY. Any such adjustment, settlement or compromise shall not in any manner whatsoever limit or circumscribe DEVELOPER's indemnification obligations to Indemnitees as set forth herein.
- 9. DEVELOPER and DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s) indemnification obligations hereunder shall be satisfied when DEVELOPER or DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s) has provided to DISTRICT and CITY the appropriate form of dismissal (or similar document) relieving DISTRICT, the County of Riverside, or CITY from any liability for the claim, proceeding or action involved.
- 10. The specified insurance limits required in this Agreement shall in no way limit or circumscribe DEVELOPER or DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s) obligations to indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees herein from third party claims.
- 11. In the event there is conflict between this section and California Civil Code Section 2782, this section shall be interpreted to comply with California Civil Code Section 2782. Such interpretation shall not relieve DEVELOPER or DEVELOPER's construction contractor(s) from indemnifying the Indemnitees to the fullest extent allowed by law.
- 12. DEVELOPER for itself, its successors and assigns hereby releases DISTRICT, the County of Riverside, and CITY (including their respective agencies, districts, special districts and departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, agents and representatives) from any and all claims, demands,

actions or suits of any kind arising out of any liability, known or unknown, present or future, including but not limited to any claim or liability, based or asserted, pursuant to Article I, Section 19 of the California Constitution, the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution or any other law or ordinance which seeks to impose any other liability or damage, whatsoever, for damage caused by the discharge of drainage within or from PROJECT. Nothing contained herein shall constitute a release of DEVELOPER by DISTRICT, the County of Riverside, or CITY (including each of their respective Agencies, Districts, Special Districts and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, agents and representatives) from any and all claims, demands, actions or suits of any kind arising out of any liability, known or unknown, present or future, for the negligent maintenance of PROJECT, after the acceptance of PROJECT by DISTRICT and CITY, as described in this Agreement.

- 13. Any waiver by any Party hereto of any breach of any one or more of the terms of this Agreement shall not be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent or other breach of the same or of any other term hereof. Failure on the part of any Party hereto to require exact, full and complete compliance with any terms of this Agreement of any other Party shall not be construed as in any manner changing the terms hereof, or stopping such Party from enforcement hereof.
- 14. Any and all notices sent or required to be sent to the Parties of this Agreement will be mailed by first class mail, postage prepaid, to the following addresses:

- 15. This Agreement is to be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. If any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect without being impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 16. Any action at law or in equity brought by any of the Parties hereto for the purpose of enforcing a right or rights provided for by the Agreement, shall be tried in a court of competent jurisdiction in the County of Riverside, State of California, and the Parties hereto waive all provisions of law providing for a change of venue in such proceedings to any other County.
- 17. This Agreement is the result of negotiations between the Parties hereto, and the advice and assistance of their respective counsel. The fact that this Agreement was prepared as a matter of convenience by DISTRICT shall have no importance or significance. Any uncertainty or ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be construed against DISTRICT because DISTRICT prepared this Agreement in its final form.
- 18. The provisions of this Agreement are solely for the benefit of the Parties, and not for the benefit of any third party. Accordingly, no third party shall have any right or action based on the provisions of this Agreement.
- 19. The rights and obligations of DEVELOPER shall inure to and be binding upon all heirs, successors and assignees.

- 20. No Party shall assign this Agreement without the written consent of all other Parties. Any attempt to delegate or assign any interest herein without written consent of all other Parties shall be deemed void and of no effect.
- 21. In the event DEVELOPER sells Tract Map No. 37909, DEVELOPER shall notify DISTRICT and CITY of any such transfer or assignment in writing no later than thirty (30) calendar days from the date of the sale. DEVELOPER expressly understands and agrees that it shall remain liable with respect to any and all of the obligations and duties in this Agreement until DISTRICT, CITY, DEVELOPER and the new owner(s) of Tract Map No. 37909 fully execute an assignment and assumption agreement that transfers all DEVELOPER's rights, duties or obligations in this Agreement to the new owner(s) of Tract Map No. 37909.
- 22. The individual(s) executing this Agreement on behalf of DEVELOPER certify that they have the authority within their respective company(ies) to enter into and execute this Agreement and have been authorized to do so by all boards of directors, legal counsel, and/or any other board, committee or other entity within their respective company(ies) which have the authority to authorize or deny entering into this Agreement.
- 23. This Agreement is intended by the Parties hereto as a final expression of their understanding with respect to the subject matter hereof and as a complete and exclusive statement of the terms and conditions thereof and supersedes any and all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral or written, in connection therewith. This Agreement may be changed or modified only upon the written consent of the Parties hereto.
- 24. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

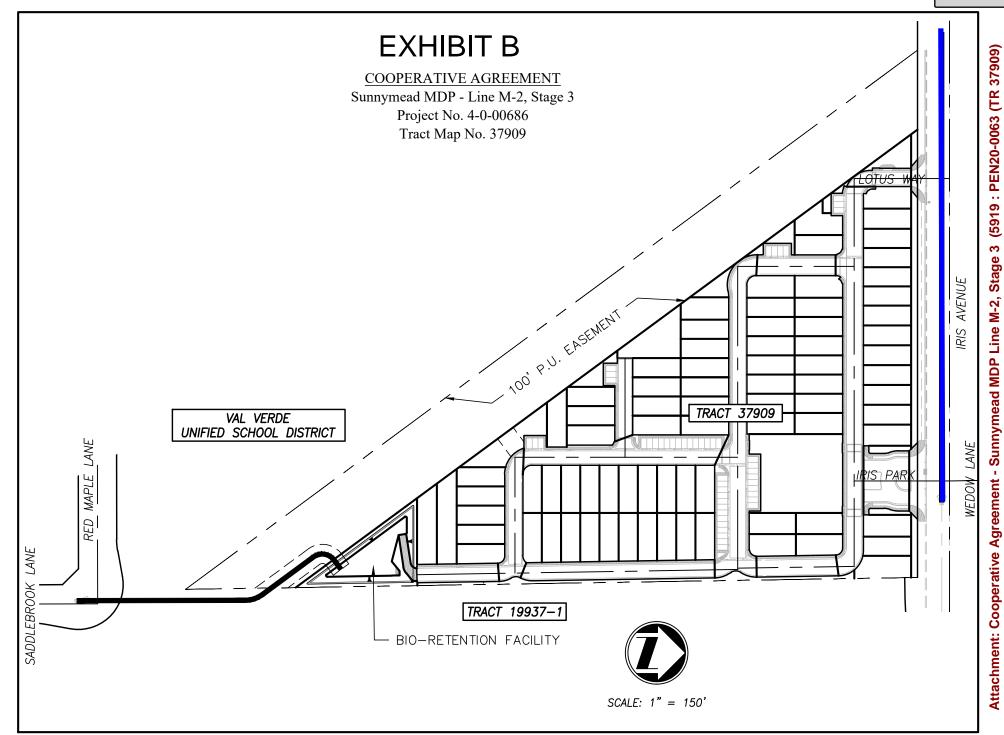

# **EXHIBIT C**

### **DISTRICT's Insurance Requirements is as follows:**

Without limiting or diminishing DEVELOPER's obligation to indemnify or hold DISTRICT harmless, DEVELOPER shall procure and maintain or cause to be maintained, at its sole cost and expense, the following insurance coverage's during the term of this Agreement. As respects to the insurance section only, the DISTRICT herein refers to the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, the County of Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts, and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, employees, elected or appointed officials, agents or representatives as Additional Insureds.

### A. <u>Workers' Compensation</u>:

If DEVELOPER has employees as defined by the State of California, DEVELOPER shall maintain statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance (Coverage A) as prescribed by the laws of the State of California. Policy shall include Employers' Liability (Coverage B) including Occupational Disease with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per person per accident. Policy shall be endorsed to waive subrogation in favor of DISTRICT.

### B. <u>Commercial General Liability</u>:

Commercial General Liability insurance coverage, including but not limited to, premises liability, unmodified contractual liability, products and completed operations liability, personal and advertising injury, and cross liability coverage, covering claims which may arise from or out of DEVELOPER's performance of its obligations hereunder. Policy shall name the DISTRICT as Additional Insured. Policy's limit of liability shall not be less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit.

### C. Vehicle Liability:

If DEVELOPER's vehicles or mobile equipment are used in the performance of the obligations under this Agreement, then DEVELOPER shall maintain liability insurance for all owned, non-owned or hired vehicles so used in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit. Policy shall name the DISTRICT as Additional Insureds.

#### D. Professional Liability:

DEVELOPER shall cause any architect or engineer retained DEVELOPER in connection with the performance of DEVELOPER's obligations under this Agreement to maintain Professional Liability Insurance providing coverage for the performance of their work included within this Agreement, with a limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate. DEVELOPER shall require that, if such Professional Liability Insurance is written on a claims made basis rather than an occurrence basis, such insurance shall continue through the term of this Agreement and that such architect or engineer shall purchase at such architect or engineer's sole expense either 1) an Extended Reporting Endorsement (also known as Tail Coverage); or 2) Prior Dates Coverage from a new insurer with a retroactive date back to the date of, or prior to, the inception of this Agreement; or 3) demonstrate through Certificates of Insurance that such architect or engineer has maintained continuous coverage with the same or original insurer. Coverage provided under items: 1), 2) or 3) shall continue for the term specified in the insurance policy as long as the law allows.

#### E. General Insurance Provisions – All Lines:

- a. Any insurance carrier providing insurance coverage hereunder shall be admitted to the State of California and have an A.M. BEST rating of not less than an A: VIII (A: 8) unless such requirements are waived, in writing, by the DISTRICT Risk Manager. If the DISTRICT's Risk Manager waives a requirement for a particular insurer such waiver is only valid for that specific insurer and only for one policy term.
- b. The DEVELOPER must declare its insurance self-insured retention for each coverage required herein. If any such self-insured retention exceeds \$500,000 per occurrence each such retention shall have the prior written consent of the DISTRICT Risk Manager before the commencement of operations under this Agreement. Upon notification of self-insured retention deemed unacceptable to the DISTRICT, and at the election of the DISTRICT's Risk Manager, DEVELOPER's carriers shall either: 1) reduce or eliminate such self-insured retention with respect to this Agreement with DISTRICT, or 2) procure a bond which guarantees payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense costs and expenses.
- c. DEVELOPER shall cause their insurance carrier(s) or its contractor's insurance carrier(s), to furnish DISTRICT with 1) a properly executed original certificate(s) of insurance and certified original copies of endorsements effecting coverage as required herein; and 2) if requested to do so orally or in writing by the DISTRICT Risk Manager, provide original certified copies of policies including all endorsements and all attachments thereto, showing such insurance is in full force and effect. Further, said certificate(s) and policies of insurance shall contain the covenant of the insurance carrier(s) that a minimum of thirty (30) days

- written notice shall be given to the DISTRICT prior to any material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage of such insurance. If DEVELOPER insurance carrier(s) policies does not meet the minimum notice requirement found herein, DEVELOPER shall cause DEVELOPER's insurance carrier(s) to furnish a 30 day Notice of Cancellation Endorsement.
- d. In the event of a material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage, this Agreement shall terminate forthwith, unless DISTRICT receives, prior to such effective date, another properly executed original certificate of insurance and original copies of endorsements or certified original policies, including all endorsements and attachments thereto, evidencing coverages set forth herein and the insurance required herein is in full force and effect. An individual authorized by the insurance carrier to do so on its behalf shall sign the original endorsements for each policy and the certificate of insurance.
  - It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that DEVELOPER's e. insurance shall be construed as primary insurance, and DISTRICT's insurance and/or deductibles and/or self-insured retentions or selfinsured programs shall not be construed as contributory.
  - f. If, during the term of this Agreement or any extension thereof, there is a material change in the scope of services or there is a material change in the equipment to be used in the performance of the scope of work which will add additional exposures (such as the use of aircraft, watercraft, cranes, etc.); or the term of this Agreement, including any extensions thereof, exceeds five (5) years, DISTRICT reserves the right to adjust the types of insurance required under this Agreement and the monetary limits of liability for the insurance coverages currently

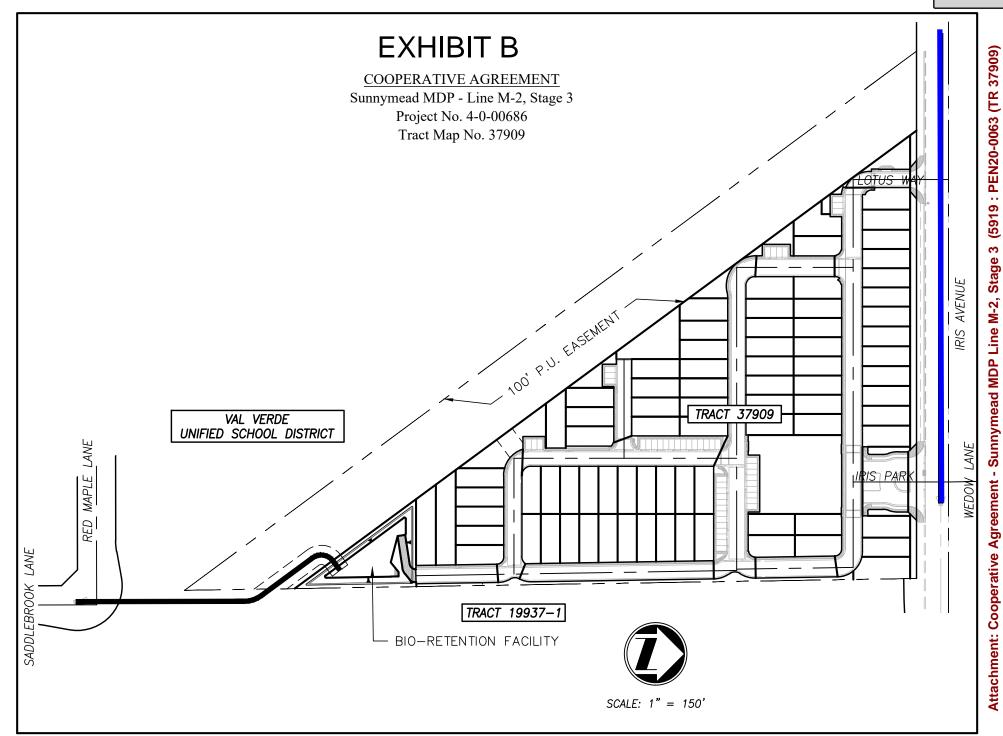

#### SUMMARY

Adoption of the resolutions (Attachments 1-10) will certify the annexation of 20 parcels into Community Facilities District (CFD) No. 2021-01 (Parks Maintenance) ("District"). This action impacts only the property owners identified below, not the general citizens or taxpayers of the City.

### **DISCUSSION**

As a condition of approval for the development projects identified below, the applicants are required to provide an ongoing funding source for maintenance of certain public facilities (e.g., parks). The funding is used to mitigate the cost of the impacts created by the proposed development.

On June 1, 2021, the CSD Board formed CFD No. 2021-01, pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982. The District was created to provide the development community with an alternative funding tool to mitigate the impacts of their proposed development. If a property owner elects to annex the parcels of their development into the District, they also authorize the CSD to annually levy a special tax, collected on the annual property tax bill, against property in the development project. Thus, satisfying the condition of approval.

On December 21, 2021, the CSD Board adopted Ordinance No. 56, which designated the entire territory of the City as a future annexation area for the District. With the future annexation area designated, annexations can occur without an additional public hearing as long as the annexing landowner provides unanimous consent. Once annexed, parcels are subject to the annual special tax to fund the service they are receiving.

An applicant has two options to satisfy the condition of approval:

1. The property owner submits a Landowner Petition unanimously approving annexation of the property into the District. Approval of the petition and

special tax rate allows the City to annually levy the special tax on the property tax bill of the property. This option is only available if there are fewer than 12 registered voters living within the proposed annexation area; or

2. The applicant funds an endowment in an amount sufficient to yield an annual revenue stream that meets the annual obligation and provides for the ongoing operation and maintenance of parks facilities.

The Property Owners listed above elected to annex their property into CFD No. 2021-01 and have the special tax applied to the annual property tax bill. The Office of the Riverside County Registrar of Voters confirmed the number of registered voters residing at each property, allowing a special election of the landowner. Adoption of the resolutions (Attachments 1-10) amends the District and adds the property to the tax rate area identified in the Fiscal Impact section of this report. The resolutions also direct the recordation of the boundary maps (Attachments 11-20) and amended notice of special tax liens for the amendments. The Election Official confirmed the Property Owners unanimously approved the annexation of their property into the District (Attachments 21-30).

### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Adopt the resolutions. Staff recommends this alternative since it will annex the properties into CFD No. 2021-01 at the request of the Property Owners and satisfy the condition of approval for the proposed developments.
- 2. Do not adopt the resolutions. Staff does not recommend this alternative because it is contrary to the request of the Property Owners, will not satisfy the condition of approval, and may delay development of the projects.
- 3. Do not adopt the resolutions but rather continue the item to a future regularly scheduled City Council meeting. Staff does not recommend this alternative as it will delay the Property Owners from satisfying the condition of approval and may delay development of the projects.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Revenue received from the special tax is restricted and can only be used to fund the services for each tax rate area within the District. The special tax can only be applied to a property tax bill of a parcel wherein the qualified electors (i.e., landowners or registered voters, depending upon the number of registered voters) have previously provided approval. If the projected revenue from the maximum special tax exceeds what is necessary to fund the services within the tax rate area, a lower amount will be applied to the property tax bill for all of the properties within the affected tax rate area. The maximum special tax rates are detailed below.
