Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC)

The Commission heard a presentation on the Fiscal Year 2023/24 Mid-Year Revenue Projection Report and approved the FY 2023/24 mid-year budget expenditure adjustments for a net increase of \$1,434,900.
