- 3. Asserted that federal legislature issued the funds in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 4. Affirmed that the City will be using the funds for Police and Fire Safety.

- 1. Explained the agreement was necessary because the Development Nexus Study conducted 12 years ago did not include a roundabout of this size. Therefore, staff could not bring the item forth as a routine DIF agreement.
- 2. Affirmed that no City funds would be used to pay for the developer for the roundabout; only new developers adjacent to the area would be required to pay the developer.
